

TADLEY.

On Tuesday morning last, Mr. John Stacey, of this village, missed two ducks—one drake and one hen—with a brood of young chicken. One of the ducks had also just hatched off 12 young ducks. Mr. Stacey naturally thought that Reynard had paid him a visit, but on a search being made it was found that a neighbour's dog had broken its chain, and had done the mischief. The brood of 12 young ducks were strangely enough solaced the next morning by the appearance of the mother duck among her young. We hear the mischievous dog has since been destroyed.

An Inquest was held on Tuesday last at "The New Inn," Tadley, by Mr. Spencer Clarke, the county coroner, on the body of George Monger, a labourer of Tadley, aged 83 years. Elizabeth West, wife of John West, a labourer said she knew the deceased, and last saw him alive on Saturday afternoon noon in a meadow at Tadley, adjoining the "Fox and Hounds" Inn. He spoke to witness, and said he wanted to sit down in the shade as he had a headache. He stopped there for some time, and then went out into the road. Witness lost sight of him for a little, but soon saw him on the stool at the front of the "Fox and Hounds" Inn. He went to get up and fell down. Witness picked him up, and put him on the stool. Witness found him out on the road afterwards, and washed his face with water. He was alive then and partly sensible.—David Monger, labourer, a son of the deceased, said that about six o'clock last Saturday evening he found his father insensible in the road.—Matthew Cottrell, labourer of Tadley, said he saw George Monger fall down in the road last Saturday evening. Nobody knocked him down. Witness did what he could to help him.—Esther Monger, wife of George Monger, a labourer living at Pamber, said that last Saturday evening she found the deceased helpless in the road. Witness helped to get him home. Witness did not think there was much life in him then. She heard him say "No" while he was by the side of the road.—Dr. Henry Charles Linden, of Tadley, said he did not know the deceased. Last Saturday night he was called to see the deceased, who was in a cart in the Common near to his own house. He was dead when he was taken out of the cart, and had been dead for an hour. Witness examined the body superficially, and found no mark of violence. Witness was of opinion that death was due to a rupture of a vessel on the brain. He did not smell of drink. Verdict—Death from apoplexy.

LONGUEVAL ROAD CEMETERY, Somme, France
F. 11.

Longueval is a village in the Department of the Somme, 11 kilometres east of Albert. Travel north-east from Albert on the D929 in the direction of Bapaume. After 10 kilometres take the D6 in the direction of Martinpuich and follow signs for Longueval. From Longueval crossroads continue in the direction of Maricourt, D197, for 800 metres. Longueval Road Cemetery is situated on the left hand side of the road.

**Historical
Information:**

Longueval was the scene of furious fighting in 1916, lasting from the 14th to the 29th July, when the village was cleared by the 5th Division. It was lost in March 1918, and retaken by the 38th (Welsh) Division and the Carabineers on the 28th August, 1918. Longueval Road Cemetery was begun in September 1915, near a Dressing Station known as "Longueval Alley", or "Longueval Water Point", and it was used until January 1917. Further burials were made in August and September 1918. The graves numbered 171 at the date of the Armistice; and others were added in 1923-24 by concentrations from a wide area round Longueval. There are now over 200, 1914-18 war casualties commemorated in this site. Of these, over one-fifth are unidentified and special memorials are erected to 3 soldiers from the United Kingdom, known or believed to be buried among them. The cemetery covers an area of 1,015 square metres and is bounded by a low red brick wall.

TYNE COT CEMETERY, Zonnebeke, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium
XVIII. A. 3.

Tyne Cot Cemetery is located 9 kilometres north east of Ieper town centre, on the Tynecotstraat, a road leading from the Zonnebeekseweg (N332).

Historical Information:

"Tyne Cot" or "Tyne Cottage" was the name given by the Army to a barn which stood 46 metres West of the level crossing on the Passchendaele-Broodseinde. The barn, which had become the centre of five or six "pill-boxes", was captured by the 2nd Australian Division on the 4th October, 1917, in the advance on Passchendaele. One of these "pill-boxes" was unusually large, and it was used, after its capture, as an Advanced Dressing Station. From the 6th October to the end of March, 343 graves were made, on two sides of it, by the 50th (Northumbrian) and 33rd Divisions and by two Canadian units. From the 13th April to the 28th September it was in enemy hands again, and then it was recaptured, with Passchendaele, by the Belgian Army. The cemetery was enlarged after the Armistice by the concentration of graves from the battlefields of Passchendaele and Langemarck and from a few small burial grounds. It is now the largest Commonwealth War Cemetery in the world. There are now nearly 12,000, 1914-18 war casualties commemorated in this site. Of these, over 8,000 are unidentified and special memorials are erected to 38 soldiers from the United Kingdom, 27 from Canada, 15 from Australia and one from New Zealand, known or believed to be buried among them. Other special memorials record the names of 16 soldiers from the United Kingdom and four from Canada, buried in other cemeteries, whose graves were destroyed by shell fire. The cemetery covers an area of 34,941 square metres and is enclosed by a low flint wall. The Cross of Sacrifice is placed on the original large "pill-box". There are four other "pill-boxes" in the cemetery. The Eastern plots are laid out in the form of a fan, with paths radiating to the Cross; and a high flint wall, 152 metres long, follows their outline on the Eastern edge of the cemetery. This wall carries the names of nearly 35,000 soldiers from the United Kingdom and New Zealand who fell in the Ypres Salient in 1917-18 and whose graves are not known. The following were among the burial grounds from which British graves were moved into Tyne Cot Cemetery: IBERIAN SOUTH CEMETERY and IBERIAN TRENCH CEMETERY, LANGEMARCK, 1,097 metres North of Frezenberg, close to a farm called by the Army "Iberian". These contained the graves of 30 soldiers from the United Kingdom who fell in August-September, 1917, and March, 1918. KINK CORNER CEMETERY, ZONNEBEKE, on the road to Frezenberg, containing the graves of 14 soldiers from the United Kingdom, nine from Canada and nine from Australia, who fell in September-November, 1917. LEVI COTTAGE CEMETERY, ZONNEBEKE, near the road to Langemarck, containing the graves of ten soldiers from the United Kingdom, eight from Canada and three from Australia, who fell in September-November, 1917. OOSTNIEUWKERKE GERMAN CEMETERY, in the village of Oostnieuwkerke, containing the graves of two soldiers from the United Kingdom. PRAET-BOSCH GERMAN CEMETERY, VLADSLOO, in the forest on the road from Kortewilde to Leke. Here were buried six officers of the R.F.C. and R.A.F. who fell in 1917-18. STADEN GERMAN CEMETERY, on the South-

East side of the road to Stadenberg, containing the graves of 14 soldiers from the United Kingdom and ten from Canada who fell in 1915-1917. WATERLOO FARM CEMETERY, PASSCHENDAELE, 543 metres North-East of 's Gravenstafel, containing the graves of ten soldiers from Canada, seven from the United Kingdom and two from New Zealand, who fell in 1917-18. ZONNEBEKE BRITISH CEMETERY No.2, on the road between Zonnebeke and Broodseinde, in which the Germans buried 18 men of the 2nd Buffs and 20 of the 3rd Royal Fusiliers who fell in April, 1915.






