## Mach 2 career for Adrian

A FLIGHT of fancy for one Tadley man became reality after he was awarded the prestigious honour of captaining Concorde.

Adrian Thompson, from Church Road, Tadley, has just completed the gruelling six month training conversion course needed to take control of the flagship of British Airways.

Mr Thompson, 47, a professional pilot for nearly 28 years, is ecstatic at being given the chance to take control of the most famous passenger jet in the skies today.

He said: "Concorde was light years ahead of the competition when first built, and is still in a class of its own. My ambition has always been to captain this jet and feel privileged to finally get the chance."

He added: "Apparently there are more US Astronauts than there are Concorde pilots, which is quite an interesting statistic."

The prospect of an alternative occupation away from flying has never entered the equation for the former Burnham Copse junior school pupil, who first sat in a cockpit at 16.

After leaving Queen Mary's grammar school in Basingstoke, which is now the Vyne, Mr Thompson gained a place on a professional pilot training course.

After graduation he was one of the youngest professional pilots in the country—just pipped to the post by a fellow course member only two months younger.

Mr Thompson said: "I simply love flying, the thought of testing my skills and seeing so much of the world."

"I do feel very proud about my new posting. There are a lot of Jumbo pilots but very few Concorde pilots."

Concorde can fly from London to New York in just three hours and 20 minutes, blitting conventional passenger jet times of just under eight hours.

# BACK IN THE SKY

A BRITISH Airways pilot from Tadley was one of the first to take Concorde back to the skies after this week's horrific crash which claimed 113 lives.

Adrian Thompson spoke of his shock over the devastating crash involving an Air France Concorde on Tuesday.

But Adrian, **pictured left**, of Church Road, said he had no qualms about flying the supersonic plane and was in a Concorde cockpit for a London to New York flight on Wednesday evening.

Speaking before the flight, Adrian, who is married and has a teenage daughter, said: "I am bound to be concerned. The crash

is in the back of my mind but it does not put me off flying Concorde. "Obviously, my wife is worried but I have got no fears over flying."

Adrian has been a British Airways pilot for 31 years and became one of the elite few to fly a Concorde aircraft more than four-and-a-half years ago.

But nothing could prepare him for the moment he saw the pictures of this week's tragic crash in Paris.

He said: "My brother phoned me and told me to switch on the television."

"I was shocked when I saw what happened. It really made me feel dreadful. I could not believe it

because it is such a safe aeroplane. "I have never seen such a jet of flames coming out of the rear of an aeroplane before and I am appalled that everyone lost their lives."

British Airways cancelled all of their Concorde flights on Tuesday evening after the Air France Concorde plummeted into a hotel just minutes after leaving Charles de Gaulle airport.

Adrian said: "I think they only cancelled the flights on Tuesday night out of a mark of respect, not because there is any concern over the safety of the planes."

Service was resumed the following day with all four Concorde flights between London and New York keeping to their normal schedule.

A spokesperson for BA said: "All Concorde flights are operational as normal. We have complete confidence in their operational ability. "We believe there is no technical, safety or operational evidence to suggest that we should not fly."

With the wreckage and debris being cleared and thorough investigations and inquiries now being launched to establish how the disaster occurred, Adrian said lessons will be learned from the tragedy.

He said: "When it is known what caused the accident there is no question that the pilots will be briefed."

"There will be lessons to be learned from it and we will practice on an simulator to find ways of dealing with such a catastrophic situation."





# Concorde pilot enjoys his new-found fame

**TADLEY Concorde pilot Adrian Thompson has become something of a local hero in his hometown.**

The Tadley Gazette revealed four weeks ago that Captain Thompson was to fly the last Concorde from Heathrow to New York. And since the historic flight last Thursday, his feet have barely touched the ground.

The quiet-spoken family-man, from Church Road, has been asked to give talks to school pupils, switch on the town's Christmas lights and sign everything from photos to plaster casts.

Capt Thompson said: "I feel quite honoured. I didn't realise I was that much of a celebrity. It's all good fun, and it's nice to go out on a high. But it won't last, so I will just enjoy it while it does."

"It's amazing how much atten-

tion the Concorde gets. It's certainly taken me by surprise."

Concorde enthusiasts and stamp collectors have been appealing to Captain Thompson in droves for his signature, and the Captain has been asked to sign a plaster cast, pictures of himself, and hundreds of Concorde-themed stamps.

Internet Stamps Ltd has also asked Capt Thompson (**right**) to sign 500 stamp covers, and the company has said it will pay the Captain £2 a signature.

This, together with 170 signatures for a local stamp society, has raised more than £1,000 in cash, which Capt Thompson said he would like to donate to a local charity, although he has not yet decided which one.

Capt Thompson said: "At the moment my signature seems to be

in demand, and I want the money to help local people."

At the end of next month Captain Thompson will also turn on the town's Christmas lights, and he has been asked to give talks about his Concorde days at The Hurst Community College and Burnham Copse Junior School.

But his new-found fame is underpinned by sadness with the loss of commercial Concorde flights.

He said: "I am still a bit down about it all. I thought it was ridiculous me feeling so down, but everyone involved with Concorde is."

Capt Thompson turned down the chance to fly as a passenger on a Concorde delivery flight to Manchester, the final resting place for one of the fleet, today.

He said: "I don't think I could face it. I have said my goodbyes to Concorde."

ERIC SWANTON TIPLADY commonly known to all of his many friends as just plain "Eric" or "Eric Tip"

Born in October 1923 being the second oldest in a family of four children, Eric grew up in the "city" area of Cambridge (now known as "the Grafton") and first went to Brunswick School and then to the newly opened Chesterton Secondary School where he made a name for himself in the sporting arena.

Cricket was his main sporting interest and it was in this game that he excelled

He was chosen by the County to play for Cambridgeshire Schoolboys at the home of English cricket at Lords in London and in that match he was the top scorer - no mean achievement for a young lad in those days just before World War II.

This is in fact the County Cap (show cap) he obtained at that time and here is a photo (show Photo) of Eric wearing it which will be available for those of you who would like to see it later

Eric started work at the University Press but on reaching the age of 18 was enlisted into the Army in which he served for 5 years. He was involved in the D. Day landings and fought in France Belgium and into Germany

On his demob Eric decided he did not want an inside job - he enjoyed being in the open air and being involved with sport and this ( not surprisingly) took him to work as an Assistant Groundsman at Trinity Hall College in Storeys Way where he continued to be employed (attaining the post of Head Groundsman) until his retirement in 1989

In 1960 the family moved home to live in Newnham and it was around this time that I first met "Eric Tip" when he joined the Newnham Croft S & S C (then called Newnham Institute") of which I was also a member. He got me playing Snooker - a game at which he was very adept - and in fact gave to me my Snooker cue which I still have to this day

Eric was a staunch and enthusiastic Club member and when I became Club Secretary and Treasurer in 1969 I persuaded him to join our Committee. He was a Committee Member and Games Secretary for many years and was much supportive when the Club embarked on a programme of structural alterations and general improvements. He later served as one of the Club's Trustees

His popularity with all Club Members was never in doubt and was there for all to see when he walked into the Club. A prime example of this was when one year at an Annual General Meeting it was necessary to have a ballot for the election of Committee Members. Out of total of 188 votes cast Eric received 187.....I said to him afterwards .."you must feel very satisfied with that result" to which he replied in his usual dry sense of humour .. "I'm not so sure..there must be one person in this Club that doesn't like me"

Our sincere thoughts and prayers go out this day to Eric's brother Edwin and to his sisters Joan and Maureen with whom he has lived all his life, not forgetting of course, his dear and close friend Mary. I know his loving and caring friendship with Mary was something very special and I am sure helped him through his last few difficult years

Dear Mr Everard,

Thank you for your letter of the 13th November, which I have found most interesting.

With reference to John Treacher, blacksmith, I cannot possibly enlighten you in respect to the location of his forge. However, I can give you some information concerning the lands he held in the vicinity - which must, I would have thought, included his forge.

The owners of the meadow at Town's End, Baughurst (which is the site of the Quaker burial ground that was attached to Baughurst House during the 17th and 18th centuries) had believed - mistakenly - that they were the owners of a former Quaker meeting-house. This was because the third meeting-house was located near a forge. Yet, their house (known as 'Forgefields') is miles away from the third meeting-house. There were often a number of forges within a small radius in such rural communities as Baughurst and Wolverton. Town's End, by the way, is within a short distance from Wolverton Park. I have no idea who the present owners of Forgefields are, as my work was written seven years ago. They would not be able to help you with your query, as their house had nothing at all to do with John Treacher.

According to the 1839 tithe map and apportionment for Baughurst, Treacher held five properties along the western edge of the turnpike road to Newbury, immediately between Upper Farm to the north and West View Farm to the south - there is a mistake in the book (p. 243, Buller's Farm should read Upper Farm). Treacher himself occupied three of the five properties; another was occupied by Charles Jacobs, labourer, and the other by Hannah Hedges, independent. These properties were owned by John Bishop, surgeon of Kingsclere, in 1827, according to the enclosure of Inhurst and Ham. Obviously, Treacher bought the lands at some time between 1827 and 1839.

To the north of his five properties, Treacher also occupied Upper Farm, the chapel house and all the lands north to Buller's Farm, under James Adnams, the owner. Also, on the opposite side of the road - in the parish of Tadley - he owned and occupied another four plots of land, plus another, which was occupied by William Hedges. Then, he also owned and occupied Meadow Cottage, to the south-west, which was the only property he held as tenure of the Manor of Manydown. The properties within the parish of Baughurst, excluding Meadow Cottage, would have come under the Manor of Inhurst, which, in turn, was held

by the Duke of Wellington, as part of his Wolverton Estate. Wellington's estate records are at the University of Reading, but I cannot be certain if the court rolls for the manors of Wolverton, Inhurst and Ham are contained therein. Nevertheless, I would suspect that there were records of Treacher's holdings under the Manor of Inhurst - although he might have purchased his properties as freehold.

His one property within the Manor of Manydown - that is, Meadow Cottage - is something I can speak about with authority, for I have spent years extracting data from the records concerning that manor. To date, I have all the records of the properties from 1477 until 1863, and later, and would hope that one day I could finish the research (records start in 1300). The problem is time, and to write up the information would fill about twelve volumes.

However, the Manor of Manydown covered the parishes of Wootton St Lawrence, Baughurst and Hannington. Since the sixteenth century it was held by the Dean and Chapter of Winchester Cathedral. In 1861 the Ecclesiastical Commissioners were established, and in 1863 they took over Manydown. By that time, a great number of copyholds had been enfranchised (turned into freeholds and sold off). The last records concerning Baughurst as part of Manydown are mainly dated 1863. By that time the Duke of Wellington had purchased many properties in that parish and had joined them to his Wolverton Estate.

Meadow Cottage (numbered 93 on the Manydown schedule) was formerly part of the lands belonging to Baughurst House. There was no cottage there originally, as it was entitled "a certain piece of coppice ground containing about two acres called Clarke's Peate". In 1810 it was separated from Baughurst House and sold to Joseph Taylor for £45. Taylor obviously built the cottage there.

The original tenant and heir were retained under Taylor as the proprietor. The tenant was William Harris, who was in possession of Baughurst House, and his heir was his daughter, Mary Adams.

In 1814 Joseph Taylor sold Meadow Cottage to John Treacher, blacksmith of Baughurst, for £45. Treacher nominated himself as the third life in the tenure of the property after Harris and Mary Adams. Treacher was then aged 32, according to the court roll entry.

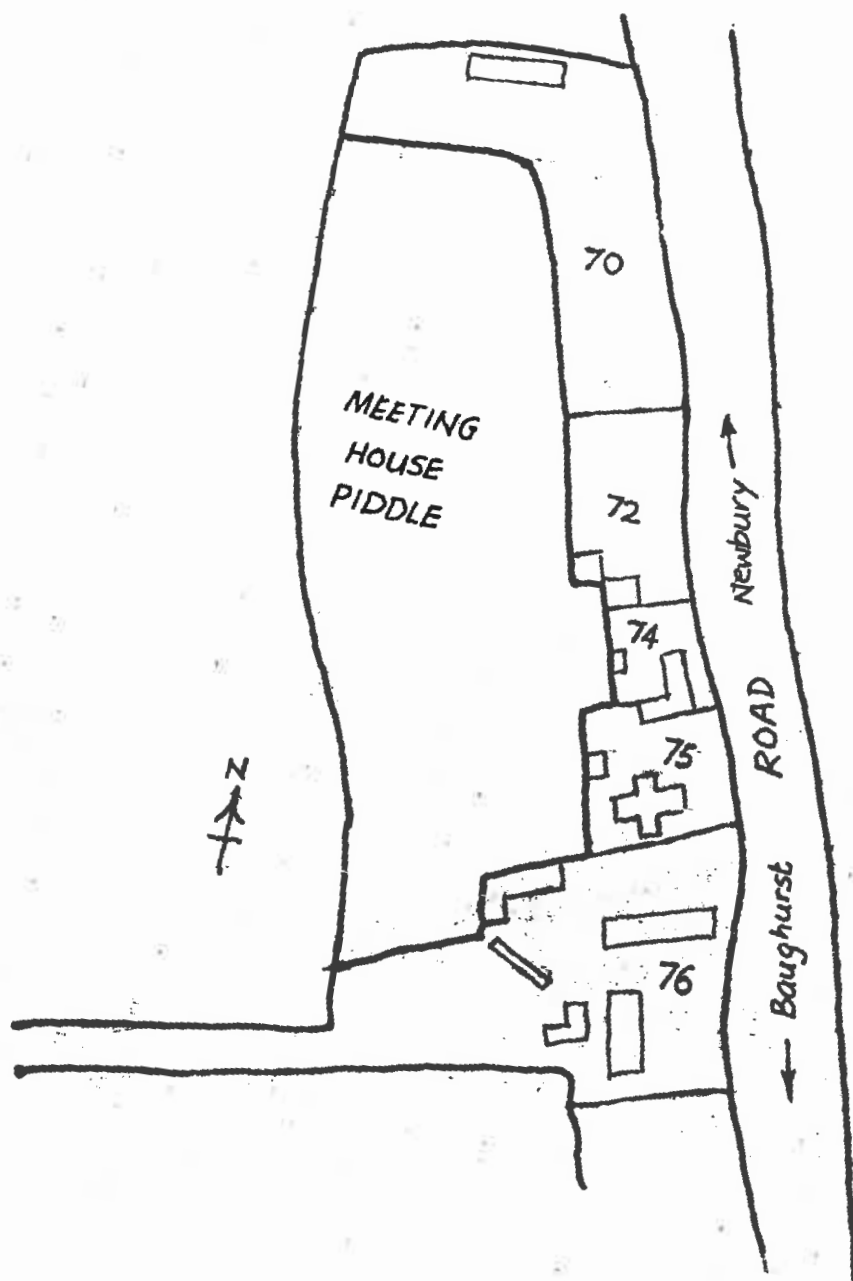
William Harris died in Reading in 1817, and his daughter became the tenant under Treacher. In 1824 the court roll states that Treacher nominated his own daughter, Jane Treacher, as the third life. She was then aged 12.

Mary Adams died in 1828, and John Treacher became the manorial tenant as well as the proprietor. In 1847 Treacher nominated his son, George Treacher, aged 21, as the third life.

John Treacher died in 1851. He was then recorded as a "labourer". His daughter, Jane, was admitted as tenant in possession. David Treacher, aged 12, the son of Harriet Treacher of Baughurst, was nominated as the third life.

Jane Treacher died in 1861, and George Treacher, recorded as "husbandman of Baughurst" was admitted as tenant by virtue of his copy of the court roll dated 1847. The estate was then sold to Harriet Treacher, spinster of Baughurst, for £50. The situation in 1863, when the Church Commissioners took over, was that Harriet Treacher was proprietress of Meadow Cottage, with George Treacher the tenant and David Treacher his heir in that property.

1839 TITHE MAP.

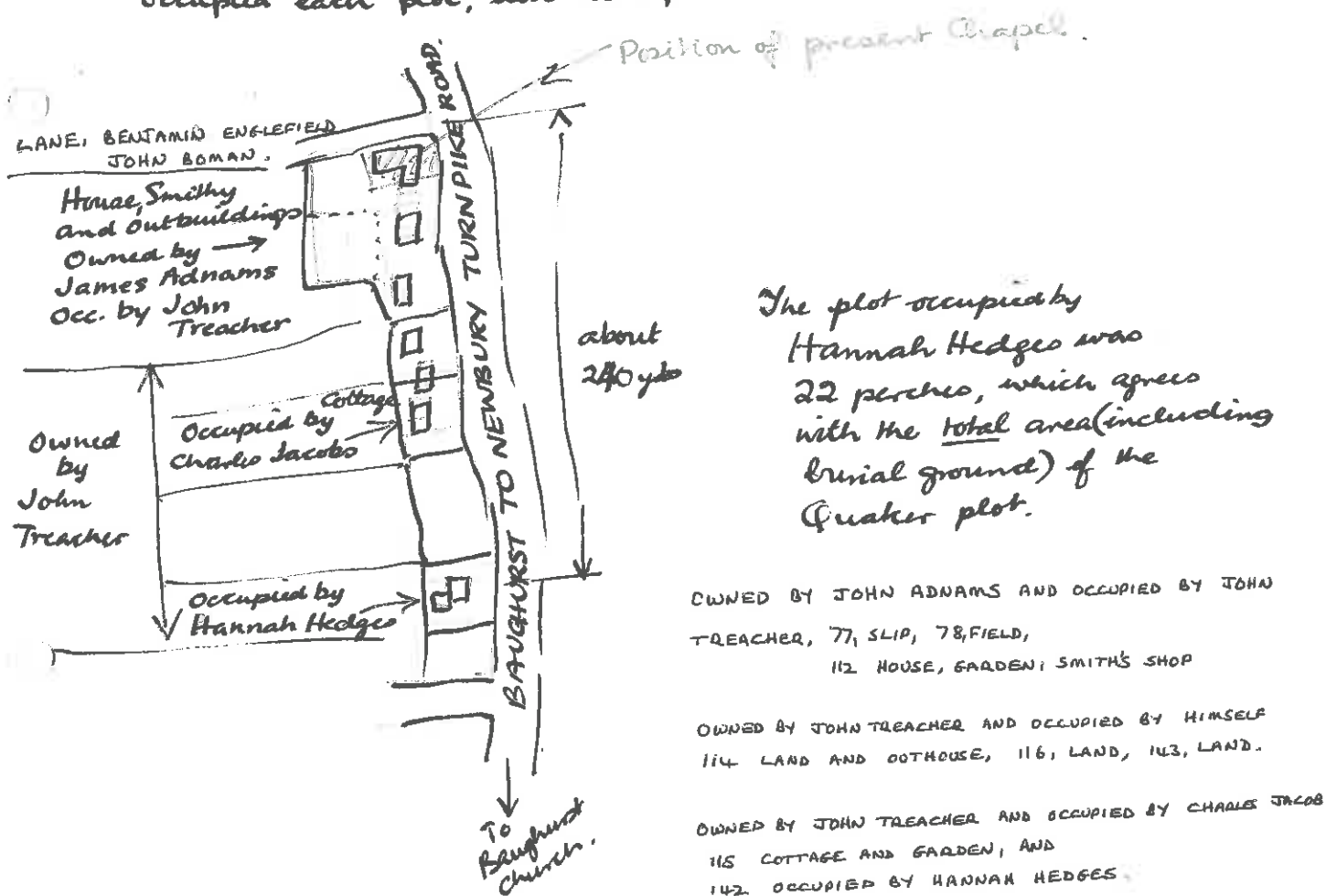

## LOCATION OF 1727 QUAKER MEETING HOUSE (BAUGHURST)

### The Case for Plot 74

In his book "James Potter (Quaker)" (Sessions Book Trust 1992) Mr. K. Smallbone concludes that the 1727 Meeting House was situated where "Rose Cottage" now stands - a site numbered 72 on the 1839 Tithe Map, where one Sam. Thorngate, a baker, lived in an earlier cottage.

I think a better case, though not conclusive, can be made for Plot 74, adjoining the southern edge of Plot 72.

Consider the following details from the Tithe Award:

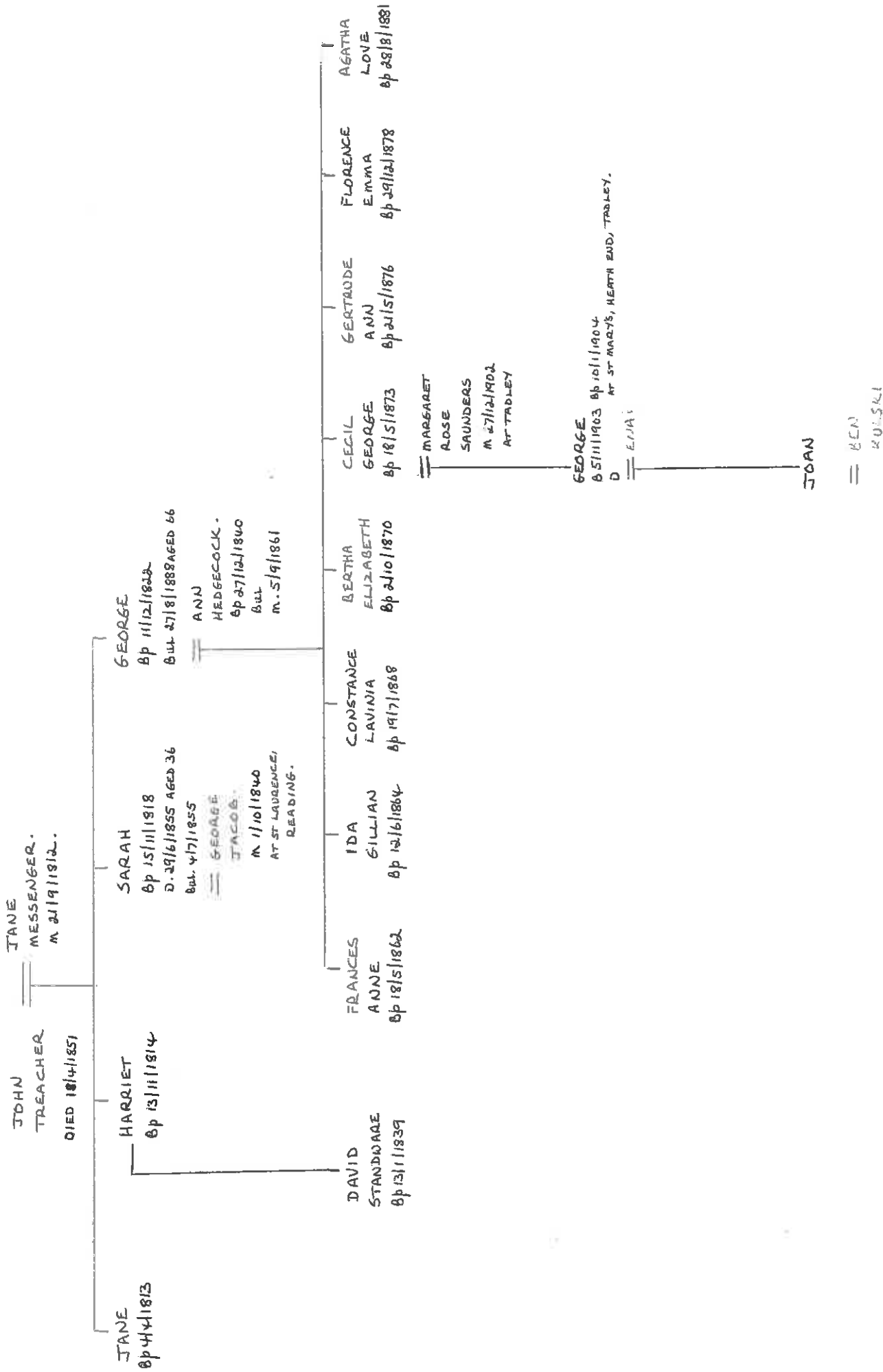

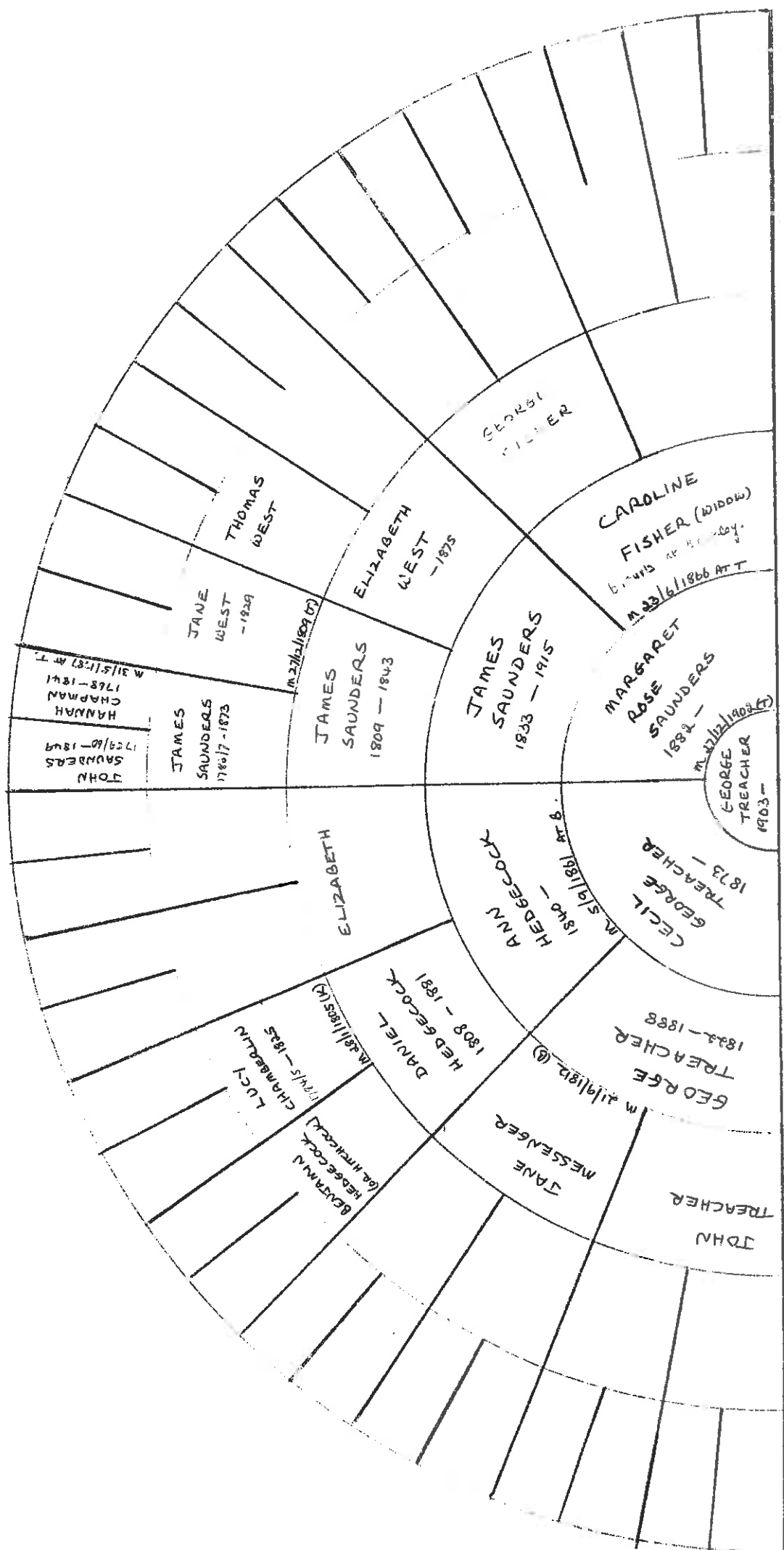
- (A) Plots 74 and 75 are both owned by the same man. The deed of sale of the meeting house in 1808 is preserved among the old deeds of the Chapel House (Plot 75) which could well happen if the deeds were held in common.
- (B) The Meeting House site occupied 14-15 poles. Site 74 is very nearly equal to this, and may be exactly equal if one allows for the fact ("James Potter" P.242) that a roadside ditch lying outside the property in 1727 had by 1835 been filled in and incorporated into the property
- (C) Thorngate occupied the property adjoining the north side of Plot 74, as was thus recorded in the 1835 Quaker Schedule of Deeds. ("James Potter" Pp. 242-3).

I started to type this reply when I received your first email but have been so busy I had to leave it. Now I will add a little more to it.

Dear Iris,

Great to hear from you. My first question is would you like me to send you some additional information which I have been given from other people? Some of this info seems to link in with the trees you sent me and I thought you might keep a copy on file in case you have queries from other researchers. So I'd like to contribute if you are collecting info on folk in the Tadley & nearby villages.

The info you and Derek gave me has helped track down my David Tull's birth and christening. The 1841 census gave David's age as 78, (kind of the enumerator for not rounding it down to 75) David was incorrectly transcribed as a cordwinder, he was a cordwainer. I am fairly certain that these are his details:-

RG4/ 301 David, son of John and Mary Tull. Born 23rd December 1764, at Padworth Hatch Berks. Was baptised 16th January 1765 at Lower Meeting House-Independent, Newbury. I've asked a friend to get this film info printed out on paper for me.

On the trail of David's parents, there are 6 couples with the name John & Mary Tull from around that era & from not too far afield.

Among the trees you sent me you have Henry Tull + 2nd wife Sarah Batchelor m. 20.11.1756. I am incredibly curious to know if Henry's brother John bp 26.10.1729 is the one who married Mary Batchelor??? It wouldn't be the first time that brothers have married sisters, also you probably noticed that both marriages occurred in the same year. And as Richard Harmsworth was a witness for both marriages I guess there is a fair chance that John & Henry were brothers.

Considering some of my Tull ancestors were at Tadley & Mortimer I think you might agree that it would be a logical process is to eliminate the Tadley John Tull & Mary (Batchelor?) as possible parents for David first, before investigating the other couples. I am wondering, would you please be able to verify whether this Tadley marriage (below) for John & Mary could be the right parents for my David Tull? Or perhaps suggest how I could ascertain the answer?

A while ago, another Tadley Tull researcher kindly gave me all the marriages, deaths and burials from St Peter's, Tadley. However, Mark doesn't live in/near Tadley.

I find it very interesting that there is a connection between my  
David's tree and Daniel's tree via David's grandson David Hawkins  
marrying Mary Anne Tull(West). So it seems obvious that these two  
families knew each other as they were married nearly two years prior  
to my David's death in 1850. I still have a hunch that my David and  
Daniel Snr are brothers or cousins. I can't find any parents for

Perhaps that would give me any more information about their families. As there weren't any Tadley baptisms for John & Mary, and as David was born in Padworth Hatch then I will search further afield for his siblings (if there were any). Seems Richard Harmsworth was a very busy chap!

I am too far away from English resource repositories to check will calendars, but as you say it is unlikely that there was a will. It's worth keeping in mind to ascertain sometime. How would I obtain tythe maps for the Tadley/ Mortimer area?

Have you ever been to Aus? Thank you for sharing more about your family and your holiday. That would have been interesting for you, mixing in with George's family. I think I've heard of Hayling Is. before, both of my Grandmothers used to live at Gosport. My parents and sisters were all born in England, I was born in Sydney. My first trip to England was in 1971 we were there nearly 3 yrs before returning to Aus. We stayed in Gosport for a while then went to Titchfield nr Fareham (which I'm sure you know of) then we lived at Whitby for a couple of years. Dad was a Coast Guard at Whitby. I had a solo trip to the UK in 1981 & again in 2000. I wish I could go back again soon. You are doing really well with your emails! When I made the trees I somehow managed to omit the marriage of John Tull and Mary Batchelor and feel sure that John would have been Henrys brother. We dont have Baptisms for Sarah or Mary Batchelor at Tadley, but they could well have been sisters. There are no Tadley Baptisms for children of John and Mary Tull so am not sure how you could confirm that your David was their son unless there was a will, although not many people made them in those days as they were too poor to have anything to leave to their children. You mentioned Richard Harmsworth being a witness at the marriages of Henry and John, but as he witnessed most Tadley marriages this would not have been a clue. Think he must have been the Church Warden. I would be pleased with any other Tull info that could be added to what I already have for future reference. Sorry to hear that you are not close to your sisters. I am an only



child and have an only child. George is the youngest of a family of 11, but he is now the only one living. Hayling Island is near Portsmouth on the south coast. Hope to hear from you again soon, love from Iris.

Hello Iris,

Very many thanks for your letter and all the info that arrived in the post. Sorry, for the delay in replying but I thought I would leave this until we had looked at the Tadley film again down at the Family History Centre.

To explain Bill descends from Frances Welch bap 02/03/1803 Tadley. She married Moses Richardson 21/07/1823 at Tadley. Unfortunately, the film of the Tadley Parish Register omits completely the name of the bride of Moses (our then line of research) so we had to obtain the film of the Bishops Transcripts which fortunately gave her name! Our interest is the Welch blood line. Although, David West and Ann Holdaway are outside this line I am grateful for all the info you sent as it does clarify what would otherwise be a very confusing situation. To add to your chart for the Welch family we did find a baptism for a Fanny Welch 07/07/1799 of Henry & Sarah. We are a bit baffled on this one as Fanny is another name for Frances and we couldn't find a death before the 1803 Frances. As all the Welch family linked up we suspected that the Hannah Welch bur 13/01/1841 would link so we obtained a copy of her Death Certificate. She was the Wife of George Welch.

Now the Tulls. We found most of the entries that you have on your chart but we had not connected them. I agree that Richard Junior was probably the son of Richard Senior and we think that he might have been the eldest and thus named after his father. This would make sense then surmising that Junior was born before the family moved into the area. We couldn't find the baptism of the Sarah bap 19/08/1759 - the film we viewed finished at July 1759 and started again at 1761 so we think a page was missed during filming. However, I don't think we can be sure that this is the Sarah that married Henry Welch as there is another Sarah Tull that was the base born daughter of Mary bap 16/10/1857.

We are uneasy with your connections of all the Marys. Your chart shows that Richard married two Marys and has a daughter Mary by the first wife and another daughter Mary by the second wife. You have the 1<sup>st</sup> Mary as buried 03/06/1722 (no baptism date) and the second Mary bap 19/03/1722. This therefore means that there were two Marys around as the first one was buried after the baptism of the second one. Our feeling is that the burial date belongs to the second Mary thus making an infant death (as was Elizabeth) and hence the reason for mentioning "daughter of Richard" in the records. This leaves the 1<sup>st</sup> Mary as the mother of the base born child and I don't think that this Mary fits into this chart at all. It could be that she was sent away to have the child.

Next, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Mary baptised 19/03/1722. If Richard's first wife died in 1721 it is unlikely that she was the Mother. Mary Miller according to your chart married Richard 21/06/1722 so unlikely that she was the Mother because the child would have been base born and thus a Miller. I therefore wonder whether Miller was the Mary that was Richard's second wife.

We have noticed several Tulls whilst going through parish registers in other areas so obviously a far more common name than initially expected. We will now keep an eye open specifically for a Richard marrying a Mary c1721/1722.

I hope you don't mind me questioning your connections but hope that you will see that I am just trying to make sense of it.
