

Drinking binge led to death

A HOMELESS father of two died from acute alcohol poisoning after a drinking binge, an inquest was told.

Thomas Stafford's body was found with an empty bottle of vodka in a wooden shed in Silchester Road, Tadley, by police on December 11.

A Newbury inquest was told Mr Stafford had not been seen since the end of October.

The inquest heard that the married 47-year-old, of no fixed abode, began drinking three years ago but the problems culminated in the last year when he would disappear on binges for days without anyone knowing where he was.

His actions put an enormous strain on his relationship with his wife Linda - causing their separation - his mother and his three brothers.

Speaking at the inquest, Mr Stafford's elder brother Allan spoke about the family's anguish at coping with Thomas's drink problem.

He said: "He lived with my wife and me for six months because

his wife did not want him in the house.

"I got him into a clinic in Basingstoke and used to breathe him every day to make sure he wasn't drinking."

Mr Stafford, of Warwick Road, Winklebury, told the inquest his brother appeared to get better but would then lapse. He also described how his brother would hide his drinking.

"He would tell Linda he was going to work but would go off drinking, making sure he was back at night," said Mr Stafford.

"He lived with my mother three times but was secretly drinking and had it hidden under his bed."

Mr Stafford said Thomas's behaviour began affecting his mother's health, resulting in him being admitted to a clinic.

He said: "We just could not cope anymore. He was not like our brother."

The inquest was told Mr Stafford was last seen alive on October 31 when he spent the night in a lorry at his wife's house in Tadley.

Dr Robert Menai Williams,

consultant pathologist at the Royal Berkshire Hospital in Reading, said he had taken blood for an alcohol analysis and found 500 milligrams of alcohol per one millilitre of blood.

He said: "There was a massive quantity of alcohol in the body. In my experience, this amount is uniformly lethal."

Recording a verdict of accidental death, Newbury coroner Charles Hoile said: "His drinking condition was not only his problem but his family's and I am quite satisfied they did everything expected, if not more than was expected, of them."

"He died of acute alcohol poisoning. There is no evidence that he intended to take his own life."

After the inquest, Allan Stafford's wife Belinda said: "Each of us will always question if we could have done more. But we could not cope with his drinking. It is a tragic end."

"He was liked by a lot of people and it is really sad that he chose to isolate himself through his drinking."

The couple went on to have four children - Colin, Trevor, Barbara and Sheila, who still live in the area.


The Stones are now looking forward to celebrating their anniversary with family, including their seven grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Chatterbox Jim is a tonic for the patients

TAKING the time to talk to people and cheer them up has earned a self-confessed chatterbox this week's Good Citizen Award.

Twice a week for the past four years, Jim Stowell, of Coronation Road, Basingstoke, has visited patients at the town's district hospital.

He starts at F floor and works his way down, talking and joking with anyone who fancies a gossip or needs perking up.

Jim said: "I like to chat a lot and I try to help people by talking."

Not only does Jim have a yarn with patients—every fortnight he sings hymns to the older ones.

He was nominated by his son Paul, who felt his father's regular visits to the sick should be recognised.

Jim was inspired by the Share Volunteer Group, which four years ago provided an assistant when his wife Maria was terminally ill with leukaemia.

"The volunteer really helped us and made things easier for my wife," said Jim.

Realising the role a friendly and sociable person could play in helping unwell people, Jim started his hospital visits.

His four years of unselfish work were praised by Share Volun-

teer co-ordinator Dorothy Bates.

"I think any visitors in hospital decrease the feeling of isolation and are a breath of fresh air from the outside world," she said.

"Not every patient has visitors."

Jimmy Stowell

A BASINGSTOKE man died on holiday in the Italian town where he met his late wife.

Jimmy Stowell, 78, of Coronation Road, South View, Basingstoke, died on May 14 after a heart attack in Sorrento, near Naples.

He used to make regular trips to Naples to see relatives and revisit the area where he spent much time during the war.

Following the death of Jim's wife, Maria, in October, 1988, he began to look for additional things to occupy his time.

It was suggested he might like to consider becoming a hospital visitor.

In 1992, he was given The Gazette Good Citizen award, by which time he had become affectionately known as "Chatterbox Jim".

Jim was born Arthur James Stowell at Barnstaple and

moved to the Pamber area when his father became chauffeur to the Wyndham-Knight family.

He was awarded the Africa Star and First Army Clasp. His African service was followed by a spell in Italy, where he met Maria Verde.

She and her sister were playing the song White Christmas in English at their grandmother's house and Jim and two other soldiers stopped to listen at the window. They were invited in

and became regular visitors. After a year of courtship, Jim applied to his unit for permission to marry.

He was refused but a year later permission was granted, a staff car was made available and the best man was Jim's commanding officer, Lord Roderick Gordon.

Jim brought Maria to England and became a fireman at CAD, Bramley, before transferring to AWE Aldermaston, where he was employed as a storeman.

In 1985, he was awarded the Imperial Service Medal.

Jim did not lose touch with his Italian relations and spent time improving his Italian.

He leaves two sons, Paul and Peter, and grandchildren.


He will be remembered as a modest, caring man, particularly by many patients he chatted with at Basingstoke hospital.

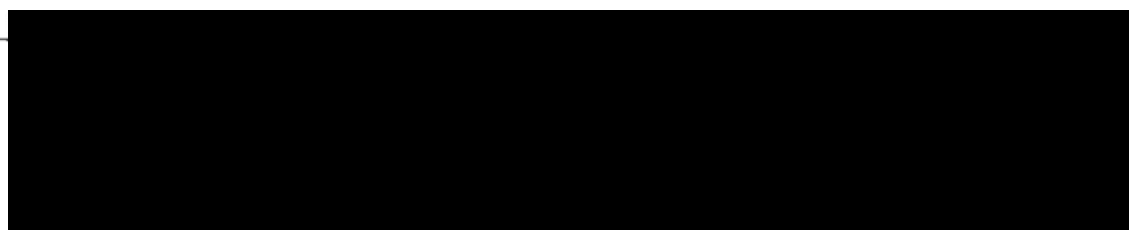
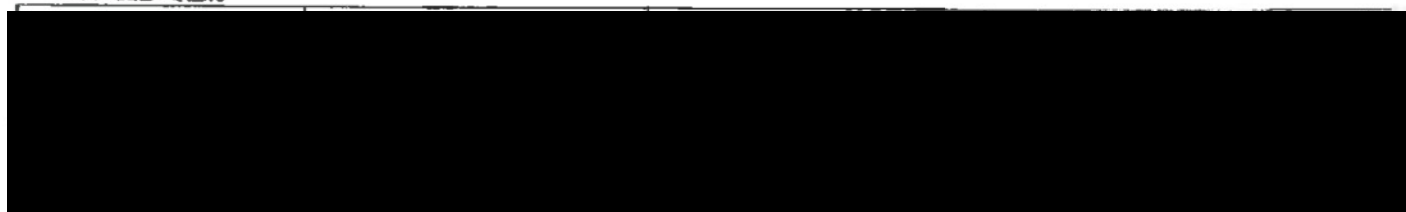

ALLOTMENTS FOR THE LABOURING POOR

Allotments for the Labouring Poor is a registered charity and is the only provider of allotments in Tadley which are found at Rowan Road and by Hylton Court off Giles Road. There are allotments available at both sites and if anyone is interested they should contact the Warden, Ted Finch on 981 2146. The fees are £5 per year.

The proceeds are invested by the above Charity and cannot be touched, but the income generated after expenses incurred running the allotments can be used for 'Relief of Need' for the people of Tadley. This doesn't mean that you have to be poor or destitute, but may be in need of short-term assistance following an accident, bereavement or loss of employment. Perhaps to meet travel costs to hospital or clinic, or to purchase a piece of equipment which is otherwise not available through State assistance.

Any monies granted (in complete confidence) are decided on by the trustees of the Charity working within its rules as overseen by the Charity Commission. If you know of anyone who may benefit from this please contact Chris Spence on 981 4967.

From the Vicar

This will be my last contribution to the Review as Vicar of St. Mary's Church. I have looked back to the first letter that I wrote in the issue for January, 1972. My wife Betty and I had arrived from Farnworth, near Bolton, in mid December with our two daughters Janice and Clare. I commented then how quickly the Vicarage had become 'home' for us, little realising at the time, it would continue to be so for close on fifteen years. The Churchwardens at the time were Peggy Allmark and Steve Edgecombe, and I'm glad to say they are still here with us as active members of the church.

In that same issue of the Review, I commented that my first public duty was to share in the local Council of Churches Carol Service in St. Michael's R.C. Church. That was the occasion when I first met Father John Birch and the Rev. Clive Pugh, whose friendship I greatly valued in the early years. One is tempted to assess what progress there has been ecumenically over the years: perhaps visibly, not a great deal. May I be permitted to say, I have always given our local council of churches my support, and have been chairman for a number of years. I'm glad to tell you that Tony Flynn, a member of our church, is to be the next chairman, so maintaining the support St. Mary's has given to the council over the years. Alan Wyles is our other representative, and we do need a third person to replace Ben Flenley, who is now a student at Salisbury & Wells Theological College, training for the ordained ministry of the church.

When I came to St. Mary's it was still a Conventional District, that is, a district separated from other parishes (in our case, areas of the ancient parishes of Aldermaston, Baughurst and Tadley.) It became legally a separate parish by an Order in Council signed by the Queen at a meeting of her Privy Council on 13th March, 1973. As a consequence of this order, I became the first Incumbent, whereas previously, I and my two predecessors, Michael Simcock and Tony Outhwaite, had been licensed as priests in charge. Over the years the membership of the church has changed, as the population of the parish has changed, and increased too, with the building of more houses. And if the latest Tadley town plan is put into effect, most of the proposed house building programme will take place in North Tadley, with a consequent increase in population.

Plans have been sought and accepted by the Parochial Church Council, and fund raising has commenced, for the improvement of the hall accommodation, by way of extension into the car park, and the upgrading of some of the facilities it provides. This is but one stage of an overall plan for the future. To plan and prepare for an expansion of the life of the church in its work and witness must surely be right.

The choice of my successor is in the hands of the Bishop of Winchester, who is the Patron of the parish, and he will in due time make an appointment after consultation with the churchwardens. So we need to pray for the guidance of God in this choice of a man who will be both pastor and leader of the church in St. Mary's Parish, North Tadley.

It remains for me to thank all the many of you, who have shown regard and affection for Betty and I and our family over the almost fifteen years, God bless you all.
