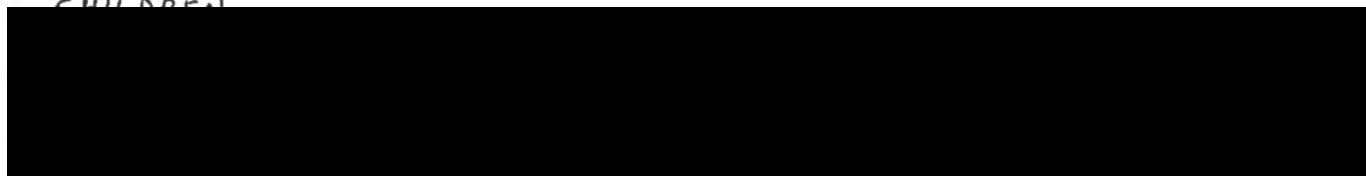

## Tough challenges lead to gold for Nicola

TREKKING on foot through the Peak District and performing voluntary hospital work were just two of the challenges that Nicola Jeffery had to meet to earn her Duke of Edinburgh Gold Award.

Nicola, 22, from Woodlands Road, Baughurst, received her award at a ceremony at St James's Palace in London, at which the Duke was present.

She was one of nearly 400 young people from all over the country attending the presentations.

Nicola worked at Basingstoke hospital for the community service part of the scheme, while her trip to the Peak District was for the expedition and exploration section.

For the physical recreation category, Nicola took part in trampolining, while her special skill was motor driving.

She also did conservation work for the National Trust as her residential project.

Nicola said that some of her most vivid memories come from the expeditions section.

During a practice she got stuck in a peat bog up to her thighs.

The final challenge through the Peak District proved a gruelling experience.

She said: "Some members of the team were unable to complete the route, but a real sense of unity and determination developed among those who did amidst difficult circumstances."

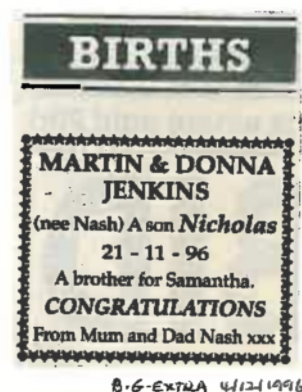

# Rumble at the jumble

A FRAIL pensioner was refused entry to a jumble sale because she was in a wheelchair.

Nellie Jerrom, 84, has been forced to rely on a wheelchair for mobility since she suffered a stroke 18 months ago.

But when she decided to take a trip out to a local church bazaar with her daughter Wendy Jennings, she wasn't expecting to be refused entry.

Mrs Jennings, from Baulthorpe, told the Gazette: "As we were about to go in to Tadley Community Centre for the church bazaar we were greeted at the door by an elderly woman informing us in rather an abrupt manner 'You can't bring that in here'.

"My mother has to rely on a wheelchair to get about.

"The sort of thoughtless

remark made by that woman did nothing for either mum's or my faith in human nature.

"I realise there were safety regulations to comply with, but surely since the community centre was built complete with disabled toilets and easier access for the disabled she should have been made more welcome?"

"After all, my mum's £5 was worth exactly the same as that woman's."

Furious at the comments, Wendy and Nellie decided to go for a walk, during which time they were asked three times if they required any help with the wheelchair.

Mrs Jennings continued: "I'd just like to thank the three young lads who stopped to offer help -- they get so much bad publicity usual-

ly, so thanks boys!"

Chris Cooper, organiser of the Christmas bazaar which was in aid of two local surgeries, Homewood Heath and Moorland, said: "I was very upset about what happened. That day I was very poorly and I wasn't told about the incident until it was too late and the lady and her daughter had left.

"Somebody was at the door who doesn't normally help me with these events.

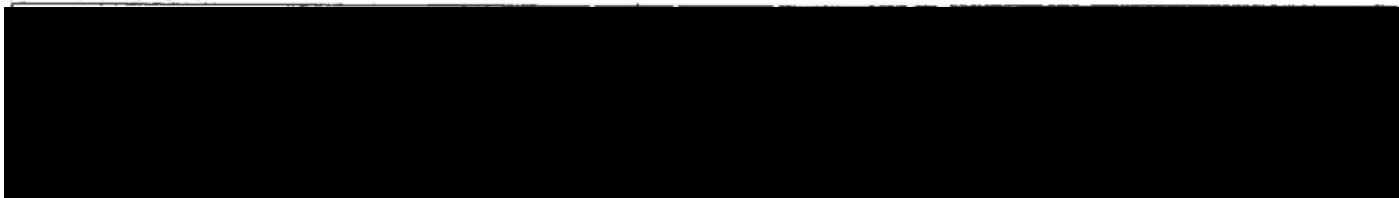
"I am hoping to go and visit Nellie soon and make sure that everything is put right."

David Leeks, chairman of Tadley Town Council who is himself disabled, said: "There must have been a mistake on this occasion. I don't understand it as the community centre had been purpose-built for disabled people and everybody is always welcome."

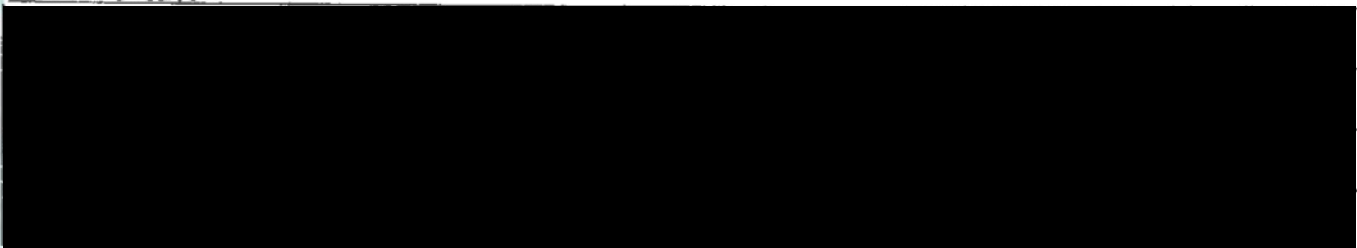

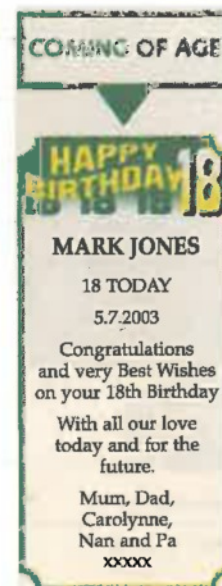

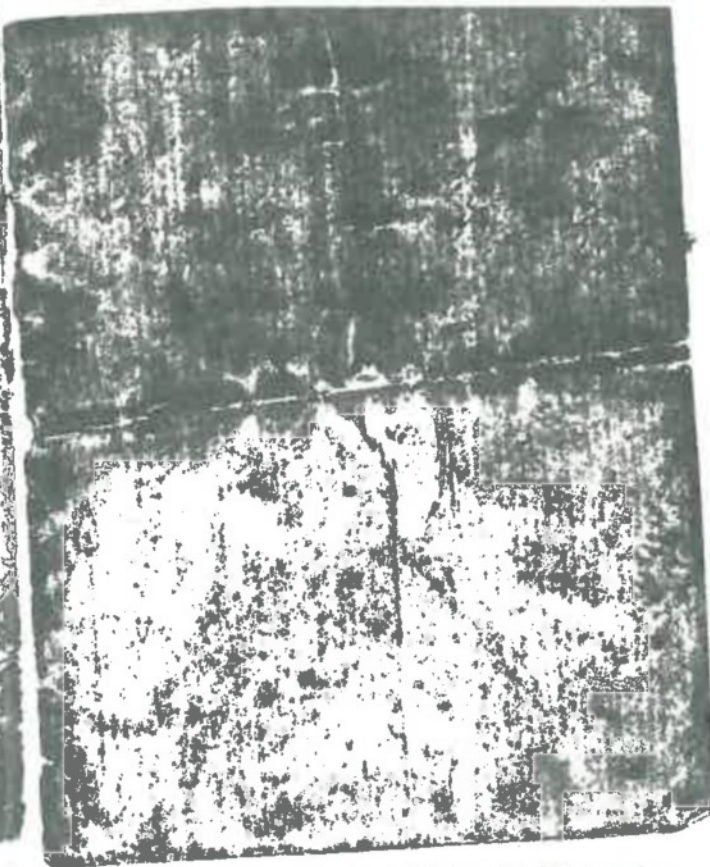

LABOUR DAY.

DEMONSTRATION IN HYDE PARK.

For the first time in the history of the pleasant picnics by which the working-classes of London yearly demonstrate the world-wide "solidarity" of Labour the 1st of May has fallen on a Sunday, and the masses of the Metropolis had the satisfaction of knowing that they and their friends abroad were demonstrating in favour of a general eight-hour day at about the same time. The Thames Embankment was the rallying point for most of the demonstrators, though the contingents from the West-end marched separately. Here from about 1 o'clock until 2 the arrivals were continuous. They streamed in over Blackfriars, Waterloo, and Westminster Bridges, a huge crowd watching their arrival. From a spectacular point of view the procession lost a great deal owing to the cloudy atmosphere, as there was a dull haze, through which the luminary was powerless to penetrate. At 2 o'clock a start was made for Hyde Park, the dockers leading. The first rank consisted of "The Only Original" branch—at least the banner decorated with a portrait of Mr. Ben Tillett so said—bailing from the South Dock. There was a plethora of music; each band seemed to have engaged the strongest available man to beat the big drum. The trades-unionists, the political clubs and the Socialists were mixed up in the most friendly way; but the standards of the trades put the simple bunting of the mere politicians quite in the shade. The dockers excelled in the matter of portraits. John Burns, Tom Mann, and Cardinal Manning seemed to equally divide the honours. In Hyde Park extensive preparations were made for the oratorical efforts of those who were to address the vast assemblage that was expected. In a semicircle, extending from the Marble-arch past the Reformers' Tree, and so round to the band-stand, no fewer than 16 vans were arranged at intervals to serve the purpose of platforms, and to each of these a Chairman and a selected number of speakers were assigned. Eight of these vans were monopolised by the London Trades Council, and on each of them a particular industry in which men are engaged was represented in the persons of the speakers. To women's trades-unions in the aggregate one platform was assigned. The Social Democratic Federation, the Metropolitan Radical Federation, and the Legal Eight Hours Committee had each two platforms, while the one which remained was allocated to representatives of the Fabian Society. It was also arranged that at each of the platforms, with the exception of that at which the women-workers assembled, the following resolution should be submitted, viz.: "That this meeting considers that the establishment of an international eight-hour day for all workers is the most important step towards the ultimate emancipation of the industrial population, and urges upon the Government the necessity of introducing and passing through Parliament a measure to give legal effect to an eight hour working day, and that the Organising Committee present this request by a deputation to the Government on May 2nd, 1892." The women-folk were asked merely to affirm "That the long hours worked in many trades are conducive to evil, both morally and physically, and that it is the duty of all women to become members of trades societies in their respective industries, and necessary that all women's unions should combine forthwith to reduce the hours of labour." Everything was in readiness for the demonstrators by half-past 2 o'clock, and even at that early hour considerable numbers of people had begun to congregate in the vicinity of the platforms. As time progressed and the orators took their places it was tolerably evident that, owing to the continually-increasing numbers of people, most of the processionists would have to be content with places far removed from those who were to address them. It was past 3 o'clock when the head of the procession made its appearance on the green sward, and from that time until long after 5 contingents were continuously arriving. The hour for the commencement of proceedings was half-past 3, and at most of the platforms there was no reason to complain of want of punctuality. At this time, indeed, the audience before many of the vans was extremely dense; in fact, the vast semicircle in which they were arranged appeared to be entirely occupied by people. The speakers comprised men of several European nationalities, among those over whom Dr. Aveling presided being Herr Bernstein, the editor of a proscribed German Socialistic newspaper; M. Bernard, of the French *partie ouvrier*; M. Volkosky, a Russian who had escaped from Siberia; Mrs. Kautsky, representing the Austrian women; M. Stepniak, of the Russian Revolutionary Party, and several other persons holding advanced Socialistic opinions. Their speeches consisted, in the main, of assurances of fraternal feelings on the part of workers of their own nationalities for those of this country, and a desire on their part for the advancement of the welfare of the labouring classes all over the world. Mr. John Burns, who spoke from one of the platforms of the Legal Eight Hours Committee, delivered a long and impassioned harangue on the subject of the resolution, his utterances evoking repeated applause from his large audience. He would not be content, he said, with the demonstration being

# EXPRESS OBITUARIES Broadcaster Alan Keith

**F**OR more than 40 years Alan Keith spun the popular classics for the Radio 2 show he made his own. It was in 1959 that he came up with the idea for the programme that would become *Your Hundred Best Tunes*, thinking it would run for a maximum of six months. Instead, his soothing voice became a Sunday night mainstay, maintaining a large and loyal following from factory workers to the aristocracy.

Still working at the age of 94, he was the oldest regular BBC national radio presenter. He held his record over even Radio 4's Alastair Cooke, who continues to present the *Letter From America* slot, and was a month his junior.

Alan was born Alec Kossoff in 1908, the son of a London businessman, and educated at Islington's Dame Alice Owen School. He was granted a scholarship to the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art, where he won the school's silver medal.

He was not the only creative person in his family. His brother was the actor David Kossoff and his nephew Paul Kossoff's Free was a leading Sixties rock band.

Leaving RADA, Alan appeared in a 1928 West End production of *Major Barbara*, did a stint as a comedian at London's Windmill Theatre and specialised in playing American parts on radio. He moved into variety as a compere before being taken on by the BBC as a presenter in 1935. For three years he worked as an interviewer on *In Town Tonight*.

He volunteered for the Second World War but was rejected three times. He once recalled: "They wouldn't have me and the last time they said, 'Go back and do what you're doing. You're more value to them than you are to us'."

He also took roles in British and American films but radio was his first love and in 1959 he came up with the idea for the show he would end up presenting for 44 years. He suggested a weekly

programme's presenter from April 6. "The secret of his survival was surely the very personal way he talked to all of us. His rich, deeply human voice was a truly one-to-one communication, even though he was addressing an unseen audience of millions. He is a hard act to follow," he says.



it must have class." The half-hour programme was originally called *The Hundred Best Tunes In The World*. Its title was changed in February 1960 when listeners were asked to suggest their own tunes. The show also doubled in length, transferring to Radio 2 in 1967 after the reorganisation of BBC radio.

Fans included Nancy Mitford, who said her idea of heaven was listening to *Your Hundred Best*

**A**LAN, who was awarded the OBE in 1991, had recently decided to hang up his earphones for good, recording a farewell message for his fans and a final programme. "Now that I'm 94, I've decided that the time has come to say farewell. I would like to thank my listeners for joining me over the years on this musical journey," he said.

His sudden death meant the retirement message was never broadcast but, as a mark of

mong editors, who were unable to decide which 100 tunes should go on the playlist. So they commissioned him to draw up his own list and present the show for a 13-week run. His fee was ten guineas. He had his own measure of a great tune: "It must be popular and it must be good of its kind. Even if it is only a Cockney ballad,

# Showman Kossoff dies of liver cancer aged 85

ACTOR, broadcaster and author David Kossoff died yesterday aged 85 after a battle with liver cancer.

Kossoff, well known for his role as hen-pecked husband Alf Larkins in the TV series *The Larkins*, had been ill for a number of months.

Born in the East End of London, he was also famous for British films such as *A Kid for Two Farthings* (1955) and for his role as Morry in *The Bespoke Overcoat* (1956).

Kossoff, who started his working life as a draftsman and furniture designer, also entertained millions in the Sixties by presenting his Bible stories, which he had published, on TV.

The son of Russian parents, Kossoff experienced tragedy in his life when his son Paul, guitarist with the rock band *Free*, died following years of drug abuse at the age of 25.

After Paul's death, Kossoff, who began

acting through amateur theatre in the 1940s, gave more than 350 performances around schools of his one-man show warning of the dangers of drugs, Late Great Paul. He said last year "It's a dramatisation of Paul's life but it's not just an explicit warning about drugs."

"It's a warning against waste of every kind. It's not intended to attract applause, rather to leave a bruise." His son Simon, 56, said: "He was a generous, peaceful and gentle human being."

Kossoff, who lived in Hatfield, Hertfordshire, leaves two children Jean and Simon and three grandchildren. His second wife Jennie died in 1995.

In the past 10 years, Kossoff took up sculpting and painting again. Kossoff, who was also well known for the radio series *Journey into Space*, won a British Academy Award for the 1954 film *The Young Lovers*. He also wrote the play *A Big Night for Shylock*, in 1968.

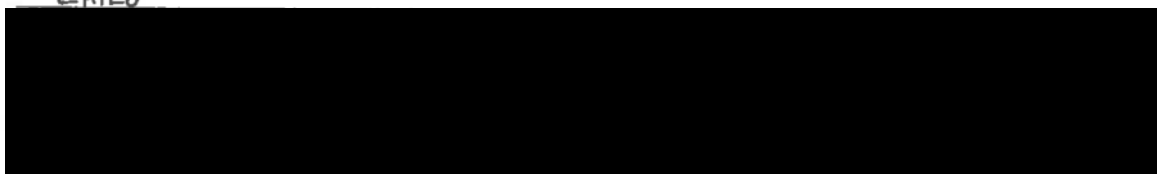

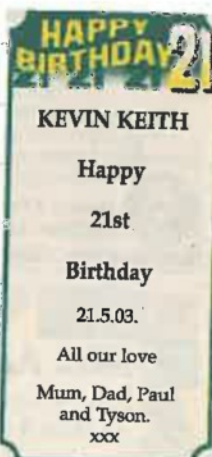

He was a founder member of Ramsdell Cricket Club and a good opening bat, and bowler, and instituting the cricket pitch as it is today. With Ernie's passing a real chapter in Ramsdell history is finished writing, and I know that many tributes of him are well deserved for he was a marvelous example of country life, dignified and hard working in all he did; for 70 years he was a hunt follower. ## Sheila Kew

MRS SHEILA KEW, 70, the founder of the Three Counties Dog Rescue Society, has died at a nursing home after a long illness.

A dedicated dog lover, she formed the society in 1971 and, since that time, had found homes for over 4,000 dogs.

Mrs Kew and colleagues Gyllian Mauchline and Yvonne Bishop did not have kennels but were in touch with many foster homes who would house dogs on a long or short-term basis before they were found permanent homes.

They also helped with transporting dogs through

good friends and received supported in fundraising events to keep the project going.

Mrs Kew and her partners had managed, at times, to have housed between them as many as 32 canine waifs and strays.

She was always striving to educate others in showing care to animals and was a great advocate in the neutering programme, which has prevented the birth of many unwanted dogs.

An important part of the work of the Three Counties Rescue Society was the vetting of prospective dog owners who had to undergo

rigorous and tough interrogation.

Mrs Kew, who hailed from Necton, Norfolk, was the wife of Norman Kew, well-known in Basingstoke as the manager of Barclays Bank.

She lived at Black Nest, Chandlers Green, in Mattingley.

In tribute, a colleague said: "Sheila was a plucky lady, frequently standing up bravely to seriously nasty characters."

"Her death is a loss, not only to her family and friends but to the world of animal welfare."

The funeral took place at Mattingley Church.

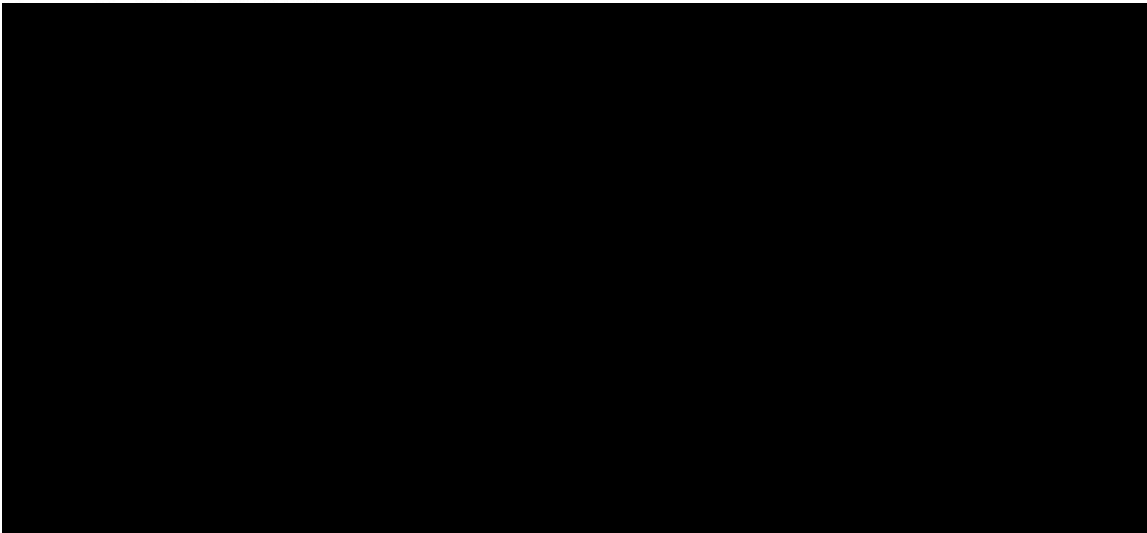

## OBITUARY

# Music-loving Tadley native

WITH the death on Monday of Mr Ernie Kimber of Main Road, Tadley, the area has lost one of its best known characters and one who had spent his long life in his native village.

Mr Kimber (88), died at Basingstoke Hospital after a week's stay. The only time he had been away from the village was at the end of the First World War when serving with the Royal Naval Air Service in the Orkney Islands.

While there, he watched the German Fleet arriving after surrendering, but left just before the Ger-

mans scuttled the many ships in 1919.

For many years, until his retirement, he was a civil servant at the Central Ammunition Depot, Bramley.

He will be a particularly remembered at Tadley for the contribution he made to music.

For a long period he played in the Tadley Silver Band and, with Miss Hazel Carter, started Tadley Brass.

He also played a part in local administration as a member of Tadley Parish Council to be followed by serving as clerk to both

the Tadley and Pamber Parish Councils.

He had also been a governor of Tadley County Primary School.

Mr Kimber was very knowledgeable about the area and during his long retirement, produced a valuable booklet entitled 'Tadley During My Time and Before'.

# Man of music who helped shape a band's success

**F**OR over 100 years Tadley has been famed for its brass and silver bands.

Among the enthusiasts, who year after year take part in national championships, the Tadley musicians would have been as well known as the Tadley besom brooms, which have been supplied to many parts of the British Isles.

Brass bands, like other secular organisations, often sprang into being as the result of connections with places of worship during Victorian times, when organised religion was followed much more than today.

Not only bands came into existence through links with churches and chapels but also football clubs—Southampton is a prime example.

The 'Saints' were originally Southampton St Mary linked to the town's parish church.

One of Tadley's best known bandsmen, Mr Ernie Kimber, of Main Road, Tadley, died last year. For 75 years he was very much involved in the local bands—for many years with the Tadley Band and during the latter years with the Tadley Concert Brass.

It is very fitting, therefore, that on Saturday, June 3, Tadley is to honour the memory of Mr Kimber with a concert at Park Prewett, Basingstoke, given jointly by the Tadley Band and

But, because of the nature of his civilian work, he was released from military service. During the war years, the Band's activities were severely curtailed, with no fewer than 16 of the bandsmen serving in the forces.

Those who were left, however, occasionally got together. The band provided music for Sunday evening services at the United States Air Force Chapel, which is now Tadley Community Centre.

Two members of the band lost their lives during the war, Able Seaman Stanley Brown died while serving with the Channel Patrol Services, and Flight Sgt Brian West shot down over enemy territory during a bombing operation.

When the band was gradually regaining its pre-war standard it lost two important people, with the death of Mr Dyson at the end of 1945, followed by the sudden death of John Lambden in April 1946.

For the next few months Ernie Kimber combined the post of secretary with that of bandmaster until Gideon West was appointed bandmaster in 1947.

He had been a lifelong member and served with distinction as bandmaster for the next 17 years.

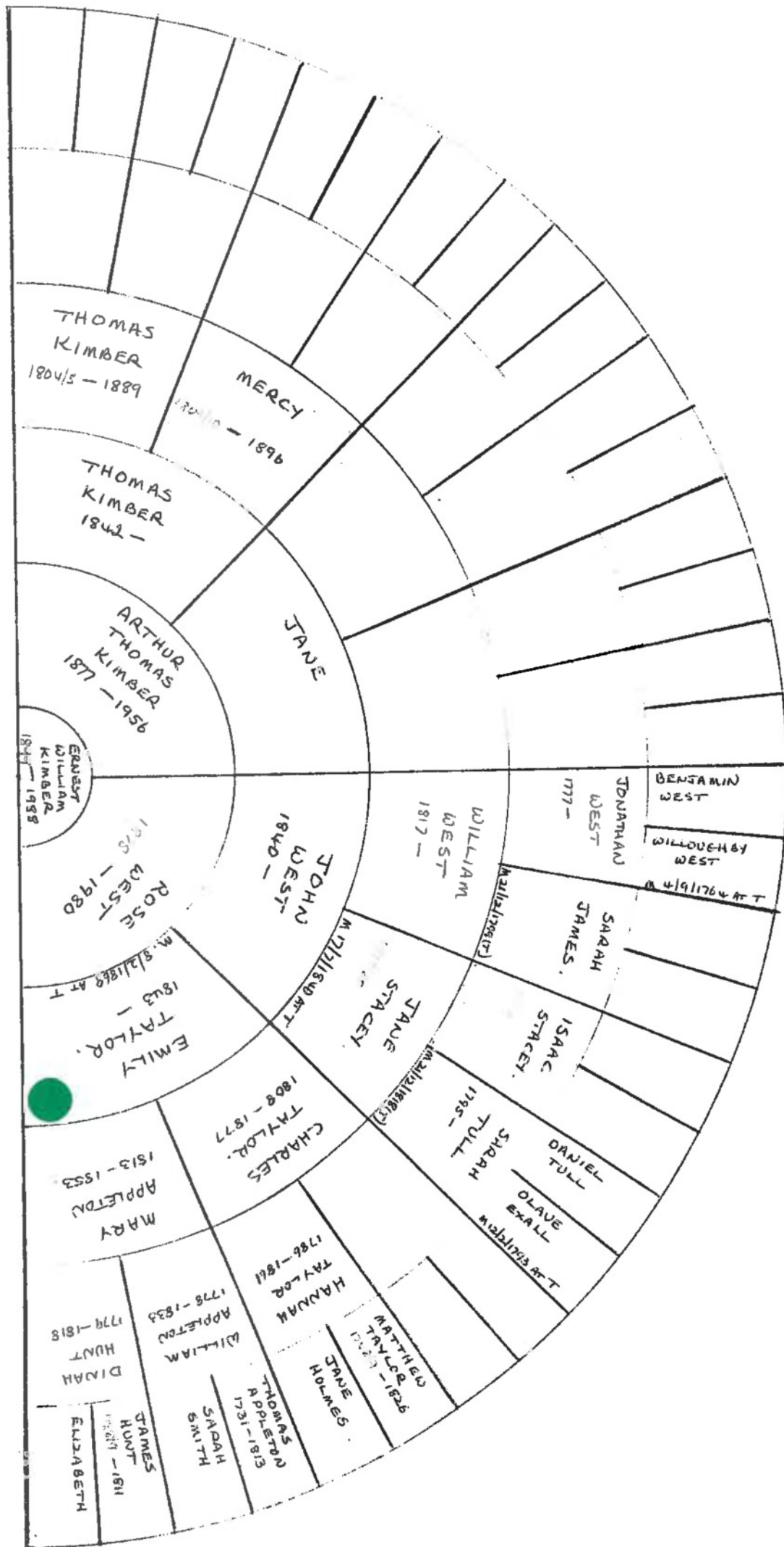
Mr George Turner, formerly deputy conductor of the famous St Hilda's Colliery Band, was appointed professional coach and under his assistance of band regained its prize-winning form.

Mr Turner died in 1955 but the band continued its successful progress under the baton of Mr Gideon West.

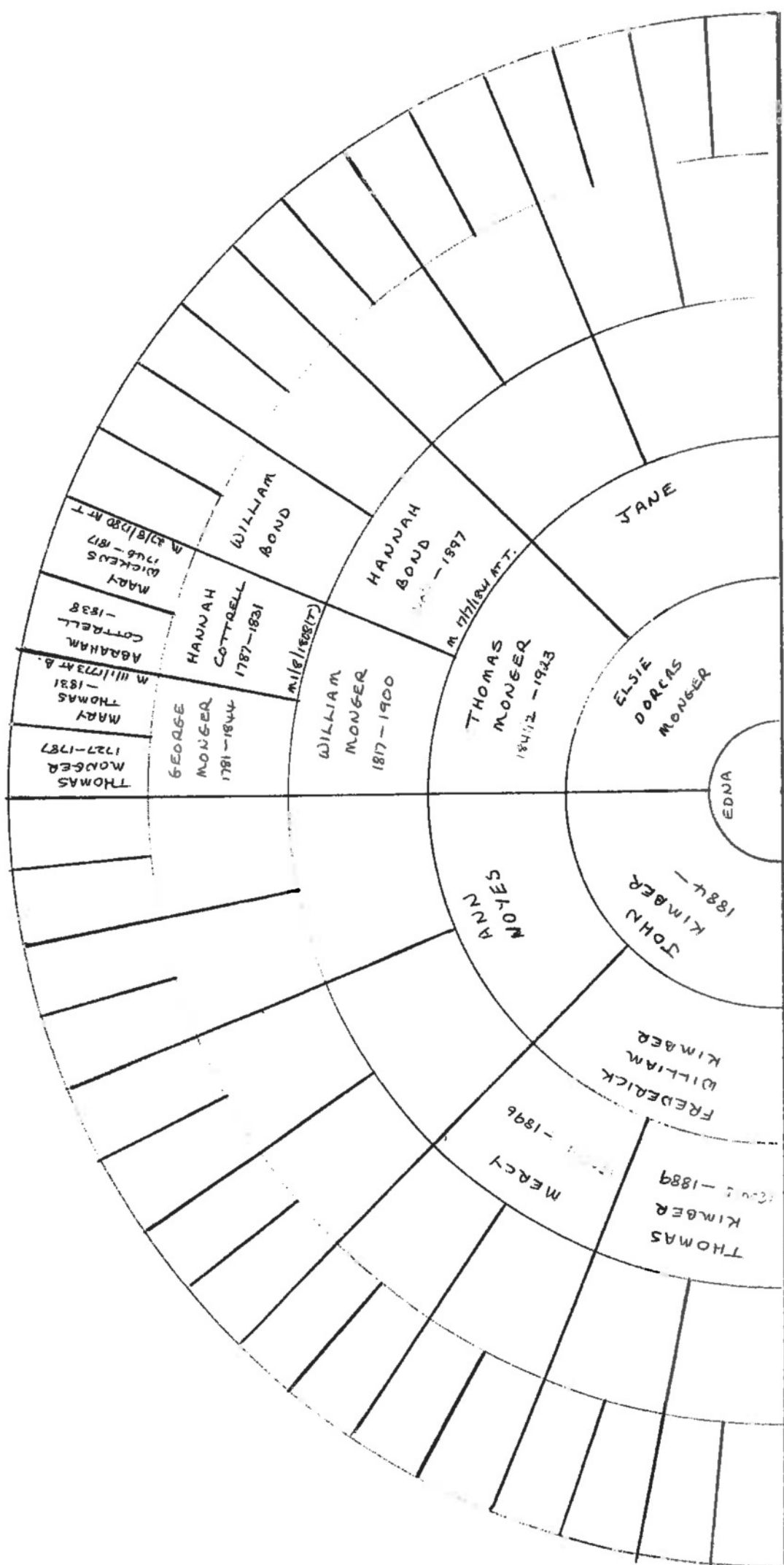

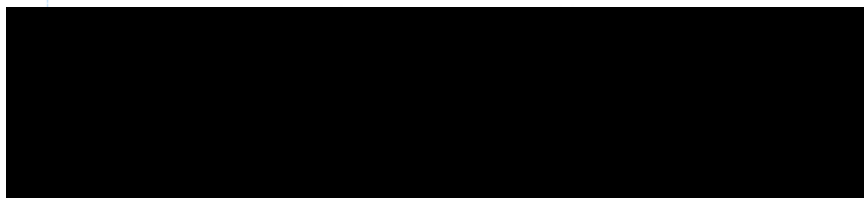

### Tribute to the Kleeneze King

Sir.-Re: "Kingy Kleeneze". I am sure that in last Friday's In Memoriam section, which included the cryptic words above, may have puzzled some readers - but not those of us who remember the '30s.

The term referred to a man who all Basingstoke and district knew as a salesman - always smiling and whistling - travelling the area, riding a motorcycle combination and selling products for the well-known firm of Kleeneze.

We always knew him as "Tom" King, but his proper name was Sidney, a fact I learnt only recently.

My mind goes back to a sunny evening in, I think, June 1937 when, as a fairly new police officer, I was on station duty at the old "nick" in Mark Lane. I received a call about an accident near the Kings Head (now The Hatch) on London Road in which the rider of a motorcycle combination was said to have lost his right leg.

My equally new colleague, Ted Dear, went to the scene and, on his return, said that a man was certainly without his right leg... but was sitting on the grass verge laughing his head off.

Although not at that time very experienced in the handling of traffic accidents, any more than Ted was, I was puzzled until he said: "It was Tom King".

Tom had always had an artificial right leg during the short time I had known him - I do not know the origin of this - but to laugh about the forcible removal of the false member was typical of the man.

Though not really involved, my memory of the occurrence was that the damaged leg, which was brought to the police station, could not be found some weeks later when a family member enquired after it.

However, in 1940, the war having been raging for some months, the "clearance of lofts" was issued, involving the disposal of all contents which might provide fuel for incendiary bombs.

As the junior "office wallah", I was given the job to do this at Basingstoke and almost the first thing I discovered was Tom's missing leg!

I also rummaged through half a century of paper and records, including reports hand-written by my uncle when he was a sergeant at Basingstoke in 1900.

I was ordered to burn everything, which I did in a tar barrel.

Everything went up in smoke, even some deliciously revealing, though completely harmless, revelations about still-serving senior officers.

I saved nothing - and have regretted it ever since!

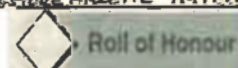
