## Inquest opens into death crash

AN INQUEST into the death of Carolyn Jacob, killed in a road accident on Monday, has been opened and adjourned.

Miss Jacob, 37, died at the wheel of her Vauxhall Astra, after a smash involving four cars.

The accident happened on the A30 between Black Dam roundabout and Hackwood Road roundabout just before 9am.

Miss Jacob, of Cufaude Lane, Chineham, was on her way to work at Motorola in Jays Close, Viables, when a Sierra crossed the central reservation and was in a head-on collision with her car.

She was certified dead at the scene.

John Curno, 44, of Bartok Close, Brighton Hill, who was driving the Sierra, suffered broken ribs, bruising and shock.

He was taken to hospital by ambulance where he is said to be comfortable.

Two other drivers, Karen James, 24 of Bliss Close, Brighton Hill, and Dermot Vardell, 56, of Farnham, Surrey, were both treated in hospital for shock.

An inquest into Miss Jacob's death was opened by coroner Andrew Bradley on Tuesday.

It was adjourned until July 23.

Where has 1985 gone to? They say time flies when you are enjoying yourself. I have had a memorable year and enjoyed so many wonderful things - people - and places - but that is no excuse for Dec. arriving so soon.

In February Kay and I sat down and produced a forward planning diary, or Countdown to August which was a jolly good job as it enabled us to have a smooth run down to August the 17th. and that really lovely day - yes it was the first fine hot Saturday for 6 weeks and we all had a very happy day. To all who helped to make it such a happy day thank you.

It was a great thrill to all of us to have Eini - our once upon a time au pair girl from Finland - with us for the wedding weekend.

My new job has developed well and I have made contacts with many new acquaintances this year. It is marvellous to be involved with volunteers again - there is a different attitude to the tasks, which makes so much difference. Last week I was in conversation with the Canadian millionaire Ed Burman and within a few days I was involved with a project which is involving one of our Churches with some of the 800 'homeless family' children who live in Hotel accommodation in Hackney. There is an enormous amount of variety in the job.

Since May I have been spoilt by so many people. My Presidential year began at the end of London Weekend - MAYC's annual London Youth Weekend. I was inducted in Jubilee Gardens, with 13,000 green and yellow decked young Methodists to cheer me on.

Mum had had a bad fall at the beginning of May and had broken her nose and shaken her 6 1/2 stone body pretty badly. She was happily able to come to the weekend and was quite the Dowager Duchess both in the Royal box at the Albert Hall and in her deck chair at the front of the crowd in Jubilee Gardens. It was good that she was there. Kay and Derek were there as well. It was Derek's first introduction to MAYC and he was amazed.

I have done a lot of miles travelling this year in fact there have been very few weekends this year when the holdall has not been packed. I have been as far S.W. as Cornwall and as far N.E. as York. I have been to Kent and Sheffield and many other places in between. Everywhere I have received such warm hospitality and friendship and have made many new friendships which will not end next May.

It has been International Youth Year and for me it has had a very International flavour. At Easter, I led a group of 9 young people on a European Methodist Youth exchange to Pullingen near Stuttgart in West Germany. We spent 10 days there - 6 of which were spent on mission to young people of the town - a new experience for the whole British Group - but one which taught us a lot and which I hope to build on this next Easter when we have the return Mission at Kenton.

In July I was honoured to be 'Auntie Eileen' to 170 young people from 45 different countries at the Methodist International Youth Conference. It was a memorable week - well that was the residential conference part - but it was really 6 weeks. For I was meeting folk at Heathrow, sleeping some at 46 and returning them to their flights for home. I even had to rescue a held passport from the Heathrow Passport Offices for the Rep from Benin who we got released from immigration with the help of an M.P. The extended MAYC family is more far flung than ever and I have very close bonds with the South African scene, since I had 3 young S.A's, 2 black and 1 white - staying at 46. I decided at the end of the Conference that I was well equipped to become a travel agent when I retire!

Rex is back home - a much more mature young man than the one that went off to the flat 18mths before. He is enjoying his job and to everyone's amazement has been studying at evening class this year and enjoying it. It wasn't like school - they weren't bothered first and foremost about ties and blazers - it was relevant and interesting - maybe we should tell Sir Keith.

Kay and Derek are settled with dog (Sheba), kitten and bird in the flat in Watford. They have been busy decorating and it is very attractive. With furniture from the loft, friends and relations and their wedding presents they are very well equipped. The hairdressing business is still flourishing but Derek is a little apprehensive as to the future of the privatisation of the Gas Board - I'm sure with his record he should be fine.

Kay has just returned to work after a month's enforced 'holiday'. She had her gall bladder removed in November and with it 2 stones or were they pebbles she swallowed as a child on Folkestone beech - that's where they look as if they belong. She had been very poorly in May and they wanted her to go in to hospital then but with the wedding plans she decided to change her diet and hope that it would calm down and it did. She was to be Matron of Honour for Juliette (her Bridesmaid) in Oct - so the hospital agreed to keep a bed for Nov. We celebrated Rex's 21st. and she went in on the Monday. We are still wondering why she had her own single room - we are expecting the bill - She quickly personalised it with mobiles, cut out flower arrangements, her portable telly and apart from the food it could have been a 4 star hotel! that wasn't Kay's description.

We will all be at Kenton for Christmas with Mum, her sister Mill and Auntie Elsie from Bromley. Our Church is the ITV morning service on Christmas day so it will be a very early Christmas morning.

The first 5 months of next year are quite busy. I am off to Derbyshire in Jan. Belfast in Feb., Devon, Hull and Dublin in March and the Channel Isles in April.

I apologise to you for even worse letter writing track this year than usual - after May life should slow down - it will only be one job to do not 2. It has been marvellous popping in to see old friends whilst on my travels and being able to pick up friendships from where they left off.

We have heard from Clive and he popped in to Kay's flat for a cup of tea as they motored back from a wet and windy holiday in Scotland. He seems to be enjoying the role reversal situation and the last letter he said he was busy making an English Christmas Cake as you cannot buy them in Germany. He is doing a University Course similar to our Open Uni, and has done some private translating of documents for the WHO for which Brigitta works. Apart from colds and flue which he still gets frequently he seems well.

I had some advice from Rex the other evening. 'Mum I can't imagine you having a boy friend - you are not sending out the right vibes' I shall have to switch channels or something I presume.

If you are still awake can I wish you a very Happy Christmas and a Peaceful New Year. I trust that you and your families will enjoy the Christmas break and that 1986 will bring you as much Joy as 1985 has brought us.
