Dear Veronica, Thanks for your form submission to place a surname interest for Bowman. I am pleased to say that I have some information on this family.

Stan Bowman had a brother Reginald and another called Roy. Their parents were Ernie and Alice Bowman and the family lived at 19 Burney Bit, Pamber Heath in the early 1920s before moving into a cottage at the end of the Burney Bit at its junction with Pamber Heath Road, where in later years Roy and Daphne Bowman lived (*pictured on the far right of this photograph*). I believe Roy and Stan lived in Tadley. I think Roy lived in a house off Mulford's Hill and used part of it as a museum as he had a large collection of historical items.



The cottage at 19 Burney Bit and the one at the end of the Burney Bit are pictured in my book as is Daphne Bowman in 1962. Reginald Bowman is pictured in 1931 at Tadley School and there may be other pictures of this family in there. Stan Bowman is pictured in the Tadley history book 'Around Tadley, People and Places' in his naval uniform and the family are pictured on the front cover in a charabanc outing to Bournemouth in the 1920s. The family are mentioned in the Tadley history book 'Around Tadley, Fact and Fable'.

Roy Bowman died around 2000 and he and his wife were living on the coast somewhere, possibly Devon. Tadley and District History Society may have information. See the links page on my web site for the Tadley History Society web site. Their books may still be available - see their web site. Jan 16, 2007 Dear Raymond, Many thanks for the information about the Bowman family. I certainly found it helpful. My connection with Stan Bowman is as follows. Back in Oct 1940, before my mother joined the Wrens, she knitted a pullover for the lads serving in the services. Stan

was the one who got it. He wrote to say he had a younger brother aged 15 and an older one aged 24 serving in the RAF in South Africa. He joined the Navy after his street was bombed. His mate was injured and the girl next to him was killed. I have eleven letters written by him, plus three from his mother. They are moving but sad especially the one sent by his mother to say he had been killed. I thought if I could trace some of his relations they might like the letters. My mother never met him, did have a photo but unfortunately it was destroyed by her step mother. My mother went on to join the Wrens in 1942. She died in 2003, aged 82.

A coincidence - my birthday is 12th Sept., same as Stan's..

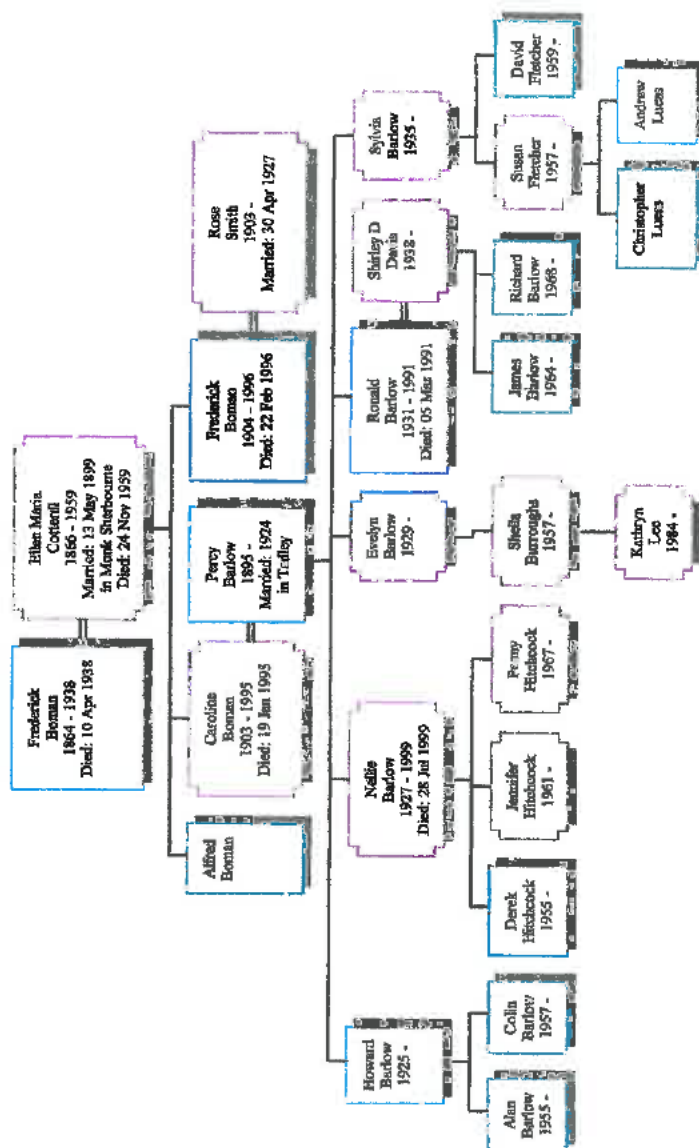

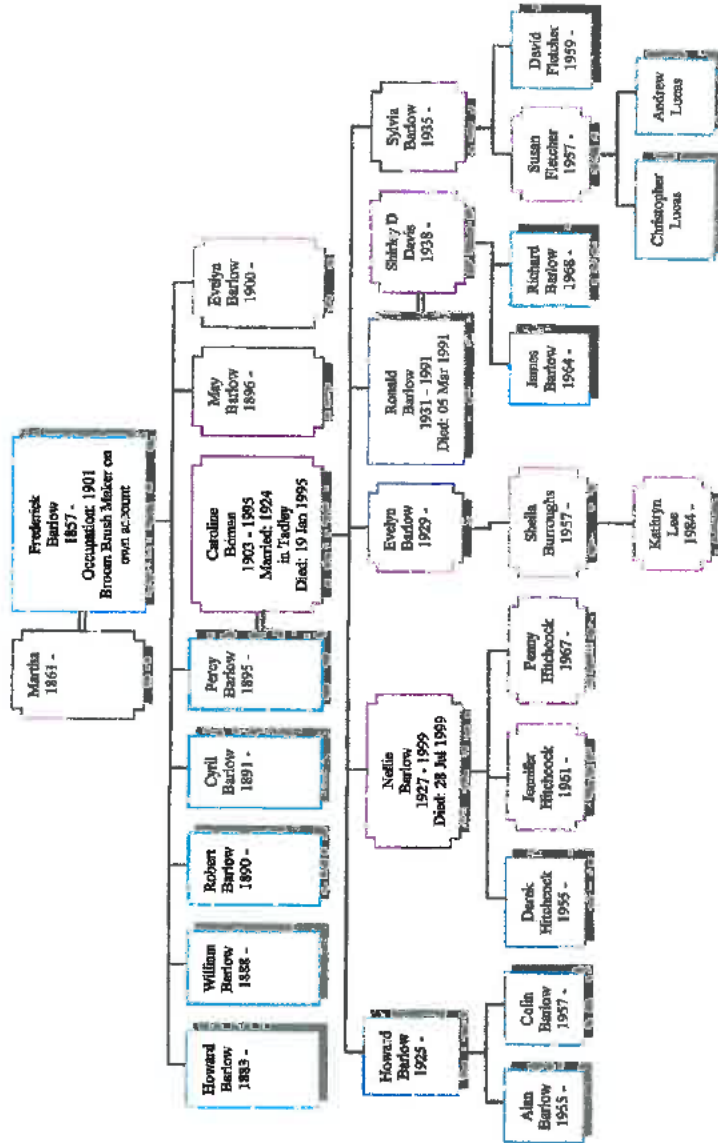

This besom broomyard was operated by members of the Bo(w)man family. See **Brook (Bowman's)**.

THE BOWMAN FAMILY

The spelling of the surname varied over the years from Boman to Bowman. This family is believed to have descended from the Bomes of Tadley.

George and Ann Boman were living in 'Back Lane, Pamber', by 1861. They had two children then - Thomas, 8, and Caroline, 6 years old. George was an agricultural labourer at the time.

In 1871, they were recorded at 'Black Fans' (the old name for the Sandy Lane/Winston Avenue area). George was recorded as a labourer. George and Ann were both 44 years old. Children listed were Thomas, 18, Ann, 9, Frederick, 7, and George, 3.

In 1881, George was not present on Census day. Ann was 55 years old. Children listed were Caroline, 26, a cook, domestic servant and George, 12. The surname spelling had changed to Bowman.

The Census for 1891 revealed that George Bowman, 65, a broom maker was living with his wife, Ann, 65, along with daughter, Ann, 29 and sons, Frederick, 27, George, 22 at 'Black Fans'.

George and Ann's son, Frederick Boman (Frederick Senior in the picture above), a 35 year-old bachelor and broom maker of Pamber, married Ellen Maria Cottrell, a 33 year-old spinster from Tadley, on the 13th of May 1899 at Pamber Priory Church. He was recorded as the son of George Boman (deceased), a broom maker and she was the daughter of William Cottrell, a labourer. Witnesses were Edward Tanner and Dorcas Cottrell. Note the Boman spelling, reverting to the former name.

Village Memories

Carol Boman, a descendant and family history researcher, said Frederick Senior and Ellen had three children - Frederick, Alfred and Caroline. All their dogs were called 'Mickey'! Caroline's daughter (Evelyn Burroughs) named those above.

Carol mentioned that Frederick Junior (pictured on the next page - bottom right) lived at Tadley Hill in his latter days. Fred told her the story that he and his brother Alfred inherited Bowman's Cottage from his father and then did not know what to do with it. As he said, he had a house, his brother had a house, so why did they want another? They overcame this problem by giving it to charity.

Village Memories

Sheila Lee (great-granddaughter of Frederick Bowman Senior) talked about Albert Cottrell (pictured above):

"Albert Cottrell was known as 'Pug'. Pug lived in the cottage on the corner of Sandy Lane and Fairlawn Road. His daughter Betty lived there up until at least a year ago. Betty married Ewart West - not sure about that spelling."

Sheila spoke a few words about the Bowmans at Bowman's Cottage, recounting her mother's memories:

"My mother said they had a smallholding for years and kept a few dairy cattle. She thinks they supplied quite a few people locally with milk. In later years (from the 1930s on) they mainly made and sold besom brooms - like a lot of Tadley people. They used to load up the horse and cart with brooms and walk beside it to Aldermaston Station. She can remember going home after school (she lived with her Grandmother and Uncles Alf and Fred for a while) and she would often find her Granny out in the yard helping with the broom-making. She would have been an old lady by this time, but still did all the household work as well."

Allowance cash is hard to claim

Sir-I read, with interest, Andrew Hunter's comments regarding cancer patients in the Basingstoke Extra, July 7.

Mr Hunter states that there is approximately £126.5million of unclaimed benefits, made up of Disability Living Allowance and Attendance Allowance, owed to cancer patients in the country.

Mr Hunter suggested in his column that people who have cancer, or who are caring for someone with the illness, should claim some of these benefits.

Can I inform Mr Hunter that, as easy as it may sound, some people can experience problems when trying to claim these allowances.

My grandmother developed cancer last year, and my mother became her sole carer.

I applied for the allowances my mother and grandmother were entitled to in April of 2003.

As you can imagine, being a full-time carer, my mother had no time to fill in the numerous, lengthy forms required herself.

In October 2003, six months after starting proceedings for the allowances, my mother was granted them - she would finally get some help. But my grandmother had died in August.

Since this is probably the case with many people, maybe the system of applying for this help should be reviewed.

It seems ludicrous that so many people like my mother seem to be helping out the council and the Government by having, feeding and caring for terminally ill people, thus saving them a fortune.

May I suggest to Andrew Hunter that he puts it to the councils to donate the unclaimed £126.5million to Cancer Research?

Inquest: bird disease link discounted

A FORMER worker at the Atomic Weapons Establishment at Aldermaston died of natural causes, an inquest at Basingstoke heard.

Gerald Bowman, 66, of Heath End Road, Baughurst died on February 12.

At first he was thought to have died due of a form of psittacosis—an infectious disease originating from birds, following an initial post mortem.

A full autopsy was carried out following an inquest that opened on February 14 to enable further medical examinations as to the cause of death.

Dr Jennifer Finch, a consultant pathologist at the North Hampshire Hospital told coroner Andrew Bradley that Mr Bowman had been a worker at AWE and had suffered in-

creasingly poor health over the past few years.

"He had smoked for 30 years and examination revealed acute congestion of the main arteries supplying the heart.

"While working at AWE he had a sudden collapse and escape of air from his lungs that was caused by a bronchial disorder," said Dr Finch.

Tests revealed no traces of barillium, which he might have absorbed at AWE, she added.

"This is one of those idiopathic cases where we don't quite know exactly what the cause of death was, but all tests show that it was through natural causes," said Dr Finch.

The coroner recorded a verdict of death by natural causes.

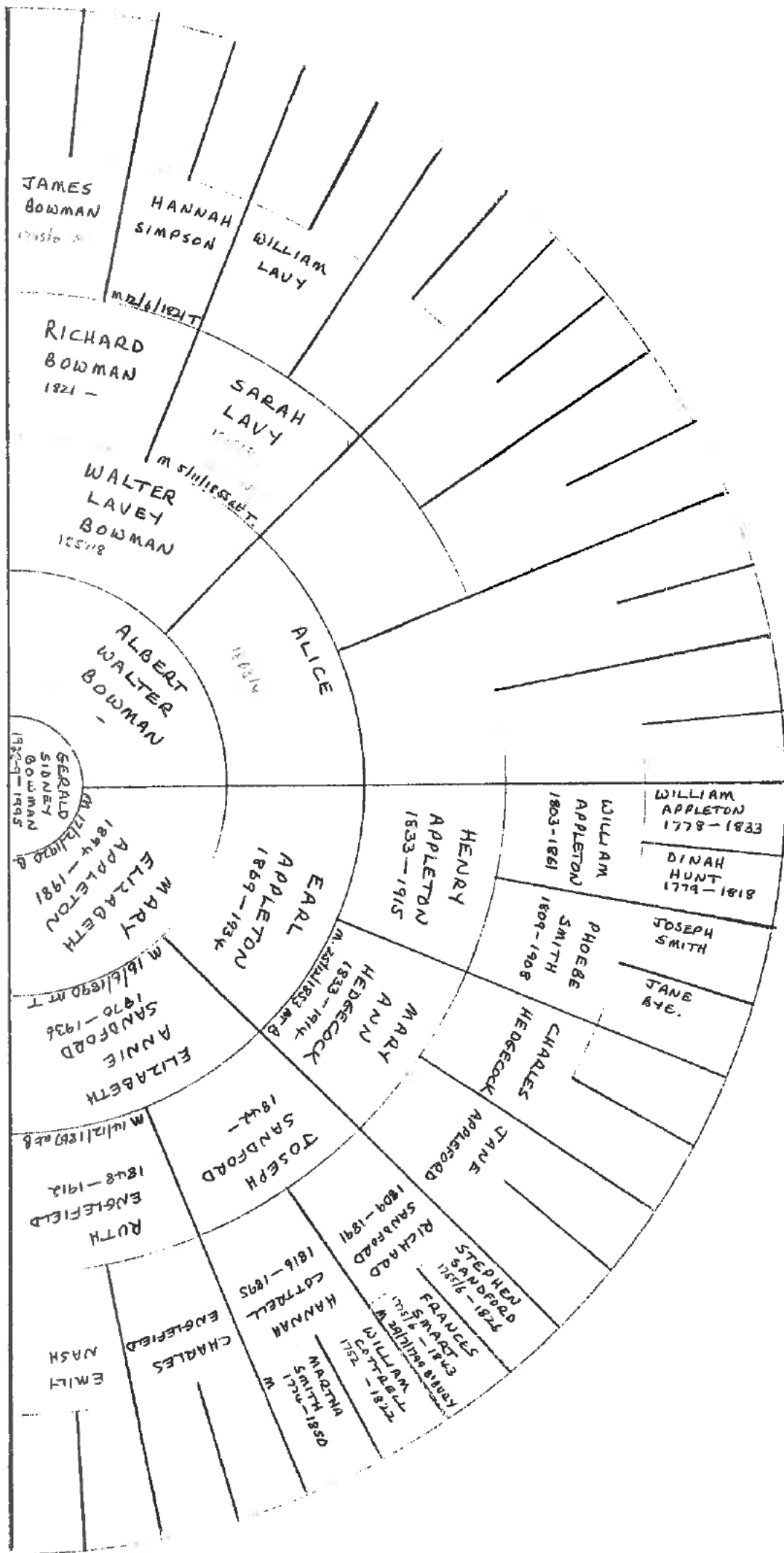

'Needless death' of drink-drive motorbike rider

A KEEN motorcyclist suffered a "needless death" through drink-driving, an inquest heard on Tuesday.

Ronald Bowman, 40, of Highworth Cottages, Baughurst, died from multiple injuries after the Yamaha 250cc motorbike he was riding was involved in a head-on collision with a Citroen BX car.

Blood test results showed that Mr Bowman was more than three times over the legal limit when the accident happened outside the Hurst School, Brimpton Road, Baughurst, on October 16.

The inquest was told how Mr Bowman had ridden to his local, the Badgers

Wood, that afternoon and had had a couple of pints of weak lager.

He left his motorcycle at the pub and walked home, returning in the evening to collect it.

In a statement, pub landlord Steve Logan described Mr Bowman as a heavy drinker.

He said he could drink between 10 and 15 pints of lager and four or five vodka chasers on a Saturday night.

Mr Bowman was on his way home when the accident happened just after 9pm.

Citroen driver Stuart Miller, of Long Grove, Heath End, said: "As I passed the main entrance to the school I became aware of a single headlamp suddenly

coming towards me."

He added: "If there was anything I could possibly have done I would have done it, but I didn't have a chance to get out of the guy's way."

Pc Tony Lush attended the scene and examined both vehicles.

He said that the rear tyre of the motorcycle was grossly under-inflated and the rear wheel was not properly aligned.

These factors, coupled to the high alcohol level in Mr Bowman's blood could have caused him to drift across the road into the Citroen's path.

Recording a verdict of accidental death, North Hampshire coroner Andrew Bradley said there was no doubt that the death was alcohol-related.

"It is very sad for somebody who is 40 to suffer a needless death," he said.

Our two tiny brave hearts

TWINS Rachael and Laura Boyce had the same surgery for the same heart problem on the same day. Surgeon Robert Lamb performed three-hour operations on each girl on the same operating table — saving their lives.

"It is extremely rare for identical twins to have the same heart problem," he said yesterday.

"Although they may look the same on the outside, normally twins will be different in their physiological make-up.

"When we did blood and heart tests on Laura and Rachael there was really no way we could tell them apart.

"The results of the tests were so similar they could have been taken from either girl. The murmurs were exactly the same.

"This is the first time I have ever come across a case like this in my professional career. When we looked at X-rays of the girls' hearts we could easily have been looking at two copies of the same picture."

The blonde three-year-olds were born with the same heart murmur caused by a narrow heart valve. Their con-

plaint was detected shortly after they were born, but surgeons took the decision to wait until they were older before operating. Without the cure, they would have deteriorated until probable death in their teens.

They had the operation at Southampton General Hospital on Monday of last week. And yesterday their parents were

ried, especially when Laura developed a problem and had to go back into surgery. "But everything went quite well and hopefully they will be OK now. It really is a case of two hearts beating as one. "Laura and Rachael do everything together and can't bear to be apart. When they were in intensive care the doctors drew curtains around their beds but

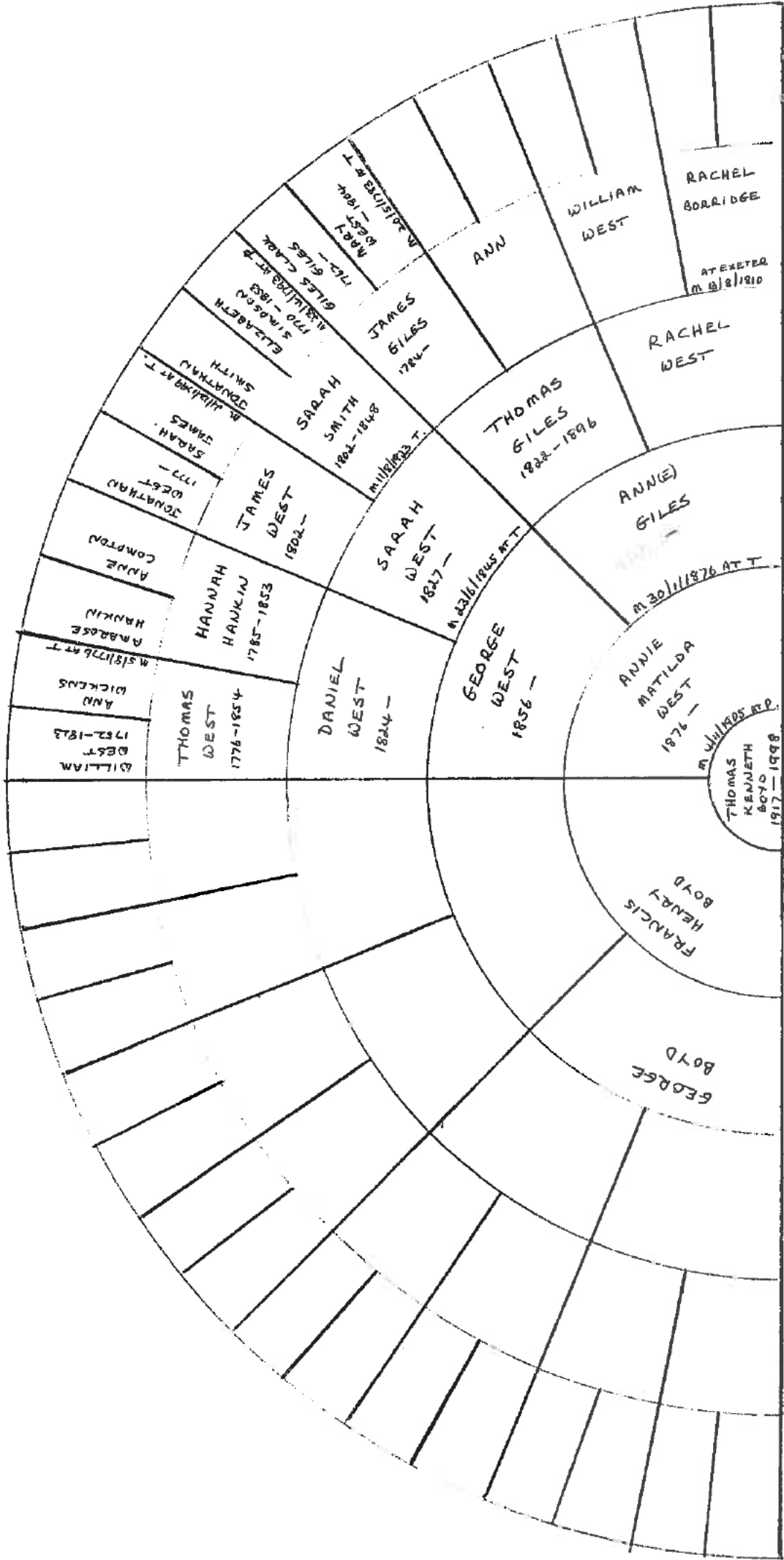
the girls made them pull them back so they could wave to each other. Seeing them surrounded by medical equipment would bring tears to your eyes."

His wife Michelle, 29, added: "Whenever one of them falls asleep the other wakes her up because they miss each other. "Their elder sister Kylie, six, really misses them. She can't wait for the girls to get home."

He pulled over and his passenger called for an ambulance on the car phone.

He was taken to Basingstoke hospital where he later died of a heart attack.

His haulage and waste disposal businesses will be carried on by the family from

their site at Whitehouse Farm, Silchester Road.

Speaking from the family home at Yew Tree Cottage, Common Road, Tadley, this week, Joy Brant said: "He was a man who certainly knew what he wanted and had the drive to go out and get it."

She told of how Mr Brant, born in Sherborne St John, started his haulage firm with just one truck when he left school. Now the company boasts more than 30.

"He only ever wanted to be his own boss," Joy added.

The couple met at Joy's 21st birthday party when her parents invited the Brants, who brought along their son Denis.

The couple married in 1959 in Reading.

But the project Mr Brant spent his last years working on was the Lakeside Garden Centre, which he turned into a thriving business from its origins as an exhausted gravel pit.

"He bought it as a fresh challenge," said Joy, 57.

Mr Brant's funeral will be held at St Peter's Church, Tadley, at 2pm today.

The only time they were parted was when Alf served on anti-aircraft mainly in North Africa during a period of three years. He finished his

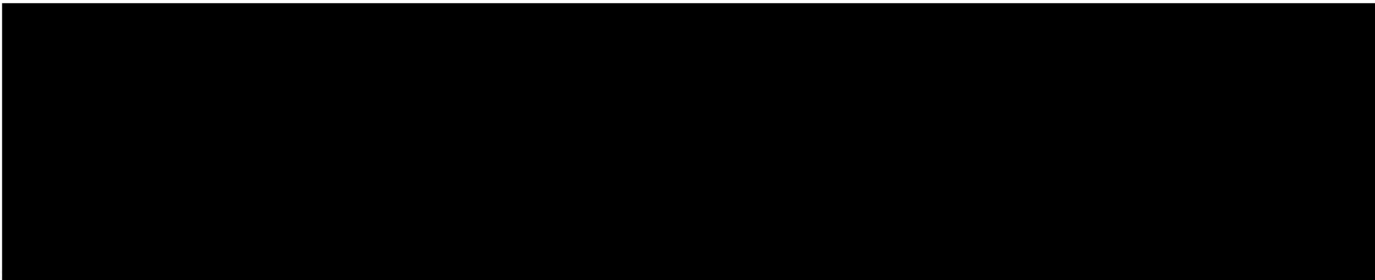
working life with a 21-year stint with Goodall, Barnard and Clayton.

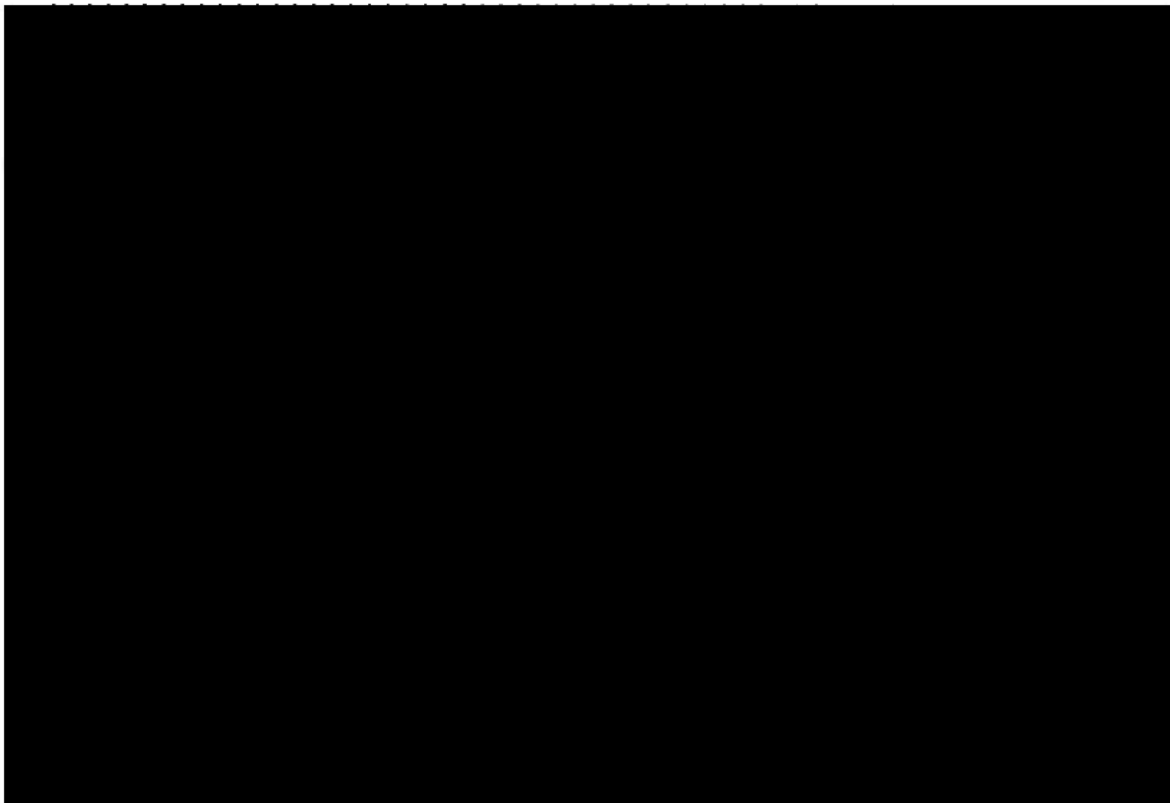

Schools unite to survive

PLANS to create a new primary school in Hampshire by merging Burnham Copse Infant and Junior schools in Tadley, Basingstoke have been given the go ahead by county education bosses.

The proposal for amalgamation was originally put forward by the governing bodies at both schools and has been widely supported in consultation with parents, staff and other interested partners.

The plans will see Burnham Copse Infant and Burnham Copse Junior schools replaced with a 210 place (one form entry) primary school with pre school provision. The new primary school will be created by remodelling the existing junior school building to provide high quality teaching and learning.

The proposals have been developed in response to concerns about declining pupil numbers at the two schools, which mirrors the decline in primary age children across both the county and the country as a whole. In January this year there were 37% surplus places at the Infant school and 30% at the Junior. Surplus places are costly to maintain and do not make the best use of resources. A new primary school would offer children an enhanced learning environment, present better value for money and would support the objectives of the Children Act through the provision of a safe, healthy environment where children can enjoy their learning experiences.

Cllr Ken Thorber, said: "I believe that a new primary school is the best possible outcome for all concerned."
