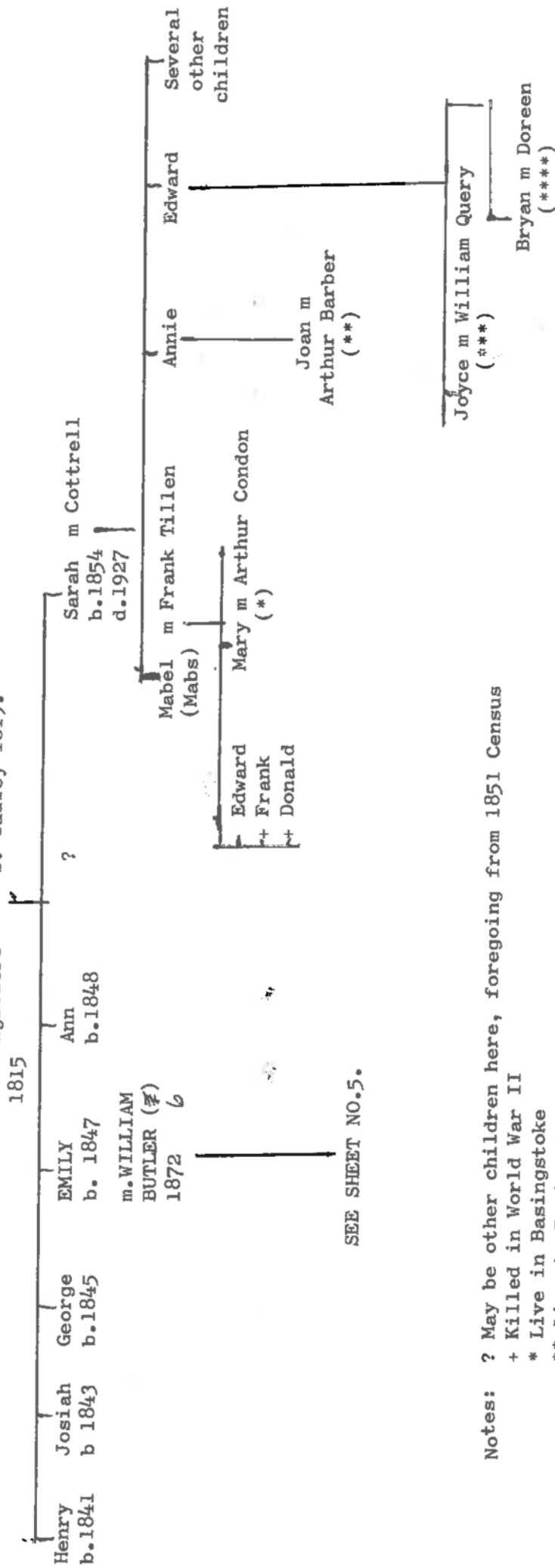

## BUTLER FAMILY TREE

## NOTES

1. Possible descent from Rev. Charles Butler (1560-1647), scholar of Magdalen College, Oxford, B.A.(1583), M.A. (1587) Rector of Nateley Scures 1593-1600, Master of the Holy Ghost School, Basingstoke 1595-1600, Vicar of Wootton St. Lawrence 1600-1647. Author of books on logic, grammar, music and bee-keeping, known as "the father of English bee-keeping". One of Thomas Fuller's "Worthies of England".

Charles Butler's descendants do not appear in the Parish Registers of Wootton St. Lawrence after 1666 so it is necessary to consider where they went. Son Charles, we know, lived at Faringdon in Berkshire. Son, William, we know from his Will, moved to Wolverton and of his known descendants up to 1658 none was named John. Son Edmund had three grandsons born between 1660 and 1666, but none was named John. Therefore JOHN (1) born about 1655/60 is not descended from Charles, William or Edmund. This leaves the Rev. Charles son Richard who had two sons Richard, born 1629 and John, born 1634. No further record of Richard, senior or junior has been found, they could have moved away or they could be in the Tadley Register before 1683 and this is missing. However, a John witnessed the Will of Charles Butler, the son of William, in 1681 and he may well have been the John born 1634. He and William's son Charles would be cousins. It would obviously be simple for John to change his allegiance from Wootton St. Lawrence to St. Peter's, Tadley without changing his domicile. It is therefore possible that the Rev. Charles grandson John b. 1634 was the father of JOHN (1) born around 1655/60. John born 1634 had brothers, Richard and William. JOHN (2), born 1685 had sons, John, Richard and William. Descent from the Rev. Charles through his son Richard and grandson John to JOHN(1) is therefore a reasonable possibility but by no means proven. As the 17th century Butlers were land owners the most fruitful scope for research may lie in land records. We know that son William owned land at Ramsdell, that son Edmund owned land at Lower Wootton so again there is a reasonable possibility that son Richard and his descendants owned land at Tadley or Monk Sherborne.

There is a stone in St. Peter's churchyard to John Butler who was born in October 1685 and buried in October 1759 and he is my great-great-great-great-grandfather. I also know there are stones to two of his sons, John and Francis and their respective wives but I am descended from the fifth son TIMOTHY and I have never found any record of his death or burial. It would therefore fill in a gap in my records as well as those of my relative if you could help.

TIMOTHY was baptised at St. Peter's on 20 December 1725.

He married Sarah Humber at Wootton St. Lawrence in 1756, was described as "Yeoman". Three of his four children were baptized at St. Peter's, Tadley, the fourth at Monk Sherborne.

He could well have survived to around 1800.

His son THOMAS was baptized at St. Peter's in 1767, married Hannah Simpson at St. Stephen's, Baughurst in 1790 and was buried Wootton St. Lawrence in 1851.

So have you come across a stone for TIMOTHY or SARAH, please?

John (1685-1759) was a man of some affluence. I have his Will in which he leaves land, two houses, cattle and £340 to his six sons but I have never found a Will of any of his sons so maybe there are no monumental stones either to the younger sons.

I looked at your "Interests" some years ago and thought it possible the paths of our ancestors crossed at some time. You had APPLETON, COTTRELL and MONGER. My great-grandmother was LETITIA APPLETON born Kingsclere 1809, the daughter of John and Hannah Appleton. She married Thomas Butler in 1831. My grandmother (whose maiden name was Rabbits) had a sister Sarah who married a COTTRELL and we have close friends descended from this family who live in Basingstoke, Aylesbury and New Kensington PA, USA. My grandfather's eldest sister Hannah married THOMAS MONGER in 1831.

The new lease arises from the details from the Register which you have given me between 1769 and 1801.

I first went through the Tadley Registers myself in the 1960's (or even earlier) when the vicar, the Rev. K.C. Davis, fixed me up with a seat and table in the new St. Pauls Church. At the time I was still looking for the birth of my grandfather William Butler though I made notes of many others. Then in 1975 or 76 Cynthia Read (now Walcot) sent me a copy of the Butler burials at St. Peters. Unfortunately she stopped with Ann in 1769 and started again with Elizabeth in 1801. Whether this means there was a Register missing at the time I don't know but you will see why I have been unable up to now to find the deaths of TIMOTHY and SARAH.

My grandparents William and Emily were buried at St. Paul's, Kingsclere Woodlands and I searched the Registers of Tadley, Hannington, Monk Sherborne, Pamber and others but was unable to find his birth. The obvious one seemed Wolverton but the family always assured me they had never had anything to do with Wolverton. However, on a fleeting visit I decided to beard the very unpleasant Vicar there and try Wolverton. Fortunately he was out and his wife gave me the key to the steel box. I drew a blank as forecast with Wolverton, but in the same box were the Registers of Ewhurst and here I found my grandfather William and most of his brothers and sisters.

I am sure it is no way to repay your kindness by inundating you with paper but late last year I did my Butler Family Tree, in what you will think is a very peculiar format, and sent it to two Butler relatives at Pamber End and Bramley. I have brought it up to date with the information you sent and enclose it for you. If after looking through it you decide it is of no help to you or anyone else in your Group please consign to the waste paper basket.

You will see I wonder (Note 7) if we are descended from the Rev. Charles Butler. I have researched his life for nearly 15 years now and have compiled a comprehensive type of "bibliography" which I ought to let the HGS have some time and then anyone wanting to know about him would know the sources to look for. I went to the Bodleian Library and Magdalen College, Oxford and I contacted sources as far afield as Harvard University in the USA. A writer on bee-keeping named Victor Dodd applied to Magdalen College, Oxford a few years back asking for information on the Rev. Charles and the Librarian there put him in touch with me as "the greatest living authority on Charles Butler", which was very good for my ego. I duly co-operated with Mr. Dodd in an article he wrote for The American Bee Journal published in June 1981 and also in his book "Bee-masters of the Past" published in 1983.

I expect you have come across the confusion in the Registers at Wootton St. Lawrence around 1800 which muddles my family tree. I think, however, there are lucky to be any Registers there at all. When researching the Rev. Charles I contacted a Dr. Bone (a poem by him stands on the Chas. Butler window cill in Wootton St. Lawrence) and he told me that in 1935 the then Vicar packed up all the W. St. L. Church Registers, Churchwardens Notes etc. and sent them to him through the post. The mind boggles doesn't it!

We had made fairly definite arrangements to spend a few days with our relatives, the Condon's in Basingstoke this Spring but it hangs in the balance at the moment. My wife had a hip replacement operation in 1984 and since then has had a pulmonary embolism and four dislocations. The latest dislocation was last Wednesday, the day before your letter arrived. She will be in hospital for about three weeks and how long it will take for her to become mobile again is uncertain.

Going back to your letter about Timothy and Sarah. You will see I think the Thomas buried 1766 was the one born 1757. I also have a daughter Sarah between the

APPLETONS: Your Family Group Record is most helpful, it tells me my great-great-grandmother's maiden name was Seward and this I did not know. The fact that Letitia had a sister Charlotte tidies up the question as to who the wedding witnesses of Charlotte and Jacob Walden were. The Charlotte at North Waltham in 1851 Census says she was born at Kingsclere but gives her age as 45 instead of 43 and that's not like a woman, or is it?

BUTLERS: Thank you for the information about John and Elizabeth married in Basingstone. I too think they fit in.

In 1975/6 Cynthia Read and I did quite a bit of research together (she doing most of the work) into Butlers and we came to the conclusion that my great-grandfather (THOMAS 5 in my Family Tree) and her great-great-great grandfather George were in all probability brothers registered at Wootton St. Lawrence just after 1800 when the Registers are so confused.

We also did much research into the Rev. Charles Butler, Vicar of Wootton St. Lawrence 1600-1647 in the course of which we visited Magdalen College, Oxford, The Bodleian Library and the International Bee Research Establishment at Chalfont St. Peter. Following the visit to Chalfont I had a slight heart attack and decided I had better pack up genealogy for a time. I have had further heart troubles over the years but it is only in recent times that they have decided with echocardiography that I have a leaking mitral valve which gives rise to trouble from time to time. The outcome is that I have taken only a passive interest in genealogy since 1976 and have cut out the fairly frequent visits I was making to Hampshire and other places at that time.

What did you think of my theory about the Rev. Charles? There is another matter which lends some support to my theory. In the Hampshire Lay Subsidy Rolls of 1586 there were no Butlers of affluence at Tadley, Wootton St. Lawrence or Monk Sherborne but we know that by the middle of the next century there were several affluent Butlers. Two of these we know were descendants of the Rev. Charles, William with land at Wootton and Edmund with land at Lower Wootton so why not the third son Richard with lands and descendants at Tadley or Monk Sherborne?

I will tell you another tantalising story about this. My father's eldest brother, Albert, lived at Brimpton Common and died in 1958. Following his death my cousin Gertie, who often visited us, told me she packed up a few books her father had and sent them to a jumble sale. One of the books, she said, was called the Feminine Monarchie and was about bee-keeping. I was telling this story to a modern writer about bee-keeping, Victor Dodd, in the early 1980's and he thought that even if the book had been the fifth and last edition of 1704 it would have been worth a four figure sum in 1958 and many times that amount in the 1980's. One can also imagine the fly-leaf with all the Butlers who might have owned the book but reflection tells me this would be a forlorn hope, John Butler (1685-1759) could not sign his name and neither could my grand-father or great-grandfather (though my grandfather could read). The conclusion is don't throw things away or send them to jumble sales.

In the last HGS Journal a Mrs. Lawrence at Thatcham gave a long list of "interests" including Appletons and Rabbits, so I wrote to her. I can't see any tie up between her Appleton's and ours but the Rabbit line has possibilities.

Have you noticed that in the 1851 Census Thomas and Letitia Butler and the Appletons are in the same Census Bundle number which I presume means they lived close together. You can perhaps tell me I am wrong but I had the theory that Appletons were from Ireland and you will see that some of the Tadley Appletons in 1851 had been born in Ireland, making me think they might have come over to join their relatives after the Potato Famine of the 1830's.



The response from Mr. Colpus was disappointing though perhaps I expected it would be so. He certainly tried to be helpful and sent me all MI's of Butlers at Tadley, Baughurst, Wolverton and Pamber. He also sent me Gundry MI's for Baughurst which I enclose just in case they are of interest to you. He had no Humbers and no Wharhams or Warhams.

I have not fully studied his lists yet but one particular item has surprised me greatly. At Pamber there is only one Butler stone, to John Butler and his wife Patience. I reckon this could be my Gr.Gr.Grandfather's brother who married Patience Watts at Wotton St. Lawrence in 1797 (when he was described as of Monk Sherborne). The surprise is that his address is given on the stone as Rose Farm, Odiham.

I see you conclude that Mary Ann BUTLER aged 1 bur. Hannington 2.6.1855  
was the daughter of William and Sarah (grand-d. of Henry and Ann) and that finding  
this at Hannington tidies up your records regarding Mary Ann. But (from the  
Census) Mary Ann was born in 1850 so she would be 5 years old in 1855. This  
Mary Ann has puzzled me since I looked at the Hannington Registers many years  
ago. I did wonder if it was a late child of Thomas and Letitia (though there is  
no birth in Hannington Registers). Certainly the Sarah buried at Hannington is  
1863 aged 24 was the daughter of Thomas and Letitia (my great-grandparents).

# Charles Byart

THE funeral of Mr Charles Byart, Mayor of Basingstoke 1980/81, takes place today, at Reading Crematorium, Caversham.

Canon Clifford Wright, Team Rector and Rural Dean of Basingstoke, will officiate.

Mr Byart died at Basingstoke Hospital, aged 87.

Formerly of The Glen, Pamber Heath, and latterly of Swains Road, Tadley, Mr Byart began his career in local government in 1967 when he was elected to Basingstoke Rural District Council.

In 1974 he was elected to Basingstoke District Council as representative for the Pamber Ward and he served the area for 13 years.

He was an active councillor, serving on many committees, including development and planning, leisure and recreation, the allotments sub-committee, Basingstoke safety, the Local Appeals Board, the personnel sub-committee and the local joint management committee—of which he was chairman—Alencon and Braine L'Alleud Twinning and the

Festival of Sport committee.

Although in his eighties, he was unsparing of his time by serving on the committee of other organisations in the district such as the Basingstoke Old People's Welfare Committee, the Southern Provincial Council, the North Hants Community Health Council, the Basingstoke and District Sports Council, and on the Joint Industrialists' Committee.

He was a governor of John Hunt of Everest School and of the Hurst School, Baughurst, and served on the management committee of Limington House Special

School and of Saxon Wood.

As an Independent Conservative he was one who voted against the ruling Conservative group in 1982 which forced the group out of office for a short period.

Awarded the MBE in 1963 for his outstanding work for the Ministry of Works, he was responsible for the mechanical and electrical installations at Harwell, including the reactor, moving on to do the same work at the AWRE, Aldermaston, and at Calder Hall, Sellafield. In 1980 he was made a Freeman of the City of London.

During the Second World War he served with the RAF. During his work at the atomic establishments he was a great help to those looking after welfare.

He was always interested in sport and when his busy life allowed it, he loved ballroom dancing.

After his wife, Winifred, died in 1982, he spent much of his time in Portugal where he had a villa.

He had no children and leaves two nephews.
