- ④ Possibly the Thomas Eglefield who was buried at Tadley 8/3/1858 (aged 5), as he does not appear in the 1861 nor 1871 census records.

Thomas and Lucy Englefield are my great great grandparents, but I have not yet found their marriage reference either in parish records or in the General Register Office at St Catherine's House. There is a slight possibility that they were married in the Bradfield area about 1845 but I'm still searching for the actual reference.

With reference to your enquiry about the name of Rampton on my family tree, I'm afraid that my information is somewhat limited and sketchy.

My grandmother Isabella Parsons (a catholic) came from Ireland and was in service in England when she met and married ? Rampton. They are thought to have lived in the north Hampshire area, possibly near Tadley, until their separation. She then went to live with Thomas Englefield (my grandfather) but, being a catholic, could not or would not divorce her first husband. Consequently it was not until 1948 that they were married, after the death of ? Rampton, her first husband.

I'm afraid that I've been unable to find out his Christian name as yet, nor the ~~the~~ date of the original PARSONS-RAMPTON marriage. However, I'm still searching for these details for my own records and when I find some specific information I'll let you have details.

some light on your mystery - there is no doubt in my mind from the evidence you have provided that your mother's bridesmaid was Joseph and Harriett Eliza's daughter - and I am very happy to give you any further information I can.

The marriage between Joseph ENTICKNAPP (sic) and Harriett Eliza JACOBS (sic) took place on 23 November 1880 in the District Parish Church of St John Notting Hill. Harriett Eliza gave her age as 24 and her address as 43 Lansdowne Crescent, and gave no "rank or profession". Joseph gave his age as 23, his address as Shalford, Surrey, and his profession as smith; his father was William ENTICKNAPP, smith (who was my great-great-grandfather).

The name JACOBS occurs four times on the certificate, every one in the plural - once in the bride's name, once in her signature (which is in the same handwriting as the rest of the certificate, so it doesn't mean Harriett Eliza herself signed this way), once for the bride's father (who was James JACOBS, rod merchant - I have wondered ever since I obtained this certificate what one of those was), and once in the name of one of the witnesses (Alfred Frank JACOBS, who was I assume another of the 12). The other witness was Charlotte CHANDLER, which may mean something to you: it means nothing to me.

So those are all the details. Apart from puzzling over rod merchants, the main question this raised for me was: how did Joseph and Harriett Eliza meet? My family has no connection I know of with London at this time. Joseph himself was born in Lurgashall, Sussex in late 1857 (he was baptised there on 10 January 1858). His family moved to Guildford in early 1861, and were still there at 1871 census time; later that year they moved to Albury; and they were in Shalford at 1881 census time (and presumably, from the evidence of this certificate, by no later than 1880 - I would guess that Joseph was learning his trade from his father). This data suggests that Joseph spent his entire life up to 1880 in Sussex and Surrey, in the area between Guildford and Petworth. So the question of how he came to marry a Londoner remains unresolved.

The next decade or so is more straightforward. At census time in 1881 Joseph and Harriett Eliza were living with Joseph's elder brother George (my great-grandfather), his wife Martha and their two eldest sons in Reading: both men were described as farriers. Presumably they were running a business there jointly. Joseph and Harriett Eliza's first two children, James William (b 1881) and Alice Louise (b 1884) were both born in Reading.

Subsequently these two families went separate ways. Joseph and Harriett Eliza were living at Rock Place, Ockford in Godalming at 1891 census time, and by then they had a third child, Frank, who was born in the town in 1889. My great-grandparents, meanwhile, had moved to Dorking by no later than 1886, where they had three more sons including my grandfather (b 1890). After the 1891 census they moved again, to Tongham near Farnham, where George died in 1901.

My grandfather was, like your mother, a first cousin of Alice Louise. I have reason to believe these two families remained close: when I was bullying my father to recall what he could of his ancestors around 30 years ago, he did vaguely remember a great-uncle Joe, and this was at a time when I was unaware of his existence, so there was no prompting.

I know very little of what happened to Joseph and Harriett Eliza after 1891. Joseph is mentioned in his father's will, dated 1909, and was then living at Holloway Hill, Godalming. I have found two possible records in the death indexes for him, both in the registration district (RD) of Guildford (which included Godalming), one aged 71 in 1929 and the other aged 74 in 1931 - either could fit (which ever is the one that doesn't relates to a Joseph who was born in 1859 and who was second cousin to this one). I think the later date is marginally the more likely. Whichever is right, Joseph died when my father was still under 10, so it is a little remarkable that he should remember him.

There is a death record for a Harriett ENTICNAP (sic - no middle name) in RD Guildford in 1932, aged 76 which is exactly right.

Neither Joseph nor Harriett Eliza left a will, so I have no way of knowing whether they had any more children after 1891. Harriett was only 35 then, so it is certainly possible, and for that reason we cannot be absolutely sure that Alice Louise was your Miss ENTICKNAPP, though I agree that it is extremely likely. We will have to wait a few years till the 1901 census returns come out before we can be quite certain.

Alice Louise, incidentally, went on to marry a George J GROVER in 1912, again in RD Guildford so quite probably in Godalming.

That leaves one remaining question - the spelling of my surname. Joseph's marriage certificate actually spells the name correctly, in the sense that Joseph, and all the other members of his family, spelled the name with a -pp ending at that time. However his birth certificate has the single -p spelling, as does his parents' marriage certificate.

I think this last document provides the vital clue - William was unable to sign the register, and had to mark with a cross. But he could certainly write when he made his will, and I believe he probably learnt to do so in Guildford. By then he was away from Enticknap heartland, and for some reason decided when he learnt to spell his name that it should have the -pp ending.

At any rate, from 1863 to 1891 every member of his family used the -pp spelling, including my great-grandfather: so my grandfather's birth certificate in 1890 has this spelling. So do the birth registrations of all three of Joseph and Harriett's known children.

In 1891, my great-grandfather had occasion to obtain a copy of his birth certificate (I know that because he stored it in his family bible, which is now in my possession). I guess this was in connection with his move to Tongham. Whatever the reason, it showed him that his name should be spelled with a single -p. And from that date, all members of my family (including William and including my grandfather) spelled the name that way. I believe that Joseph's family did the same: certainly Alice Louise's marriage in 1912 and James William's in 1913 are both registered with the single -p spelling.

If this reading of the evidence is right, the spelling of the name in the interesting cutting you sent me is incorrect.

TRAGEDY: Investigation into 12ft plunge onto dance floor

Clubber died after fall from balcony

FAMILY and friends are in mourning after a Tadley man plunged 12 feet to his death in a nightclub.

Steven Evans, 22, died in the early hours of last Saturday after falling from the balcony on to the dance floor at Utopia nightclub in Teale, near Reading.

Mr Evans, who lived with his parents in The Green, Tadley, is understood to have gone to the club on a night out with friends.

A spokesman for Thames Valley police said: 'He was taken from the scene by ambulance to the Royal Berkshire Hospital in Reading where he died not long after.'

"It would appear, on the face of it, to be a tragic accident. We are not looking for anyone else in connection with the incident."

A post mortem examination on Monday revealed that Mr Evans died from head injuries.

His family was too upset to talk about the tragedy.

A neighbour, who asked not to be named, said: "Everybody around here is devastated."

Choking back tears, she added:

"I knew his mum really well. He

was a nice boy and was very popular with a lot of friends."

West Berkshire environmental health officers are now investigating the accident.

Alison Palmer, principle environmental health officer, said: "We are looking into how it happened and if there is anything that needs to be done to improve things at Utopia.

"We are just starting our investigation and I cannot say how long it will take."

She refused to speculate on the outcome of the investigation. An inquest into Mr Evans' death has been opened and adjourned.

TRAGEDY: Inquest told of reveller's last act in club Drunken handstand led to man's death

A DRUNKEN reveller plunged 16 feet to his death after doing a handstand on a nightclub balcony - moments before he was due to leave. Steven Evans toppled over and landed head first on the dance floor among a crowd of clubbers, an inquest at Reading was told on Thursday.

The 22-year-old, of The Green Tadley, had taken a run-up, grabbed the top railing and performed the acrobatic feat before losing his balance.

The inquest heard that the accident happened at the Utopia nightclub in Theale, Berks, in the early hours of October 30. Mr Evans' friends were already collecting coats, ready to leave, when

he performed the stunt. Off-duty MoD Pc Christopher Webb witnessed the tragedy. He told the jury: "I noticed a young man run across in front of me. He performed a handstand on the top railing.

"It was very acrobatic and with great ease he went into a perfect handstand at a 90-degree angle. He looked like he knew what he was doing and he was going to come back down on his feet.

"But I thought it was a totally stupid thing to do. Then he bent his legs slightly and flipped himself over and I watched him disappear over the edge onto the dance floor."

Pc Webb described how Mr

Evans mounted the railing, saying: "He put one foot on the

bottom railing and flipped himself into a handstand. He held his position for just a split second. "My natural reaction was to go forward but I was too late. I looked down on the dance floor and saw the young man lying there with several people around him."

Staff at the club tried to administer first aid but Mr Evans later died from massive head injuries at the Royal Berkshire Hospital in Reading.

Consultant pathologist Robert Menai-Williams said blood tests had revealed that the victim was about three times the legal drink-drive limit.

Mr Evans' friend, Peter Cowan,

had gone to the nightclub with him and also saw the tragedy.

He said he caught a glimpse of his friend disappearing over the balcony as he prepared to leave at about 3am.

He added: "From the corner of my eye I saw some feet going over the balcony. It was too quick to do anything."

"He just toppled over. He must have slipped and his feet went all the way over. I didn't see him standing on the railings. It was just as I turned that I saw him driving over."

After the jury returned a verdict

of accidental death, Reading Cor-

oner Joe Pim said: "This was a

tragic end to what was supposed

to be a night out and some fun."

Mr Evans' family did not attend the hearing.

Holman, Mrs. de Lacy Lacy and Mrs. Longfellow Cooper some time, and so many were the competitors that extra prizes of 2s each were given by Mrs. A. Cole, Mrs. de Lacy Lacy, Mrs. F. A. Holman, Mrs. Besseker, Mrs. Longfellow Cooper and Mrs. Stapleton. The military sports naturally drew most interest and attention. The tent pegging was very exciting and so was the Victoria Cross race, in which the men had to gallop down the course, take two flights of hurdles, pick up a dummy and carry it back past a fixed point. On the return journey Sgt. Bellinger had a nasty fall. Somehow when he got his dummy on the saddle he loosened his grip of the horse and fell heavily on his shoulder, but beyond being badly shaken he was not hurt. The musical chairs, the melees, and the bare back wrestling were keenly watched. Corporal Airey, of the 18th Hussars, was of great help to the Committee in the military sports. Just for fun the "military" pulled in a tug-of-war, easily overcoming Mr. G. Perry's team.

THE AEROPLANE DISASTER.

FUNERAL OF MR. W. H. B. EVANS.

The interment of the ashes of William Harry Brereton Evans, who with Col. Cody, lost his life through the collapse of an aeroplane during a flight at Farnborough on Thursday last week, took place in the secluded churchyard at Tadley on Wednesday afternoon. The late Mr. Evans, who belonged to the Sudan Civil Service, came home on leave in June, and was staying with his sister at Fair Lawn, Tadley, at the time of the disastrous adventure. All in this locality who were privileged to know him deeply lament the loss of a valuable young life and of superior capacities, which had been shown not only in the fields of national sport, formerly in cricket and latterly more particularly in polo, but also in the more serious pursuit of planting England's lordship strong in the newly conquered region of the Sudan. Of the large crowd who from far and near assembled to witness the burial, many perhaps were drawn by the mere curiosity which had been excited by the tragic end of a famous flight, but by no means all were mere sightseers. Indeed, it was obvious from the quiet and sad demeanour of those present that they were touched by that most precious of human sentiments—a feeling of tender sympathy with others' griefs. The body had been cremated, and the casket containing the ashes was placed on a bier covered with the Union Jack in the chancel of the little church of St. Peter, an ancient fabric so remotely situated that it is only used for divine service during the summer months, the services in the winter being held in the modern church of St. Mary nearer the inhabited parts of this scattered parish. The brass plate on the casket bore the inscription: "William Harry Brereton Evans, died August 7th, 1913, aged 30 years."

The whole of the service was said at the graveside, the officiating clergy being the Rev. W. L. Oakden Ward, rector of Tadley, who recited the 99th Psalm and read the lesson, and the Rev. L. P. Phelps, of Oriel College, Oxford (Mr. Evans' alma mater), who said the prayers of committal. Accustomed as we are to the nerve-racking movements that are incidental to any ordinary interment, the sight of the sexton alone lifting the casket containing the mortal remains and depositing it in its tiny grave was not merely a novelty but a striking illustration of a more scientific and convenient method of the disposal of our hallowed dead than is the more common one. Deep silence fell upon all at the venerable white-bearded clergyman from Oxford said the concluding prayers. The ashes were placed in a grave next to that where repose the body of Mr. Evans's grandmother, who died in 1911.

Lieut. Norman Keyser, 20th Hussars, who motored with Mr. Evans to the flying-ground the previous Thursday morning and preceded him in a flight with Colonel Cody, was also present; and another pathetic figure in the gathering round the grave was Mr. Leon Cody. Among others present were: Mr. Percy Strange, Mr. and Mrs. Stokes, the Misses Stokes, Mrs. Oakden Ward, Mr. D. Phillips (The Wilderness, Tadley), Mr. Illingworth (Caversham), Rev. F. R. Evans; Mr. Ralph Evans; Mr. and Mrs. Keyser; Lieut. Norman Keyser; the Misses Muriel and Sybil Keyser; Mrs. J. T. Strange and the Misses Strange; Stella and Percy Jucolyn; Mr. and Mrs. W. Findlay; Rev. and Mrs. Alick Stokes; Capt. R. Reeves; Mrs. and the Misses Selons; Miss Janet Cutler; Mr. and Mrs. F. N. On Thursday Mr. Clavell Salter, K.C., M.P., introduced a deputation to the Under-Secretary for War—Colonel Seny being absent owing to the death of his wife—for the purpose of making representations on the subject of Army trading. We may explain that an application had been made by a Committee of officers in South Africa for leave to use £80,000, the result of canteen trading in South Africa during the war, in canteen supply in this country on co-operative principles. This raised very strong opposition among traders concerned in army trading in all garrison towns, and they were supported by traders generally. Mr. Clavell Salter recently raised the matter in a speech in the House of Commons on army supply, and at his suggestion a deputation to the War Office was arranged. The deputation was an exceedingly important and powerful one, and should have considerable effect. The Members of Parliament present besides Mr. Salter were: Colonel Ward (Mid Kent), Mr. John O'Connor (Newbridge), Mr. G. P. Hobler (Chatham), Mr. Shaw (West Southampton), Mr. Agg-Gardner (Cheltenham), and Mr. Rowlands (Deptford). The following wrote expressing regret at their inability to be present: Mr. Duke (Exeter), Col. Ivor Phillips (Southampton), Mr. Worthington Evans (Colchester), Mr. Robert Thompson (Belfast), Mr. Sam Roberts (Stratford), Mr. F. J. Mason (Windsor). There were also present: The Mayor of Chatham, the Deputy Mayor of Brighton, the Mayor of Salisbury, the Chairman of the District Councils of Aldershot, Farnborough and Trimley, also representatives of the National Chamber of Trade, Medway Chamber of Trade, and the Chambers of Commerce of Salisbury, Maidstone, Dover, Kensington, Woolwich, Trimley, Aldershot, Thirsk Committee of Trade, Torquay Traders' Association, Wholesale Textile Association, Ironmongers' Federation, and the National Union of Mineral Water Manufacturers' Association. The following had passed resolutions in support of the Deputation: The Newcastle-on-Tyne Chamber of Commerce, Bristol Chamber of Commerce, Altrincham Traders' Association, Grocers' Federation, and the Chamber of Commerce of Torquay, Walsall, Birmingham, Rotherham, Exeter, Redruth, Gloucester, Bath, Dublin, Belfast, Plymouth, and Blackburn. Hull Chamber of Trade, Worcester Chamber of Commerce, Liverpool Mercantile Association, Drapers' Chamber of Trade and Pontefract Chamber of Trade.

The deputation was received by the Under-Secretary, who was addressed by Mr. Clavell Salter, the Member for North Hants being followed by Mr. John O'Connor and by representatives of import trading interests.

MR. CLAVELL SALTER AND ARMY TRADING.

William Thomas Mew, 48, of Approach Road, Bethnal Green, was on Wednesday charged at Old Street with stealing a gold watch, value £15, the property of Solomon Ford, of Dulley Manor, New Hursbourne, Hants.

Prosecutor, who described himself as of independent means, said he was travelling from Andover to Waterloo by train on the afternoon of August 4th. He had been riding hard and was very tired, and consequently went to sleep. As the train reached Basingstoke he awoke and saw prisoner enter the corridor carriage witness was in and sit down opposite him. Witness again dozed off, waking up at Surbiton, where the train next stopped, and noticed that prisoner had left the carriage. At Waterloo witness was surprised to see Mew alight from another part of the train, but thought no more of it at the time and engaged a cab. On the way to his destination witness missed his watch, and found that the chain was hooked on to his waistcoat pocket, so that it would not hang down. So he drove to Scotland Yard where he gave a description of the watch and of the prisoner.

Two days ago he was told the watch had been found in pawn at Bethnal-green, and had identified it as his property and the accused as the man who got into his carriage in the train on August 4th.

Mr. Birrell asked whether prisoner had been identified as the man who pawned the watch, and Mr. Margetts, solicitor defending, said that was admitted. Prisoner's defence was that he had bought it from a man in the train.

A remand was ordered, and on the question of bail being raised:

Mr. Margetts said prisoner was a pensioned police officer, late of J Division, and there would be no difficulty about his re-appearance.

Prisoner's own recognisances in £10 were accordingly accepted.

A FORMER headteacher who steered an all-girls' school through a complete transformation has died, aged 83.

Ursula Everest was headmistress of the Basingstoke High School for Girls from 1965, and led the school through its change to comprehensive education in 1971 when it became Harriet Costello School for girls and boys. The school, in Crossborough Hill, is now Costello Technology College.

Miss Everest was born in Huddersfield and studied at Somerville College, Oxford, before embarking on a career in teaching.

She frequently returned to Oxford, taking school prize winners on trips to Blackwell's Bookshop to allow them to choose their own prize, before her retirement in 1980.

Miss Everest is remembered fondly by past pupils as a respected authority figure who commanded good behaviour and high academic standards, ensuring these were maintained after the school changed from a grammar to a comprehensive.

Having lived on the school site in the

Headmistresses College for much of her time at the school, Miss Everest later moved into Basingstoke town centre. She left Hampshire and moved to Shrewsbury, in Shropshire, to care for her elderly parents a few years after retirement. She did, however, keep in contact with the school after her move to Shrewsbury, returning on special occasions and supporting its change to specialist school status in technology.

Miss Everest was involved in reunions of "old girls" from the school and kept in contact with many former members of staff and pupils through letter writing. She was also devoted to her beloved Corgi dogs.

Speaking on behalf of current staff at the school, headteacher Julia Mortimore said: "Miss Everest is remembered with great admiration and affection at Costello Technology College.

"She was an enthusiastic, formidable and much respected headteacher, who always put the interests of her pupils and staff first. "Her interest and passion for the school over many years will be sadly missed."


