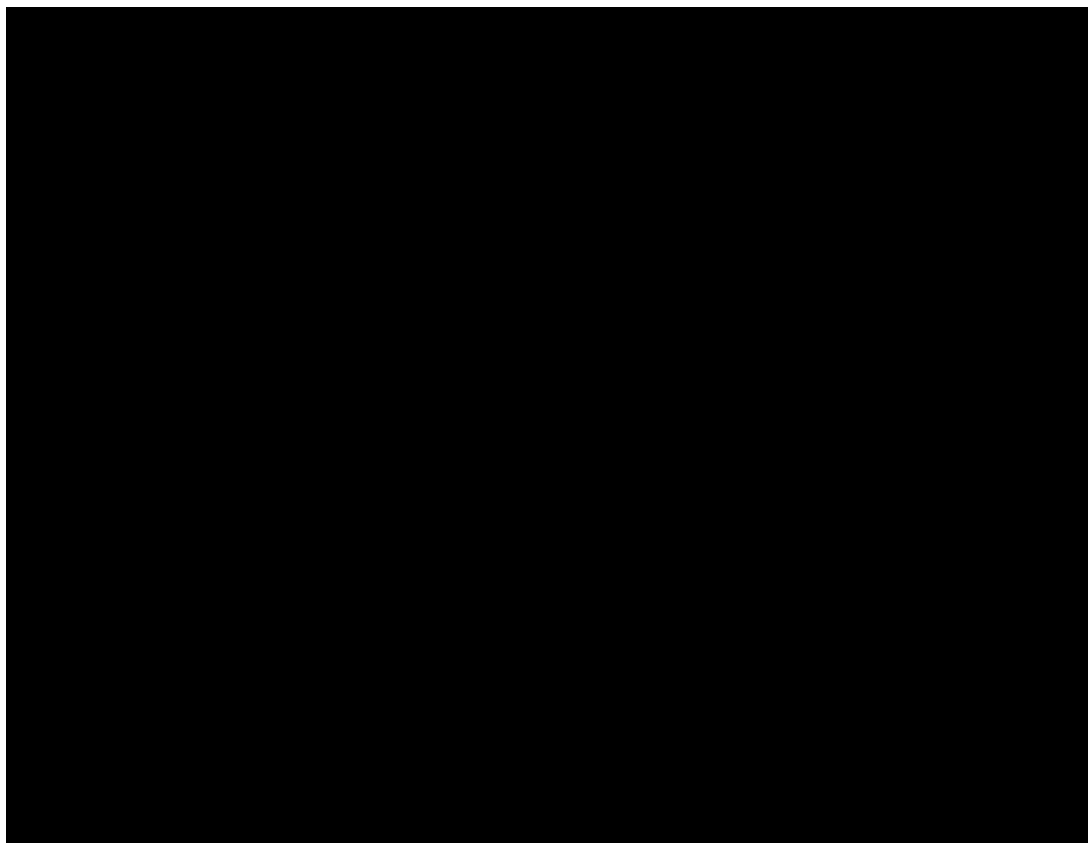

You will see from the enclosed Relationship charts that William Hutchins was my 4 times Great Uncle and Rose Hutchins my 3rd cousin twice removed. More details will be found on the print outs for William Hutchins, Daniel Hutchins, Luke Hutchins and Rose Hutchins. You may already be aware of their details but these are really only summaries of information which I have in greater detail on my Brothers Keeper genealogy programme.

I have printed out the above details so that you can see my enquiry is not frivolous. I have approximately 160 Hutchins names on file all related originally to William Hutchins and Barbara Barns from 1773. There are two tenuous connections with Jacobus Hutchins and before him Christopher Hudgens but I have yet to prove conclusively their connections in Kingsclere. Rosalie Penn I have discovered is my 5th cousin through William Hutchins and we have both been able to exchange information.

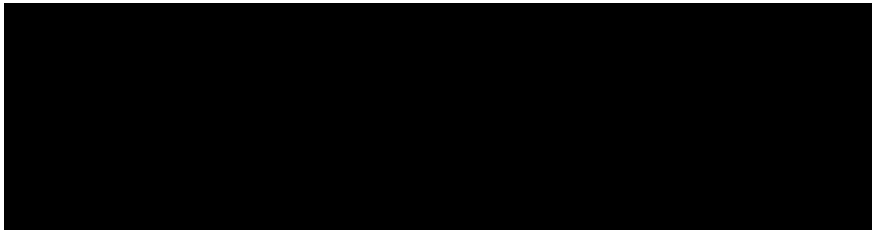

I have no information on Susanna Hutchins, the first wife of James Rivers and although I have 8 persons with the name John Hutchins, I have none with a daughter Susannah. I am enclosing a SAE and would be grateful for any help you could give. In return please do not hesitate to let me know if you require any information. I note your address is in Baughurst which I believe is near to Kingsclere from where my ancestors on my Grandmothers side originated. My grandmother Thirza Alma Claudia Hutchins was born in Kingsclere on 13th May 1892 and died in London on 8th April 1981. She was born illegitimate the daughter of Matilda Aldridge who later married the father Ernest Hutchins. After they left Kingsclere at the turn of the century they moved frequently through Wiltshire, Berkshire, Bedfordshire and then to Kent, but that was in 1914, many years before I moved to Kent.

Anyway I do hope you can be of help and I look forward to hearing from you.

A COUNTRY CHILDHOOD

by Monty Hutchins

A Postscript

Since the last part of the author's reminiscences was published in the March issue, a photograph of his grandfather has come to light which is printed here, together with some further recollections.



A photograph of my grandfather, James Hutchins, who was born in 1840 and died in 1912 aged 72. The photograph was taken about 1910-11. I don't remember him as he died the year after I was born, but I can just remember Gran Hutchins who died in 1918. They lived at Balsome Cottages in the Baughurst Road — the cottages are still there. Grandfather Hutchins was the one I mentioned in the first instalment of my reminiscences as having gone as a lad with a poaching gang to Bucklebury woods and was caught. He was kept in Reading gaol over the Christmas of 1853, but was acquitted at his trial.

More on Hop-picking

Recalling the time we used to go hop-picking at Bentley brought to mind two other stories that my mother told me.

One very cold frosty morning, a man named Rouse was getting at his kids to pick more, while he himself just scratched around. When he was

bending down, my mother took a vine and hit him as hard as she could where his trousers fitted the tightest (!) saying: 'Rouse, don't get on to your little kids, pick some hops yourself!'

She said he jumped a yard in the air and said: 'Amy, if you were a man, I'd knock you down.'

Strangely enough, back in 1948 when I was working at Hermitage, the village postmaster was called John Rouse, and when he and I were talking one day we were amused to find it was his father Mum hit with the vine. He said his father often spoke of it and they all had a good laugh!

Once, after hop-picking time, Mr. Mildenhall, the farmer, met us in Basingstoke. Dad had his bike, and as Mr. Mildenhall wanted to get back to Brimpton early, he suggested he had Dad's bike and Dad drove the horse and cart. Off went Mr. Mildenhall on the bike, but the horse would not budge for Dad. Dad kept saying 'Gee up' and hitting the horse with the reins but it did not take a scrap of notice. But I believe the horse did eventually decide to move and bring us back home!

A Childhood Accident

I have recently seen a copy of the booklet 'Thatcham — Then and Now', a series of photographs compiled by William and Jennifer Butler. In it is a photograph of Mr. G. Owen on his tricycle. It reminded

me that we used to play with his children, and that I well remember him on his trike, which he used because he had a crippled foot. One day when we and his children were playing, a timber cart came along. These carts were just one long baulk of timber, with holes cut in it at various distances to allow the back wheels to be adjusted to the length of the trees to be carried. We used to like to have a ride by clambering on behind the rear wheels. But Douglas Owen got on between the front and back wheels, and he fell off. The man driving the cart did not know and one of the wheels ran over Douglas's foot.

We ran to the nearest farm (God-dard's) to get help and they took Doug home, but his foot never quite recovered and he was slightly lame after that.

Hospital Sunday

When I was a child, Hospital Sunday was held in May when collections were shared among the Reading, Basingstoke and Newbury hospitals. There was a parade of bands at Baughurst, and a great gathering in one of the fields near the New Inn. It was the custom for a number of children to be baptised on this occasion in the open air. One of the old locals used to go round with his hat, saying he was collecting for a good cause, but as most folks knew him he did not get much as his 'good cause' was beer! Dad said it added to the fun of the occasion!

years and would probably develop some more before the wind blew it down again.

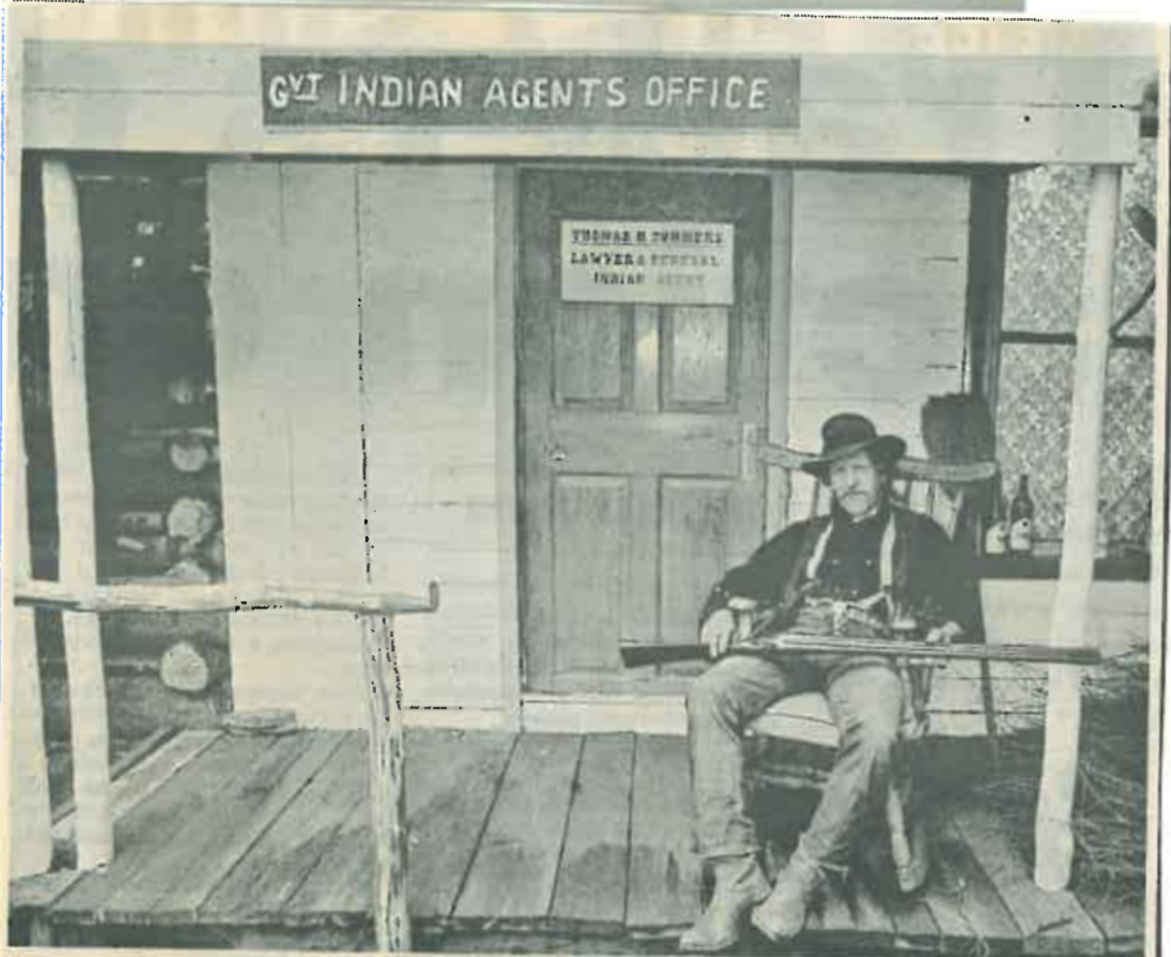
Much of it is facade, but he's built himself a covered work bay where a huge log fire whips into fury as he piles on another heap of clippings from the birch twigs he turns into brooms.

● Roy Hutchins outside one of his home-built shopfronts.

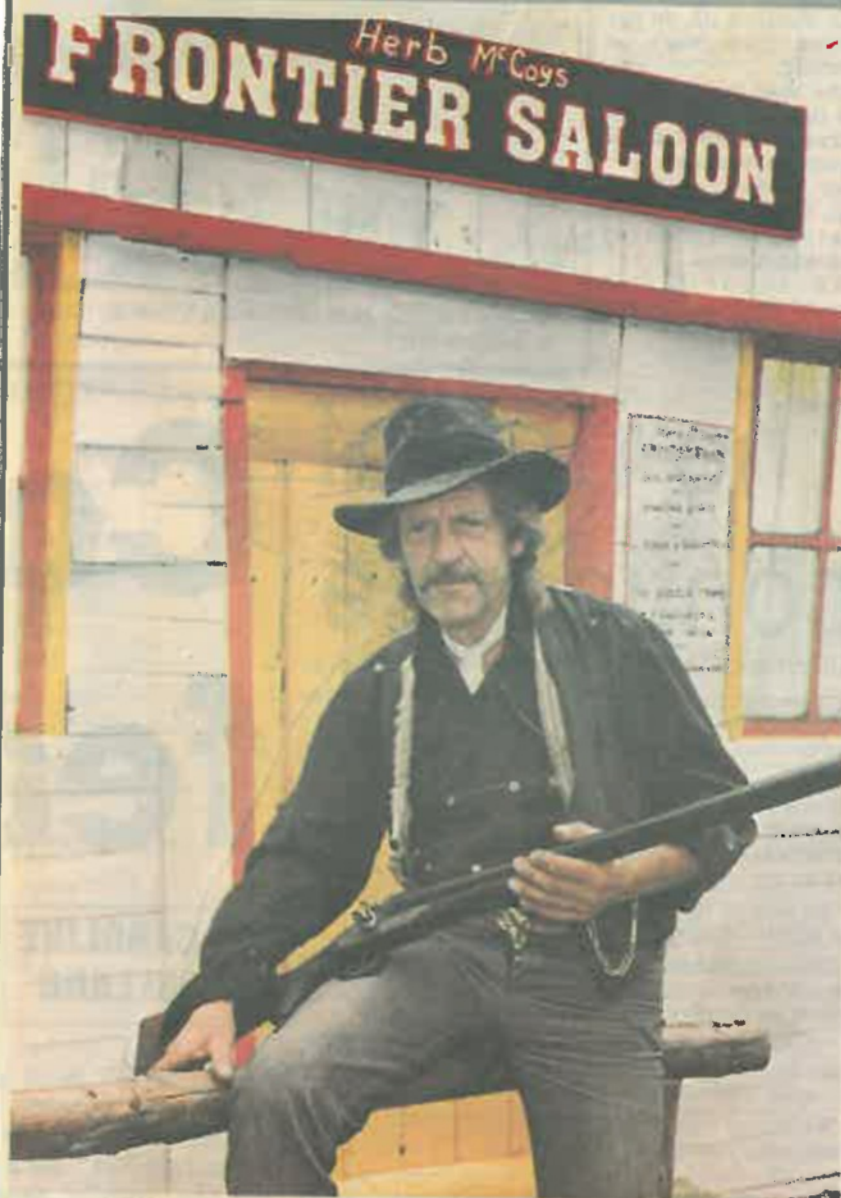

Dear Iris,

Many thanks for your letter of the 2nd August enclosing a chart showing the various children of William Hutchins and Phoebe Butler, Daniel Hutchins and Ann Wellman, and Luke Hutchins and Sophia Harmsworth. Although I had most of the ancestors on my database, your chart enabled me to complete details of baptisms, marriages and burials for which I am most grateful.

It was interesting to learn of the geographical location of Baughurst and Haughurst Hill which features in many of my records, but which was somewhat of a mystery as my map of Kingsclere Woodlands extends in the east as far as Ashford Hill where my own ancestors originated.. I think Baughurst and Tadley are just a few miles further eastwards.

I have managed to check a lot of the details in your chart to both my own and the Births Marriages and Deaths at St Catherines House in London. I still have some of the Births to check (due to lack of time) but was pleased to find all the other records.

I looked at the marriage of William George Chapman to Elizabeth Ann Hutchins on 28th February 1893 but found that his name was recorded as HENRY George Chapman at St Catherines. Perhaps he was known to the family as William.

The following marriages may be of interest to you as they were missing from your chart.

James Hutchins bp 25/3/1840 married Jane Bembury at KW on 25/2/1865.

Charlotte Hutchins Bp 6/2/1842 married Charles Banbury at KW on 2/7/1864.

Dorcas Hutchins Bp 3/5/1846 married Thomas Goodchild at KW 17/6/1865.

Daniel Hutchins bp 12/6/1864 married Alice Jane Rabbits at KW 7/1/1888.

I have not yet discovered the maiden name of Susannah who married Cephas Hutchins at Reading registration district in March qtr 1900. Do you know what her maiden name was?


Of the eleven children born to Daniel Hutchins and Ann Wellman there were four that I was not aware of: John bp 20/8/1852, buried 11/3/1853 KW, Alfred Bp 6/3/1857, Buried KW 20/3/1857, Eliza bp 28/4/1858, Eliza bp 28/5/1866, buried 9/6/1866 at KW.

I also have a Julia bp 6/6/1858 at KW and buried 26/6/1858 which does not appear in your records. I wondered if she could have been the child of parents with the same name Daniel & Ann but could not find any other parents with the same name. Her baptism also conflicted with that for the first Eliza bp 28/4/1858 at Baughurst in the same year. I was unable to find any birth registered for that Eliza in 1858 and in fact searched at St Catherines for her birth up to and including 1866 when the second Eliza was born (I found both her birth and death age 0 that year. So I am sure about the 2nd Eliza but doubtful about the first.

I know you said you have Baughurst registers up to approximately 1850. Do they extend as far as 1858, and if so would you mind looking to see if Eliza, Baptised 28/4/1858, is the correct name?

I noticed that Harriet Hedgecock Harmsworth was baptised 16/1/1870 in a Methodist Church. Was that church in Baughurst and do you know its name? Do you know when Harriet married William Broadhurst? Also what is the name of the church at Baughurst and is there a church at Tadley and if so what is it called?

It was most interesting to learn of all the extra information from your records and at the same time confirm some of my details. I have details of baptisms and burials missing from your chart and if you want them then please let me know how you wish to receive them. I have a list of names of people who have been baptised in the church at Baughurst from 1850 to 1858.

Girlfriend and family pay tribute to 18-year-old crash victim

THE LAST THING MARK SAID TO ME WAS 'I LOVE YOU'

GRIEVING family and friends of a popular teenager, who died after his car hit a tree, have shed tears and laid floral tributes at the spot where he crashed.

Mark Ivermee, 18, was driving his Renault Clio along Silchester Road, Tadley, on Monday night when he was involved in a collision with a parked car and then hit a tree outside The Broomshire Hotel - a pub owned by a member of his extended family - at about 11.15pm.

Mark's girlfriend, 15-year-old Rachael Ward, of Plantation Road, Tadley, said she had seen him less than two hours before the crash when he dropped her at home before going out with a friend.

The Hurst Community College pupil added: "The last thing Mark said to me was 'I love you'."
