Ian Cameron

Successful stockbroker who was Prime Minister David Cameron's father

BORN: OCTOBER 12, 1932.
DIED: SEPTEMBER 8, 2010, AGED 77

FROM all the tributes paid to Ian Cameron this week, it was the father-of-four's determination, optimism and courage that were singled out by many.

An inspiration and a role-model to his youngest son David, here was a man, who despite being born with deformed legs (which were both later amputated) and who had lost the sight in one eye, never regarded himself as disabled and proved with the right attitude that anything in life is possible.

The son of a wealthy London stockbroker, Ian Cameron was born in Aberdeenshire and went to Eton where he impressed with his zeal and enthusiasm for sport.

He joined Panmure Gordon, his father's stockbroking firm, after leaving school and became a partner before the age of 30. In later years he joined the estate agent chain John D Wood as a non-executive director. In 1962 he married Mary Fleur

Mount, daughter of Sir William Mount and the first of their four children Alexander arrived a year later. Tania came next in 1965, followed by David in 1966 and Clare in 1971.

The couple both had active roles in their Berkshire community. She was a magistrate while he was involved with the church council and was the High Sheriff of Berkshire.

Perhaps given his parents' commitment to public service it's not surprising David Cameron is so keen on it today. From an early age his father taught him nothing in life is fair and that in order to get on you had to muck in and deal with difficult issues.

Ian Cameron spent his leisure time indulging his love of horse racing. Often seen at his local course, Newbury as well as Ascot and Newmarket, he also invested in several horses, the best known being Hello, which won the Criterion Stakes in Milan.

He is survived by his wife and children.

Ron CarringtonAn Appreciation and some Recollections.

When I first met Ron, little did I realise the extent to which I would remain involved with him for the many years to follow. That was 28 years ago, at a meeting of the Tadley Youth Council. The meeting was to arrange the formation of what was later to become The Tadley Youth Club and which subsequently held its evenings in the Community Centre in New Church Road. The Club flourished for several years under Ron's Chairmanship and there must be many a Tadleyite, now in his forties, who can look back with a sense of appreciation upon those evenings of enjoyment and friendship.

The week Ron died must have brought back a flood of memories for many of us. I have no doubt that he will be best remembered for his many connections with music. Ron had a determination and an enthusiasm that guaranteed success to almost anything he was to apply himself to.

I recollect the days when every church summer fête was festooned with Ron's overhead cabling and powerful horn-shaped loudspeakers imparting background music to patrons on the Green, interspersed with important announcements with a voice which seemed almost as familiar and as that of a popular politician.

Ron had a curious and passionate interest in electronics which, combined with his musical activities, engrossed him for many hours. His one regret in this respect was that he never learnt what he thought to be 'the deep mysteries' of the transistor.

With his unending enthusiasm he would embark upon the most ambitious of projects and he had the knack and diplomacy to enlist the aid of many willing helpers. One of the biggest tasks he set himself was to rebuild an organ at St. Paul's which he and his band of assistants helped to dismantle from a church in Brighton. His inspirations were seemingly endless when he went on to mastermind the rebuilding of a second organ which you may now hear at the parish church of St. Peter's.

Ron will long be remembered too by many of us for providing the good (now) old-fashioned band music at many of our social evenings like the Harvest Suppers and dances. Ron kept the whole thing together with a firm, experienced and competent grasp of his piano accordion, while the other players tagged along modestly in step. The band, I recall, was endearingly referred to as "Mrs. Marks Boys" or sometimes in more serious moments, as "The Carrington Quartet".

His involvement with the church choir and his work as principal church organist has of course inspired many a church-goer to sing of his or her best and indeed this was one of Ron's finest and possibly most enjoyable contributions to parish life.

It is for these things, Ron, and your invaluable work with the Parish Council, Tadley Memorial Hall and a host of other things far too long to list here that we shall remember you.

Hello!

Your name and address was given to me by Sheila Gray of Winchester, Hampshire (whose name I obtained through mutual membership of the Berkshire Family History Society). She was unable to assist me with my Champ line but suggested I write to you on the off chance that your Champ ancestry was related to mine. Mrs. Gray tells me you have Champ interests in Berkshire also.

I enclose a copy of my Champ family tree. As you can see, my ancestor, Thomas Champ, was born in Weybridge, Surrey (according to the 1851 census - his will reveals that he owned property in Weybridge when he died in Warwickshire). I have not as yet been able to find out the names of Thomas' parents. I joined the West Surrey Family History Society and their research officer was unable to find a baptism in Weybridge that could have been Thomas' - nor a baptism in Walton-on-Thames - a neighbouring parish. The IGI has been unable to help me (the 1988 edition). I have recently written to a professional researcher in Sussex (whom I met at last year's International Congress on Genealogy in Sydney) whose searches may uncover something for me.

I originally joined Berkshire Family History Society because the 1851 census revealed that Thomas Champ's wife, Mary Ann Blackaller, was born in Ilsley, Berkshire. As yet I do not know a great deal about the Blackaller line.

How common a name is 'Champ' in the U.K.? Here in Australia it is rather uncommon. In all the phone books of the capital cities there would be no more than 15 listings for 'Champ'.

I am also interested in the origin of the surname. It would seem to be French for "dweller in or near the field". I wonder if it is a shortened version of Duchamp or Deschamps? How did it come to be a surname in England? Could it be a Huguenot name?

I appreciate it can be irritating to hear from those whose research interests have no direct or apparent connection with one's own. However so few people are registered as researching the Champ name, and as Berkshire is a neighbouring county to Surrey, I thought it would be worthwhile writing to you. Even if our lines are unconnected I would be very interested to find out about the Champ line you are researching.
