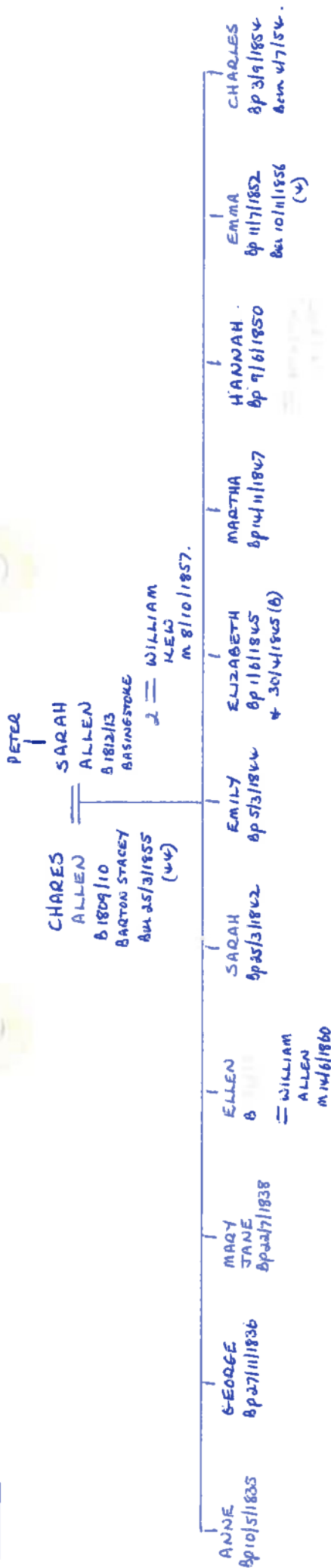
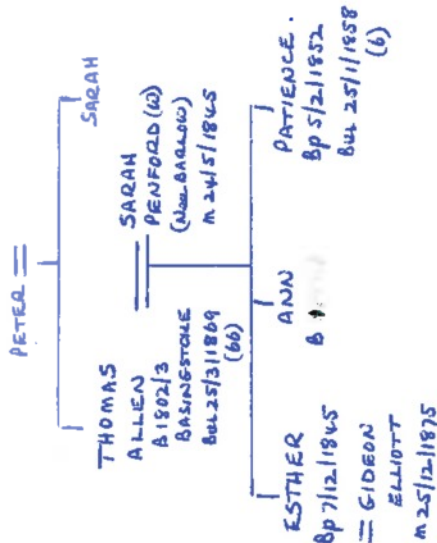


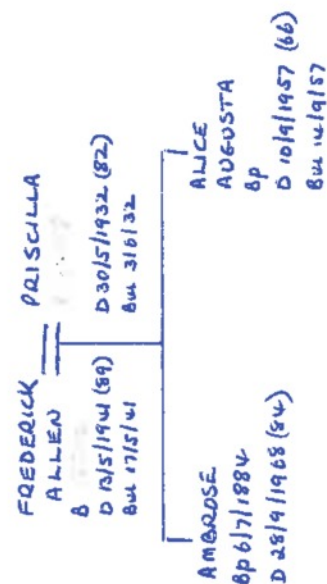

LAST respects will be paid to Hampshire's late education chief when his funeral is held today (Thursday, February 24). Don Allen, 65, died on February 12 after 16 years as county councillor for Tadley and Kingsclere, and eight years as head of Hampshire's schools. The funeral will be at St Paul's Church in Ashford Hill at 12.30pm.

Councillor mourned

CIVIC leaders from the Basingstoke area and Hampshire turned out in force for the funeral of well-respected and much-admired county education chief Don Allen.

Mourners - who included Basingstoke MP Andrew Hunter, Hampshire County Council leader Councillor Ken Thornber and borough mayor Cllr Gwen Richardson - filled St Paul's Church in Ashford Hill on Thursday afternoon as family, friends, colleagues and representatives from many organisations came to pay their last respects to the popular 65-year-old father of two.

The service was led by Father Kevin O'Brien, and included glowing and fond tributes to Cllr Allen (pic-



tured), who was Hampshire County Council's Cabinet member for education, and had represented the Kingsclere and Tadley division of the county council since 1989.

Cllr Allen - who died in Basingstoke hospital on February 12 after a long battle with respiratory problems - lived in Baughurst.

He leaves a wife, Sheila, who is a Basingstoke and Deane borough councillor, and two sons, Richard and David.

"I know that Don would have been absolutely amazed by the amount of people who cared for him so much," she said.

"It's always the same - you don't ever really know how much or how many people care about you."

She added she would like to thank everyone for their messages of support, which have all been greatly appreciated.

Hood said: "I was deeply saddened by the news of the death of Cllr Sheila Allen. Sheila was a long-serving councillor in the borough who was not only dedicated to serving the Baughurst community she represented but devoted a great deal of her time to supporting a wide variety of organisations throughout the borough. She will be remembered as an active member of the local community and will be sadly missed by all she worked and came into contact with over the years. Our thoughts and best wishes go out to her family at this sad time."

Cllr Allen, 70, was the eldest of six children and grew up in Derby. While in Derby she met and married the late Hampshire County Councillor Don Allen to whom she was married for 42 years until his death in 2005. In 1981 the couple moved to Baughurst with their two sons Richard and David, shortly after this Cllr Sheila Allen was elected onto the borough council serving Baughurst and sitting on the development control and environment committees. She also served as a member of Baughurst Parish Council for over 20 years, was a governor at Bishop Challoner Secondary School and chairman of the Loddon Valley Daycare Centre. Cllr Allen sat on the Tadley Community Centre Management Board and also gave her time to a number of organisations. Cllr Allen leaves her two sons, Richard and David, and a brother and three sisters.



Councillor's funeral held

Requiem mass well attended by colleagues

AN ASHFORD HILL church was packed on Wednesday afternoon with civic dignitaries, councillors, family and friends for the funeral of a popular Baughurst councillor.

Almost every seat was taken at the funeral service of long-serving Conservative borough and parish councillor Sheila Allen who died, aged 70, on September 24.

Mourners gathered for a requiem mass at 2pm at St Paul's Church, Ashford Hill Road.

They included the mayor of Basingstoke and Deane, Warwick Lovegrove, Lady Young (wife of North West Hampshire MP Sir George), the leader of Hampshire County Council Ken Thornber and the leader of the Conservative group on the borough council John Leek.

Many borough and Baughurst parish councillors, of which Mrs Allen was one for more than 20 years, attended including clerk Penny Waterfield and chairman Chris Surtees.

Mr Surtees said after the mass that Mrs Allen, who also sat on the borough council, would be sadly missed.

He said: "It's splendid to see so many people here wishing her farewell."

The mass began with a welcome by Father Vincent Henry, who said that

Mrs Allen was "always refreshingly honest".

He said that she said, "what had to be said and was never afraid of asking questions", adding that Mrs Allen was "highly motivated to make a better world", as reflected in the long list of organisations she was involved with.

This was followed by a reading by Basingstoke and Deane Borough councillor Elaine Still, the psalm *The Lord's My Shepherd*, and a reading and tributes by family friend John Taylor, who said that she was not one to let others take the strain and was "thoroughly committed and diligent in all she did".

He said: "She was quiet, she was modest and she was a significant presence in our lives."

Her strength of character was shown in the way she dealt with the death of her husband, Hampshire county councillor Don Allen in 2005, and in her own battle with cancer, he added.

Mrs Allen's close friend, Hampshire county councillor Marilyn Tucker, said that Mrs Allen was "always caring and interested in everyone and everything".

She said: "She made me feel special in that friendship."

Mrs Tucker also said that her friend showed special courage in

fighting her illness, and, in particular, by going straight to council meetings, immediately after chemotherapy treatment.

"Many people had no idea how ill she was. She said, 'I don't want a fuss, just tell people I went into hospital for tests'," she said.
