



Sparky turns out the light on 40-year career

ELECTRICIAN Geoff Wheeler could be forgiven for tripping the light fantastic as he looks forward to a well-earned retirement.

Geoff - a well-known figure in Basingstoke - is finally throwing the switch on his career after more than four decades in business.

In 1962, Geoff was a self-employed electrician, operating from his parents' garage. Having borrowed £50 to buy a van, he had to make his new business a success.

In just four years, Geoff was trading from his first shop, upgrading to a second, larger premises in 1970 where he established a lighting showroom alongside the electrical contracting business.

He spent his last five years trading out of a facility in Coronation Road.

Geoff, 66, said: "During the time I was at work, we did some really big projects including engineering all the lighting at Wilton House, near Salisbury, for the pre-marriage party of Prince Charles and Lady Diana."

Now that Geoff has retired, the business will carry on with the same staff, and even the same name. The only difference will be the new bosses.

Geoff, who lives at Aldermaston, is looking forward to spending more time with his wife, two children and four grandchildren.

He will also be dedicating more time to watching and working with films - his lifelong passion. "I have loved films ever since I had an 8mm cine camera as an apprentice electrician. I have built up a huge collection of eight, 16 and 35mm films in the intervening years."

Twice a year, Geoff helps to organise the film festival "Big Screen Time" at the William Penny Theatre in Aldermaston. The next event, on April 20, will incorporate an amateur film competition called "Ten Best" which is expected to attract entries from

all over Britain as well as from Europe and the Middle East.

Geoff will also be extremely busy buying, cleaning, editing and selling films, a hobby that pays for itself, as well as watching them in the cinema he has created at his house.

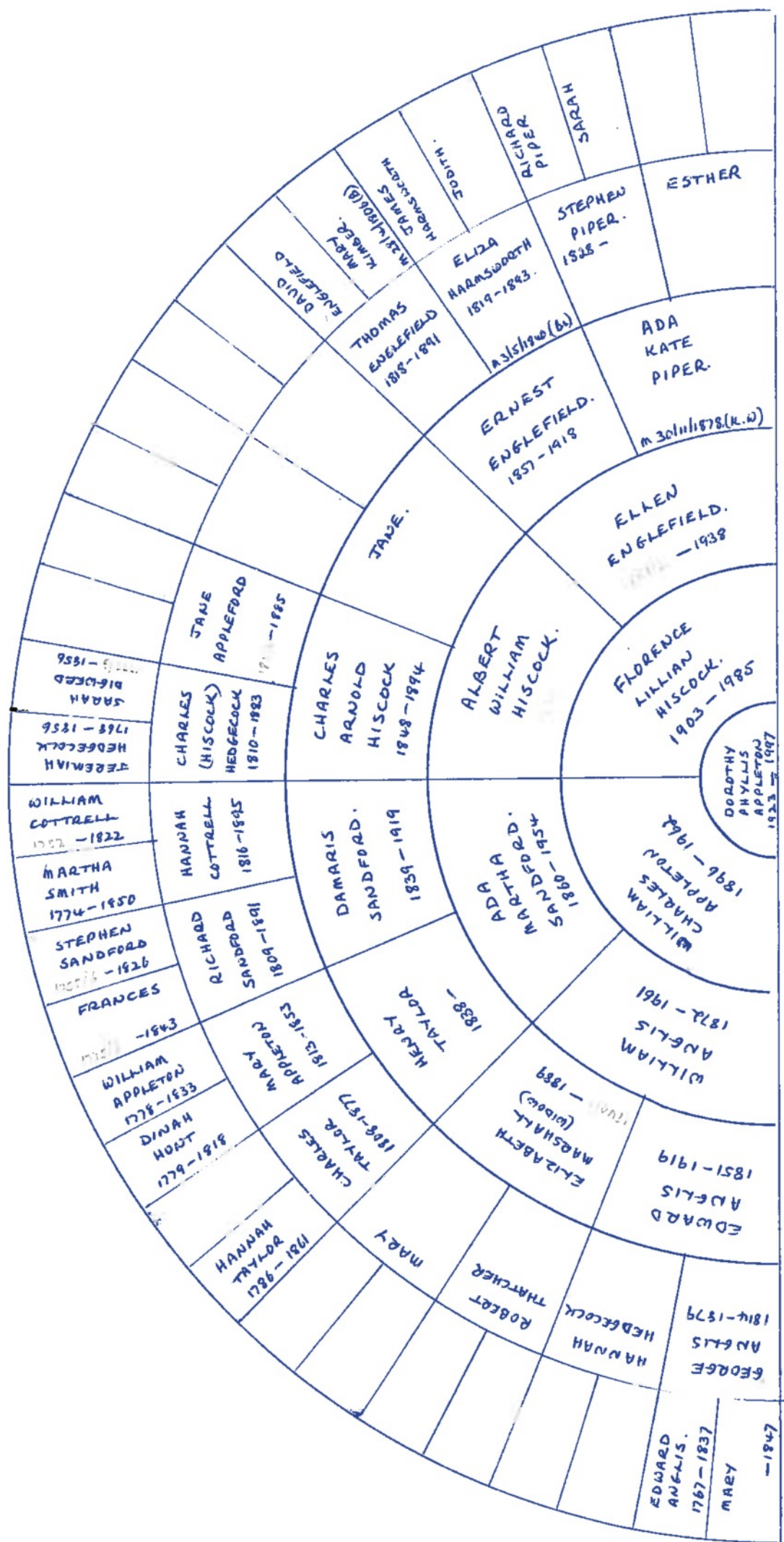

● A variation of John 3 v 8

The corn in the field sways in the wind.

"Remember what you see!", is its final call to man.
The sound and sights are burned into aching hearts.
Never can a witness forget, even though he may try.
They haunt his dreams, they return in times of stillness.
Never again can a breeze caress his cheek—
Without reminding him of the voice of the Somme.

The Somme leaves a challenge to all who may visit.
"Where in the hell of war, lies God's love for man?"
Pilgrims take years to discover the truth—some fall lost.
Yet the answer lies plainly, if one cares to look—
God's hand has healed man's useless destruction,
Forgiving his sins, giving new life and with that new hope.
He leaves there a guardian, for all who may listen—
For His Holy Spirit cries there—in the winds of the Somme.

A step back in time

TWO local history enthusiasts took a step back in time when they were part of an 80-mile march to re-enact the First World War's Retreat from Mons.

David Whithorn and Lee Gristwood, who both work at AWE Aldermaston, travelled to Mons, in Belgium, in August to start the long march to St Quentin in north east France.

The five-day march marked the 90th anniversary of the

start of the war in August 1914, and the 50-people who took part were dressed in full 1914 British army uniform and lived as the soldiers did.

Mr Whithorn, 45, of Brambling Close in Kempshott, works as an AWE research scientist team leader and played a support role in the re-enactment with the Army Service Corps.

He said: "It was a privilege to take part in the re-enactment knowing that we were

trying to show everyone that the British people still care.

"My goal is to make sure the soldiers are not forgotten."

But Mr Whithorn, who has researched the Great War for 25 years, described the experience as "exhausting".

He said: "The days were very long at about 16 hours, and the rest of the time we were trying to sleep, but it was very cold and not comfortable."

The marchers camped as the soldiers did 90 years ago, under canvas with just

ground sheets and blankets, sleeping in their uniforms.

They cooked on the old cookers and ate the simple food their heroes ate.

Ministry of Defence police officer Pc Gristwood, 39, from Southampton, marched at the front as a lance corporal.

He said: "I cannot begin to imagine what the original soldiers of the British Expeditionary Force endured in those dark days of 1914."

Mr Whithorn and Pc Gristwood raised around £500 for the Royal British Legion.

The soldier was David Whithorn, who is a member of The Great War Society, and he was busy collecting all day.

Collectors across the town and borough have already been extremely busy with some people filling the same amount of collection tins in just one week as they filled in the two-week period last year.

David Buttle, president of the Basingstoke branch and Standard bearer, spoke of his happiness that so many young people were still interested in the appeal.

WIGMORE HEATH UPDATE

Wigmore Heath in Tadley is an important habitat for a variety of wildlife including heather, lizards and many different bird species. In the past few years much of the heath has been lost as small trees and scrub colonise the site. Removal of scrub from the heath was due to happen this march. Unfortunately this work would not have been completed before the start of the nesting season so will now commence in the autumn. The work will restore part of the heath to its original open state. This will involve removing dense and scattered areas of scrub. The heath will then be managed to prevent scrub colonising the site in the future.

Death of a showman

Hundreds of people came from across the country to celebrate the life of a renowned Tadley showman who 'lit up peoples lives'.

200 people squeezed into St Peter's Church, in Brimpton, to honour the life of the celebrated showman Jimmy Williams.

Jimmy, aged 72, was famous in Tadley for his antique carousel decorated

Obituary Jimmy Williams (1929-2006)

A FAIRGROUND showman and one of Tadley's best-known characters has passed away aged 76.

Jimmy Williams died on April 2 at his home in Mulfords Hill following a long illness.

Mr Williams (**pictured**) was born in 1929, just down the road in Franklin Avenue, Tadley, and spent his entire life in the town.

He attended what is now known as Tadley Community Primary School at The Green and left at 14 to train as a sign artist in Reading.

His father, Samuel Williams, then taught him the skill of fairground decorating – a trade that has been in the family for seven generations.

In 1960, Mr Williams met his wife Bunch at a caravan park his father owned in Mount Pleasant while she was staying with her brother.

They married three years later at a register office in Reading and had a daughter Patrina. The couple also have two grandchildren Karina, 20, and James, 17.

Mr Williams was a member of the Showman's Artists Guild and devoted much of his life to his fairground decorating, which he carried out



at his home.

He won awards for his work and appeared on several television programmes about the traditional craft.

"He was a perfectionist and loved his painting," said his widow.

Mrs Williams said she wanted to thank Dr Sunil Bhanot, of Holmwood Health Centre, Franklin Avenue, Tadley, for his help and support during the last six months. She is also grateful to the group of about 200 mourners who attended Jimmy's funeral at St Peter's Church, Brompton, on April 11, and for the dozens of sympathy cards she received.
