Shock at death of well-known woman

POLICE are investigating after a 49-year-old woman was found dead at her home last week.

Linda Shadwick was discovered by her son John, who is in his 20s, at their home in Giles Court, Tadley, on April 14.

The emergency services were contacted at about 6.10pm. They arrived shortly afterwards and cordoned off the area.

Avril McDonald, Basingstoke police media services officer, said: "Nobody has been arrested or charged and police aren't treating the death as suspicious."

"A post mortem has been carried out but this was inconclusive. Further tests are being carried out to try to establish a cause of death."

A nearby resident, who did not want to be named, said that people in the area had been left shocked by Miss Shadwick's sudden death.

She said: "Nobody really knows what happened - all of a sudden the area was cordoned off. I didn't really know her but it's a sad thing to happen."

Miss Shadwick was well-known around the town and grew up in Tadley. She attended Burnham Copse infant and junior schools and The Hurst Community School, now The Hurst Community College.

David Leeks, who lives in The Copse, went to school with Miss Shadwick.

He said: "She was a lovely woman and my family knew her family for years. I used to bump into her from time to time."

"I used to have to say who I was because she was partially sighted."

"I'm sure this is a difficult time for her family and her son."

George was a quiet and humble man, who touched so many lives. I was privileged to know George for 35 years as a member of Tadley Common Methodist Church, but also as a very good friend. George did not like to be in the limelight, but worked tirelessly in the background in so many ways.

He would faithfully count the collections each week, and act as Covenant Secretary to ensure that the Church received the tax refunds as quickly as possible.

George had a great faith, and this was obvious in class meetings, which he often led. He prepared for the meetings with great dedication and attention to detail. When others led George was often quiet, as was his nature, but when he did speak we had words of insight and wisdom.

For some time I used to transport some of the youngsters to the club, and it was obvious that George had a great rapport with them, and in return was greatly loved.

For many years George and Rosa hosted garden parties to raise funds for St. Michael's hospice, raising hundreds of pounds in the process.

George loved sport, especially West Ham Football Club, and he was also a keen bowls player.

Although George had many interests, the thing that was most important to him, apart from his family, was his faith and he enjoyed singing about his faith as a member of the Proclaim Choir. Even when he received the news of his cancer, his faith remained strong, and he read his Bible regularly and listened to sacred music. He did not wallow in self-pity, but set himself a number of goals to achieve before his death, and as a result has been able to leave some happy memories for Rosa and family, such as a trip on Eurostar from the new St. Pancras Station to Brussels. The final goal that he achieved was to attend the CTAT service, where he was even able to make a speech although he was very ill at the time.



New homes opposition

TADLEY residents turned out in force to make their feelings known about a proposed development.

More than 20 people from Shyshack Lane and the surrounding area attended Tadley Town Council's highways and planning committee on Monday to put forward their objections to plans which would see 10 new homes built on land at 12, 14, 16 and 20 Shyshack Lane.

The proposed development from Touch Properties includes parking, new access and the diversion of a public right of way.

Michael Pleass, of Shyshack Lane, acted as

the residents' spokesman.

He said the development was also too high density and destructive of the rural character. The road access was also dangerous.

Mr Pleass told the meeting: "The extra traffic would have a considerable impact on the area. Children use the lane to get to and from junior and secondary school and it gets very busy. The development would make it even less safe."

Councillor Sue Mullan described the plans as "worse than I imagined". She said there had

been a child fatality along Shyshack Lane a few years ago due to the busy traffic already using the lane at rush hour, and gave her concerns about refuse collection and provision of services to the new site.

After the committee voted against the plans, Councillor Avril Burdett, chairman of Tadley Town Council, said: "The committee is going to make a very strong objection to these plans."

Residents were reminded that they have until Monday, August 14, to submit their comments on the plans to Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council.

Housing plan gets go-ahead despite fears

Development 'would put pressure on road'

CONTROVERSIAL proposals for a housing development in Tadley have been approved, despite fears that this would put more pressure on a route that is already busy with children and young people walking and cycling to schools and a college in the area.

Proposals by Touch Properties to build five new homes, which will involve diverting a right of way, following demolition of 20 Shyshack Lane, were approved by Basingstoke councillors last week.

The development will include four four-bedroom houses and two two-bedroom semi-detached houses.

At a planning meeting of Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council, Warwick Lovegrove (Lib Dem, Tadley North) said that people in the area were very concerned about the development.

He said that Shyshack Lane, which had been an old gravel road about 30 or 40 years ago, was still very narrow with narrow paths, despite being a main route to shops, schools and The Hurst Community College.

He said: "During the rush hour it gets very busy indeed. It's very easy to see an accident happening when children come out of school and push each other around."

Other concerns about the development include its impact on water usage and drains and its entrance on

to Heath End Road where, according to Mr Lovegrove, sightlines were particularly poor.

Speaking on behalf of the applicant, Miss M Broderick said that a traffic survey, carried out between 7.30am and 6.30pm on January 9, showed that there would be a "minimal increase" in traffic following the development, while Thames Water had not raised any objections.

She said that the applicants had taken villagers' concerns into account, and the houses had been reduced in size, their ridge heights had been lowered and they would be placed further away from the rear boundary to avoid close proximity to trees.

A public footpath had also been relocated from the centre to the side of the site and the new footpath, which had a two-metre-wide hard surface, was described by the council's footpaths officer as an improvement. Visitor parking had also been improved, said Miss Broderick.

After the meeting, David Leeks (Ind, Tadley South) said that the Government wanted to increase housing development on brownfield sites and gardens were classed as such.

"This is going to happen more and more in Tadley," he said.

"I'm not against it as long as the road can take it."
