

Honours for lollipop lady and conservationist

A LOLLIPOP lady from Tadley is one of two local people to have been awarded an MBE in the Queen's Birthday Honours.

Joyce Lambden, a 63-year-old great grandmother, has been helping children safely across Main Road, Tadley, for the last 19 years.

She said it was a "great surprise and a lovely honour".

"I will treasure it for the rest of my life," she added.

The award was made not only for her long years at the crossing, but also for her community work.

Mrs Lambden is vice-chairman of the women's section of the local Royal British Legion, a committee member of the Memorial Hall since 1947, and she also raises money for the Tadley Concert Brass.

She has five children, nine grandchildren, and two great grandchildren—with a third due any day now.

Last February, Mrs Lambden organised a petition in an effort to save Tadley Post Office, right next to her crossing, from closing.

She got around 600 signatures, which she sent off to Post Office Counters and local MPs, but was unable to stop the closure.

Mrs Lambden, who lives at The Green, Tadley, celebrated by having a meal out with her family on Saturday night.

"It's been overwhelming," she said.

And another person celebrating this weekend was Andrew Cleave, who was also made an MBE in the Birthday Honours.

But rather than throwing a party Mr Cleave was doing what he loves best—working as a conservationist at the Bramley Frith Study Centre in Bramley.

That said it was no surprise to learn his MBE was made for his services to environmental education.

A delighted Mr Cleave said: "It was a very pleasant surprise."

"I've still no idea though who nominated me."

Mr Cleave has worked at Bramley Frith for about seven and a half years.

He is jointly employed by Hampshire County Council and National Grid to run the centre.

Various types of conservation work go on there from woodland management to preserving dwindling mammal species like the dormouse.

The emphasis is placed on learning.

"We have a lot of school parties and university students who come here," Mr Cleave said.

"There's always a lot going on."

Council snub for lollipop lady, MBE

A LOLLIPOP lady awarded an MBE in the Queen's Birthday Honours has been snubbed by her own town council.

But she has not heard one word from the council of the town, Tadley, where she has lived for more than 50 years.

In February she found time to organise a 600-signature petition in an (unsuccessful) effort to save Tadley Post Office from closing.

A week ago her third great-grandchild was born in Tadley. She has five children and nine grandchildren.

Chairman of Tadley council Ray Frost said: "Personally, I didn't think about it. It wasn't that important."

"There are lots of people in the town who do tremendous work week in, week out."

"What has she done?" he asked.

Joyce said: "I'm not sur-

prised by the non-reaction of Tadley council.

"I have been overwhelmed by the response of local people, and the children, teachers and governors of Tadley Primary."

In his letter, on behalf of the borough of Basingstoke, Mayor John Greenwood congratulated Joyce and said that the MBE was "a fitting reward" for all the good work she had done over the years.

She also received congratulations from Sir Patrick Brown on behalf of the Transport Secretary.

Every day she is saluted by drivers in Main Road, Tadley, beeping their horns as they pass her crossing point.

Some have wound down their windows to shout out "well done lollipop lady."

Since the award she has appeared on local radio and television.

Lollipop lady's campaign ends with council U-turn

A BATTLING former lollipop lady has won a county council U-turn that means the children of Tadley Primary School will not be left without a school crossing patrol after all.

Earlier this month, the council said it would not advertise for a replacement for Joyce Lambden, who had retired from being the school's lollipop lady after 28 years.

It said the pupils, aged between four-and-a-half and 11, could negotiate the pelican crossing on busy Main Road without help from a lollipop patroller.

However, after a campaign by an angry Mrs Lambden, officers had a change of heart and have now revealed that they will advertise the vacant position after all.

Mrs Lambden, 73, of The Green, Tadley, had written to Hampshire County Council saying she was "absolutely dumbfounded" that she was not to be replaced.

She wrote: "This is one of the most dangerous crossings in Hampshire," and urged: "Don't forget these are children's lives you are dicing with."

She also sent them the results of a traffic survey she had conducted, showing that 665 vehicles travelled along the road between 8.30am and 9.15am on one weekday.

As a result of her letter, the council under-

took its own assessment of vehicles and pedestrians using the crossing - and decided it should have a lollipop person after all.

Richard White, council supervisor for school crossing patrols, said: "It's not our policy to provide school crossing patrollers at pelican crossings but, in light of a recent survey carried out because of Joyce's concerns, we have decided we will advertise the position."

Welcoming the news, Mrs Lambden said: "It's fantastic - I was so worried they weren't going to get anyone. The last 27-and-a-half years have been accident free and I want it to stay like that."

Relieved parent Clive Green, of Pelican Road, Pamber End, has a seven-year-old son Alex at the school who uses the crossing every day.

He said: "Everybody is delighted the council has had a change of heart. Parents have seen cars jump red lights and all sorts of things over the years, and the thought of a six-year-old running into the traffic is horrific."

Borough and town councillor David Leeks said: "It's wonderful news. It's a great Christmas present to the kids and a great start to the new year if they can get someone in soon."

Lollipop MBE retires at last!

**County allays Joyce's fears
- her 'beat' will be covered**

A TADLEY Lollipop lady will be able to enjoy her retirement knowing she will be replaced, after voicing her fears to Hampshire County Council.

Joyce Lambden was the first lollipop lady ever to receive the MBE and has been helping children cross the road to Tadley Community Primary School for more than 27 years.

When she learned the council was not planning to replace her when she retired she wrote to them explaining her fears for children crossing the busy A340.

Now, the council has written back confirming that they will find a replacement to continue Joyce's good work. Joyce, known as lollipop, said: "It worried me because I thought I've done 27 1/2 years and never had an accident happen while I've been there. What worries me most is the emergency services, you've got to give way to them but if the green man is showing for the child they think it's ok to cross."

"I really feel much happier now. It would have broken my heart to think that for 27 years I watched over the kids and there wasn't going to be anyone to do it any more."

And the letter telling Joyce a replacement would be sought was perfectly timed, dropping onto the mat at Joyce's home of 52 years in The Green, on the very day of her retirement.

Joyce says whoever gets the job will find a huge reward in know-

ing they help children get to school safely every day.

She said: "It's a job that's very rewarding. To see children's faces and know they're safe must be a reward in itself."

"I've got mums coming now, that were my little ones. Now they're bringing their children to school and it's lovely."

The school is a huge part of the Lambden family tradition, Joyce herself having attended from 1936-45, and her children having followed in her footsteps.

Her living room is full of chocolates, flowers and trinkets from the children she has helped over the years and Joyce says she will miss being part of the school.

But with two grandchildren and two great grandchildren among the current pupils it is unlikely she will be left out of the loop. Over the years Joyce has helped thousands of children cross the roads and one of them recently returned to teach there.

Obituary

Raymond Lambden 1922-2007

A FORMER Tadley town councillor and D-Day hero has died aged 84.

Raymond Louis Lambden, a town councillor for 24 years, died earlier this month after a long illness.

In the Second World War, Mr Lambden served in the Home Guard before being called up in 1942 to the Royal Berkshire Regiment.

His first action was going ashore early on D-Day morning on Juno Beach at Bernieres-sur-Mer in Normandy, where he lost many comrades in the battle to push back the German defenders.

Later that day, Mr Lambden earned a mention in dispatches for trying to save the life of his severely injured Warrant Officer while under enemy fire.

Before his death, Mr Lambden returned to Normandy on several occasions, the last being the 60th anniversary of the landings in 2004.

After leaving the army in 1946, Mr Lambden went to work for Thornycroft in Basingstoke, where he met his wife Joyce. The couple were married for 57 years.

He then worked at the Atomic Weapons Establishment in Aldermaston, where he remained until retirement in 1987.

Mr Lambden, of The Green, was born in Worting in 1922. When he was six years old his family returned to their roots in Tadley, where Mr Lambden attended Tadley School, now known as Tadley Community Primary School.

Continuing with a family tradition, he joined the local brass band, which at times during the late 1900s had as many as seven members from the Lambden family at once.

Mr Lambden's son Michael said: "Although raising and looking after his family took up a lot of his time he still found time to put something back into the community."

"He served as a Tadley councillor for 24 years in two separate stints, was a gover-

nor at Tadley School, raised money along with his wife for various charities, and also found time to indulge in his lifelong passion for brass bands by playing for Tadley Silver Band and for Tadley Concert Brass.

"In recognition of his contribution and service, he was made honorary vice-president of both bands."

"It pleased him that the brass band family tradition has been maintained with the baton being taken up by his youngest son Andrew and Andrew's daughter Rebekah, who play for Tadley Concert Brass."

"He had a full and varied life. His legacy and memory will live on through his wife, children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren."

Mr Lambden's funeral took place in St Paul's Church, The Green, on Tuesday May 8.
