A termination date of May 13th, 1988 had been placed on Owen Aldridge's contract with AWE and on April 27th his many friends and colleagues gathered at the Police Club to witness satisfactory completion of his contract term and to wish him a long and happy retirement.

Owen, who started his working life in the printing trade in Reading and also saw wartime service with the RAF in the Middle East, joined the Civil Service in July 1955 and was posted into the AWE Contracts organisation.
