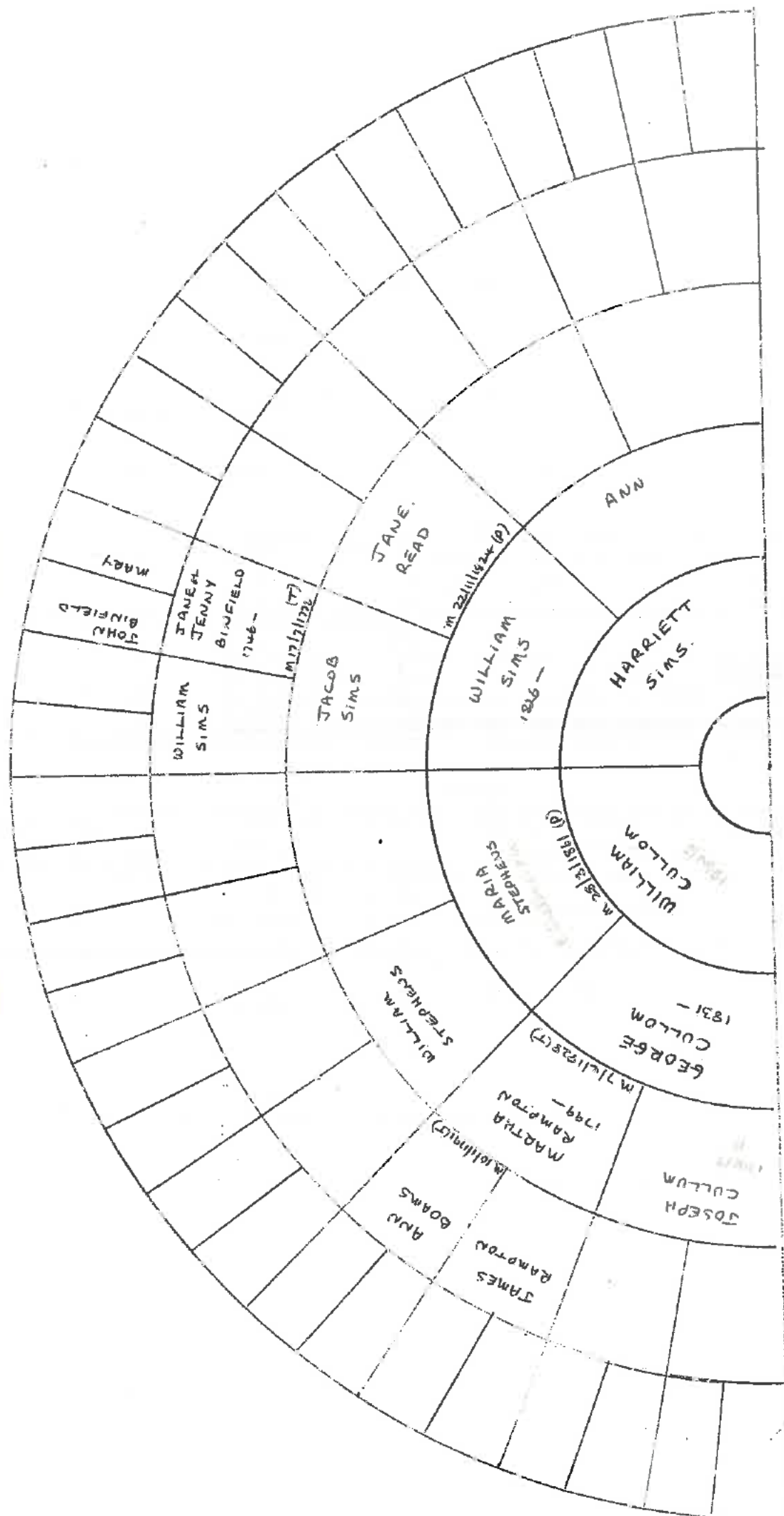

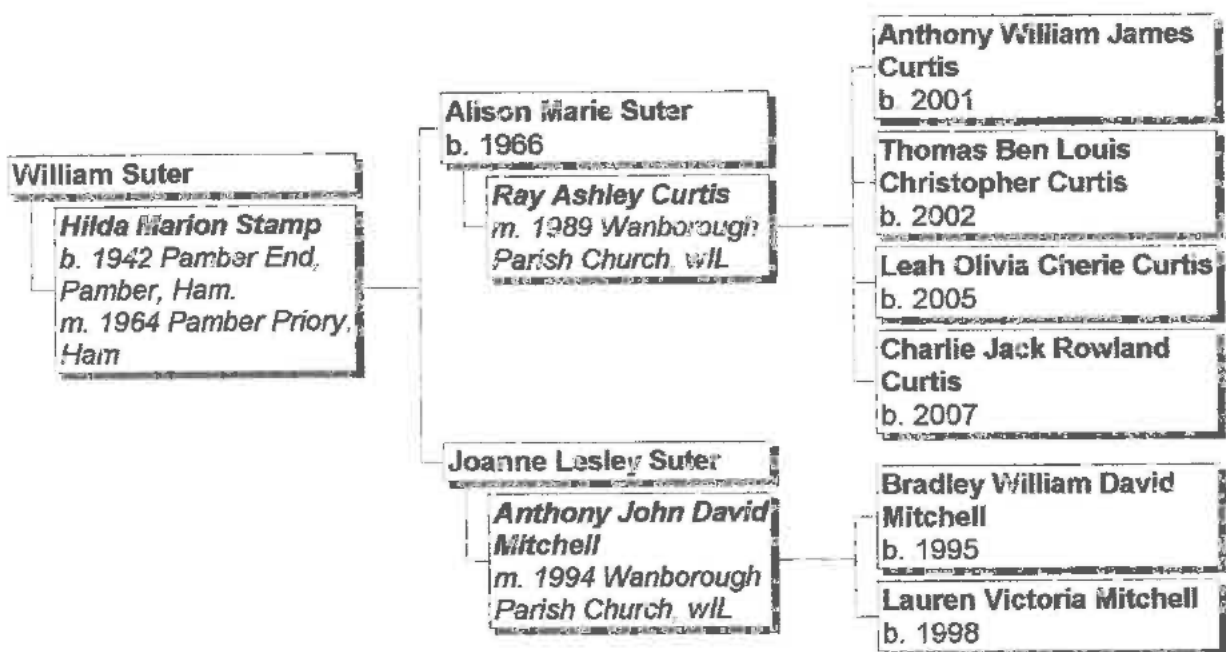

Dear Mrs. Stanley,

In 1984 you very kindly sent me lists of baptisms, marriages and burials of people of my family names who had lived in and around Tadley, this in reply to a letter to the newspaper seeking help for us, put in by a friend, Mrs. Evelyn Woodall.

I am writing again to ask whether you are able to help me further, with regard to a baptism of a 3 x gt grandmother, Hannah Tull, nee Curtis.

The family I feel fairly sure she belongs to is this one:

David Curtis and Sarah, nee Henwood, married at Old Basing on 2 May 1782, had children

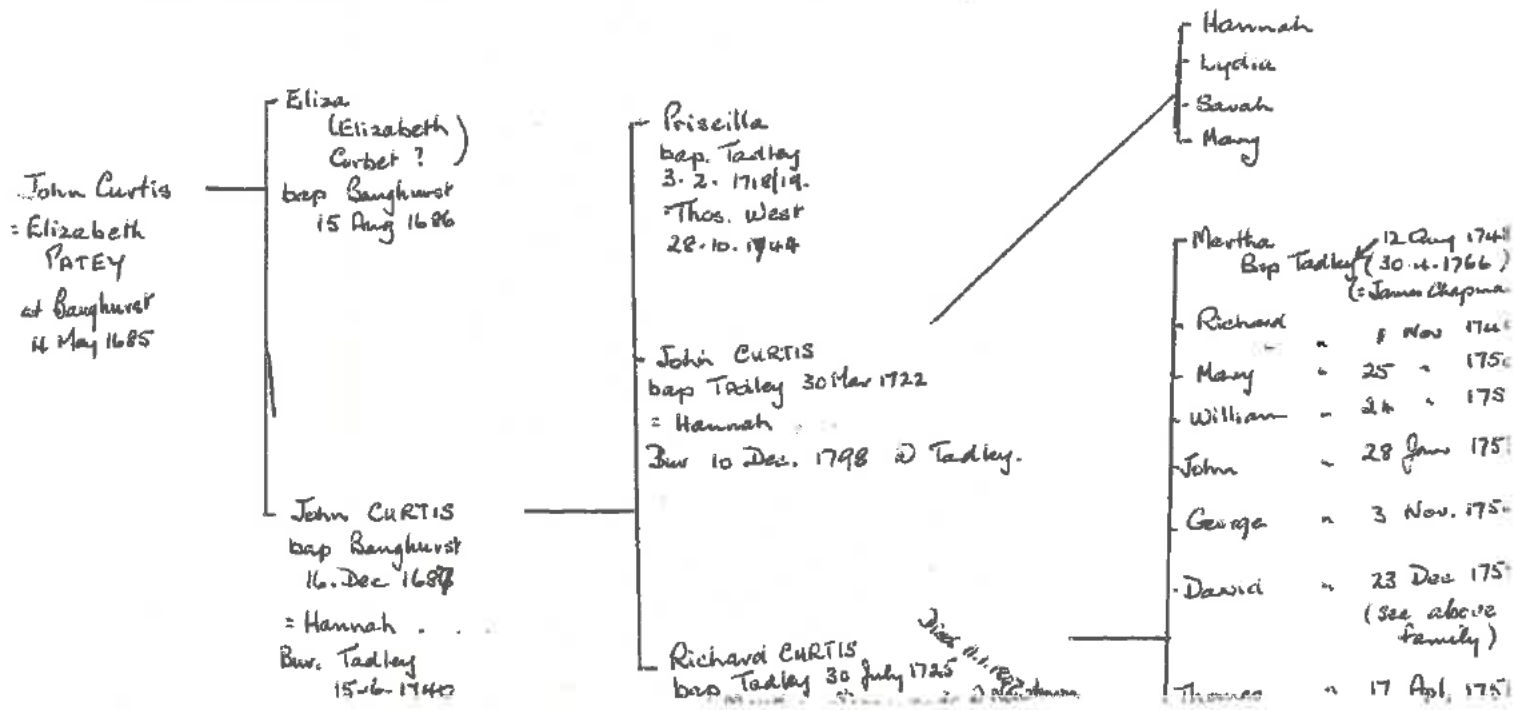

I have detail of marriages of three of this family:

Thomas = Jane West 20 May 1812; Sarah = Daniel Barlow 20 Apr 1815; and Anne = James May 27 July 1814; all at Tadley.

I also have the marriage of Hannah Curtis to Joel Tull on 22 July 1818, and this is the lady I am descended from. So far I have not found her birth.

There appears to be only one family of Curtis in Tadley, Baughurst, Pamber at this time.

When David and Sarah were having their children in that 1783-1800 period he appears as the only "Curtis" family in that age group in Tadley at the time.

The family of the first John and Hannah is well documented for us by the will of John (buried 15.6.1740) in which he leaves land in Inhurst in the Parish of Baghurst to his son Richard, his land in Tadley which "descends and comes to his son John", money to his daughter Priscilla, his wife Hannah to have the rents and profits of his lands, and to be Guardian over his sons and daughter to 21, and sole Executrix. To his sister, Elizabeth Corbet one guinea in gold.

A John Marshall who died only a few months before seems to have left that Baghurst land to Richard, in his will. I sounds like considerable land and he left it to his kinsman, Richard Curtis, son of John Curtis..." John Curtis describes the land in Baghurst as being that "late in the possession of his kinsman, John Marshall..." so it seems that he was making sure that it became Richard's inheritance. John Marshall also gave to his kinswoman, Elizabeth Corbett and her children, of Waltham, the sum of twenty pounds..."

At this time Richard was not quite 15 years, the young John 18. Despite his legacy of land in Baghurst Richard lived, or at least had all his children baptised in Tadley. And despite all this land they inherited just four generations later, 1852, my widowed grandmother is described as a pauper. How fortunes can change!

It is the ownership of land in the parish of Baghurst which we think may tie our John Snr to being the John, son of John Curtis and Eliza Patey of Baghurst. Also that John in his will mentions only one sister, Elizabeth (Eliza?). A bit shaky - that link.

If Hannah is the child of David and Sarah I would expect her birth to be between that of Anne and Mary, c 1793/4 or after Mary's - say 1797/8.

Through the National Genealogical Directory I have now a correspondent in Watford who is a descendant of Anne Curtis = James May, and we are working on the family tree together. I have been able to contribute because of your lists, and I've also ordered films through the Family History Centre here. My 'cousin' found the two wills, etc. But the birth of Hannah Curtis still eludes us.

Can you tell us whether there is anything else we can do to check on this? Do you have access to any indexes or registers that would enable you to see whether the entry is there or not? Sarah and David seem to have been buried at Tadley.

I enclose herewith a Postal order for £5 for you, to cover return postage and your trouble, *the postal order bought for us in England by my sister-in-law, to use this way.*

You will know, I expect, that I share the interest in Tadley of the family of Simpsons, with Diana Pitcher of Surrey, Canada. It is sad to know that Diana has been so ill with cancer; I had a letter in July from her when she had just completed having a course of treatments, and she sounded very cheerful. We do hope that she will be well now. Diana and I have never been able to join our families up. We met Diana and Reg when they came to Christchurch for a day or two about two years ago.

ONE motorcyclist died while another escaped relatively unscathed in a multi-vehicle pile-up on a country lane at the weekend.

David Dansey, 46, of Bishopswood Road, Tadley, was pronounced dead at the scene.

But yesterday Matthew Robinson, 17, of Silchester, was able to talk calmly of the scene of devastation he walked away from suffering whiplash and bruises.

The biker said: "Something hit me and everything went black. Then I was drifting in and out of consciousness and people were yelling 'stay down, stay down'."

Meanwhile, motorbike enthusiasts from Basingstoke and beyond were mourning the death of popular fellow-biker Mr Dansey, a maintenance worker at AWE Aldermaston.

His distraught parents June and Bernard, both 70, with whom he lived, said their beloved only son was a familiar figure at motorbike rallies in and around Basingstoke and even abroad.

The tragedy happened at West End Road, Mortimer, near Reading, on Saturday about 4.30pm

Mr Dansey's Yamaha bike was in collision with Mr Robinson's Honda NS 125R, and then each bike was in collision with a different car.

One was a Nissan Primera driven by Geoffrey Foan of Wigmore Road, Tadley; the other was an Audi driven by Swedish-born Christer Carlen of Malvern, Worcestershire.

Neither car driver was seriously hurt.

Sgt Barry Taylor, of Basingstoke police, said: "There was a queue of traffic because of

some horses in the road."

He said they were investigating the possibility that Mr Dansey had overtaken them and was appealing for the drivers to come forward.

Mr Robinson, recovering at home in Byes Lane, Silchester, yesterday, said: "After the impact I remember coming to on my hands and knees, but everything kept going black."

"I could see people on mobile 'phones calling for an ambulance and then you could hear the siren getting nearer."

"I remember they pronounced the poor man dead at the scene, but I refused hospital treatment - I just wanted to go home."

Mr Dansey, who has a 44-year-old sister Carroll, had been a biker since the age of 17.

His father Bernard said: "He was very experienced, a good driver."

"He was a good son. Everyone liked him and he would do anything for us. I'm going to miss him very much."

"Motorbike enthusiasts have already rung up to say how much they will miss him, too. He used to go to rallies here and in Holland and France"

The retired Ministry of Defence policeman, who worked at AWE Aldermaston, added: "Nothing was too much trouble for him. He was a very competent plumber and electrician and would work round the house for us."

His wife June revealed their son, a keen skier, had taken his bike for a ride for the first time in two weeks to enjoy the Autumn sunshine.

She said: "We always had his tea ready for him, and when he didn't come back in time, we knew something was wrong."

Tragic biker who ran into queue

A 46-YEAR-OLD biker suffered fatal injuries after he crashed into the back of a queue of slow-moving traffic, an inquest heard.

David Dansey, 46, of Bishopswood Road, Tadley, died after sustaining a fractured skull in the accident on November 7 at West End Road, Mortimer, near Reading.

A Basingstoke inquest heard how Mr Dansey had been riding his 1200cc Yamaha motorbike at a speed of about 45mph - the legal limit was 60mph - when he came upon the queue of traffic.

Several cars and another motorbike at the rear of the queue were moving slowly because of two horses which had been ridden ahead in the road.

According to witnesses, Mr Dansey - a mechanical engineer at AWE Aldermaston - tried to slow down as soon as he saw the traffic.

But in doing so, he locked the wheels and skidded into the back of the motorbike at the end of the queue before spinning into the path of an oncoming car on the other side of the road.

Matthew Robinson, 17, the rider of the other bike, told the inquest in written evidence: "There was an enormous bang in the back of my bike and everything went black - I didn't know what had hit me."

Hampshire police accident investigator, Pc Michael Jenkins, told the inquest that while Mr Dansey was well within the limit, his speed was just "a fraction too high" for the available view.

North Hampshire Coroner, Andrew Bradley, described the incident as a "very tragic matter".

He added: "As long as there is traffic on the road, these things are going to happen."

The coroner recorded a verdict of accidental death.

CRUEL: Second brother is killed in a car crash Family rocked by tragedy

THE FAMILY of a Tadley man killed in a road accident last year has been rocked by a second tragedy.

Tim Dey, from Newtown, died in a motorcycle crash while out riding with friends on the A339 on his 32nd birthday last April.

In a cruel twist of fate, one year, one month and one day after the tragedy, his younger brother Barry Dey has also died in a road smash.

Barry, 29, was travelling to work along the dual carriageway of the A24, near his home in Slinfold, Worthing, when a car travelling in the opposite direction crossed the central reservation, flipped upside down and landed on top of his Vauxhall Astra van.

Barry, who grew up in Basingstoke and attended Harriet Costello School, died at the scene of the accident on May 26.

This week, as Tim's widow Karen, of Newtown, prepares to hear the sentencing of the motorcyclist convicted of causing her husband's death by dangerous driving, she told The Gazette how her family have been devastated by the latest tragedy.

Karen said: "I feel numb. I just can't put it into words. Virtually the same thing has happened to two brothers - it's an evil twist of fate."

"Barry has been really good to me and my children, particularly since Tim died last year."

"He was absolutely devastated when that happened but he made sure he came to visit regularly with his son Oliver."

"He attended all the court hearings with me over the past few months and he should have been coming to the sentencing."

Karen, who visits Tim's grave each day, added: "Tim and Barry were very close, particularly when they were younger. They worked as carpenters together, had guitar lessons together and went fishing at weekends."

Karen added: "You never get over it when someone has been taken from you like that. It's just another blow for us all."

Barry's eldest sister, Rose Hasted, who lives in Quantock Close, Bucks, added: "My mum and dad are devastated. They have lost their only two sons, both in road accidents and in such a short space of time."

"It's a case of living from day to day because you just don't know what will happen next."

TRIBUTE: Grieving widow praises 'perfect dad and husband' Father-of-two dies on birthday motorbike ride

THE GRIEVING wife of a Tadley man who died on his birthday in a motorcycle crash has paid tribute to the "perfect husband and father".

Timothy Dey died while out riding his motorbike with friends on his 32nd birthday.

Tim, of Newtown, Tadley, has been riding motorbikes since the age of 17 and regularly went out with friends each weekend.

On Sunday he was involved in a head-on collision with another motorbike on the A339 Alton Road, near the saw mills at Herriard, south of Basingstoke.

He died at the scene just hours before he was due to have a special birthday lunch with his wife, Karen, and daughters Vicki, nine, and Rachel, five.

A group of friends who were riding with him witnessed the accident.

This week, as she tried to come to terms with his death, 32-year-old Karen paid tribute to her popular husband.

She said: "He was such a good biker. He's been riding since he was 17."

"He always used to go out and meet up with his friends and was a big

follower of bike races. We even visited Donnington and Brand's Hatch."

Karen met Tim when they were at school. He was a self-employed carpenter and ran his own business with a friend.

She added: "It would have been our 12th anniversary this year and we were planning a holiday with our children to celebrate it in June."

"We lived for each other. He was the perfect dad and husband and a wonderful son for his mother and mother-in-law. He was such a wonderful man."

She added: "It's only ever been us two. We have had a lot of problems, including when Vicki was born very

premature and she was born with cerebral palsy.

"Tim was my rock. He was loved and will be missed by everyone."

The other motorcyclist involved in the head-on collision was David Glanfield, 31, of Reading, who was taken to Southampton General Hospital where a spokesman yesterday described his condition as stable.

JURY: Motorcyclist is convicted of causing the death of local biker

Court told of fatal smash

A MOTORCYCLIST who lost an arm in a head-on crash which killed a Tadley man has been convicted of causing death by dangerous driving.

Jurors at Winchester Crown Court found David Glanfield, 32, of Langdale Gardens, Earley, Reading, guilty of causing the death of biker Timothy Dey, 32, on the A339 near Basingstoke.

The court was told Glanfield went on to the wrong side of the winding country road and hit Mr Dey - travelling in the opposite direction - at high speed.

Just before the accident at Herriard, near Basingstoke, on April 25, 1999, Glanfield - riding a red 750cc Suzuki motorcycle - had missed another biker by a matter of inches.

Judge Patrick Hooton remanded Glanfield on bail for a pre-sentence report.

He warned him: "The fact that I am allowing you to continue on bail doesn't give you any indication whatsoever of the sentence you will receive."

After the verdict, Mr Nigel Daly, defending, addressed the court with Mr Dey's relatives sitting in the public gallery.

He said: "Mr Glanfield would like me to say to everybody how deeply concerned he is for what happened."

"He didn't set out that morning with the intention of causing anything like what happened on this occasion."

"And he would like people to know - because things have been said outside this court - that he is deeply, deeply sorry."

"He has asked me to say that - no matter what the verdict was."

Stephen Smyth, prosecuting, told the court Glanfield had been riding his bike dangerously along the country road towards Basingstoke with a group of other bikers.

Mr Dey, a carpenter, of New Town, Tadley, was riding in the opposite direction with five other bikers when he came around a right-hand bend and was hit by Glanfield's bike.

"I can't remember the accident," Glanfield told the jury. "I remember asking someone about whether my arm was going to be saved."

"Then, I next remember waking up in hospital. I try to remember every day what happened that day."

Glanfield said he was a careful driver and had been riding motorcycles for about six years.

He could not explain how his bike came to be on the wrong side of the road. Glanfield, who is a married man, said he was now an aircraft design engineer using compu-

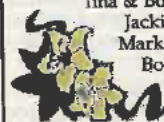

THE DEATH of Mr Rex Dixon, of Aldermaston Road, Sherborne St John, at the age of 80, severs a long link with a family whose shop has given the name to Dixon's Corner, listed in the Hampshire Bus timetables as a bus stop.

TRIBUNAL: Solicitor who flouted rules loses his 'last shred of honour'

DISHONEST LAWYER

GETS STRUCK OFF

A BASINGSTOKE solicitor has been struck off - less than a month after his former partner was suspended indefinitely by the same legal tribunal.

Antony James Doggett, 55, hung his head as his 'last shred of honour' disappeared when he was struck off for dishonesty on Thursday.

On October 6, The Gazette revealed how Oavid Hawke, his one-time partner in the defunct firm Doggett, Hawke and Co, was suspended indefinitely by the same body the Solicitors' Disciplinary Tribunal, for flouting his duties as a lawyer.

During Doggett's hearing Miss Katrina Wingfield, for the Law Society, had told how the firm Doggett and Co, of Winchester Street, Basingstoke, was investigated in September 1998.

She said: "Looking through the firm's accounts, a cash shortage of £7,843.77 was

discovered. Mr Doggett explained that he had been asked to trace clients to return monies owed.

"But as he was under pressure he decided instead to transfer the cash from 251 clients into the firm's account."

Jonathan Friend, representing Doggett, said: "Because of this he lost everything. This once honourable man has been reduced to nothing; he now lives above his former offices and has no means of support."

"I implore you to not take away his last shred of honour."

The tribunal heard that the money has since been returned.

Striking Doggett off, tribunal chairman Mr Jeremy Barnecutt said: "If you took 251 items belonging to other people without telling them then this, in my book, is most definitely dishonesty."

"It doesn't matter how small the amounts were, it was not your money and you had no right to it."

Doggett admitted one charge of not keeping his accounts in compliance with solicitors'

rules. He was also ordered to pay costs of £4,520.19.

In October, his former partner David Hawke was found guilty of six charges of flouting his duties. The allegations stemmed from his actions while working for Hawke and Co at New Street, Basingstoke, in 1994.

The firm is now run by Hawke's remaining partner Michael Vaughan, who confirmed: "Some 12 years ago they worked together as Doggett, Hawke and Co but then Mr Doggett got into financial difficulty and went off on his own."

"I am now the senior partner in Hawke and Co and we shall probably keep the name. Ironically, Mr Hawke has a good reputation as a solicitor in Basingstoke, if not with the Law Society."

Mr Doggett was for a while our solicitor, but we were not happy with the way he conducted business with us.

This was at the time, when together with David Scutler and Bill Swalch, we were hoping to sell our properties for development.

However this project failed to materialise, costing us all a great deal of money. The properties involved were Numbers 12-20 Skyshack Lane.

Mr Doggett at one time lived at West Street, Tadley.

Law Society adopts a similar tack

Sir.—Regarding Gazette article, Monday, November 6.

I have today seen your article in the Basingstoke Gazette.

I wonder if you would allow me a right of reply.

It is true that the Solicitors' Disciplinary Tribunal ordered that I be struck off the Roll of Solicitors last Thursday and that the chairman of the tribunal stated that, in his view, I had been guilty of dishonesty.

However, I do not agree with his view.

The principle which I applied was this: "If the amount to be returned to a client is less than it would cost to return it, then there is no duty to do so."

"There is no duty on a solicitor to spend money on a client."

I had inherited 251 small client account balances when I had taken over another firm.

I estimated that a solicitor's time is charged at, on average, £100 per hour, and a standard letter is charged at £10.

I estimated that as many of the 251 clients would take over an hour to trace and the sums involved were, in some cases, as little as 50 pence, that it would be a reasonable approach to transfer those balances to office account to clear the entries from the books.

The Law Society-recommended answer to this problem is to send the money to the Solicitors Benevolent Fund, clearly for the

benefit of solicitors.

Since I repaid the money over six months ago, the Law Society has taken no steps to return this money to the clients, thus theoretically adopting my principle set out above.

In other words, the Law Society, whose duty may be greater than mine as it places itself in a position of judgement, proves itself to adopt the same attitude, rightly or wrongly, as I took.

In other words, the amount involved just does not merit the effort required to track down the clients and write letters to them, sending them a very small amount of money.

I do not, therefore, accept that I have been guilty of any dishonesty and I suggest that the Law Society clearly demonstrates double standards and performs no better than I.

Perhaps you would care to invite your readers to judge whether my principle set out above is a reasonable one and whether they would consider my action to have been dishonest.

In response, Nigel Brett, spokesman for the Law Society, said: "The position of the Law Society is that you do not take money to which you are not entitled however small the amount."

Man loses 'last shred of honour'

Ex-solicitor banned as manager

A DISGRACED solicitor from Basingstoke, whose business collapsed with debts of £25,000, has been banned from company management following the scandal.

Antony Doggett, 56, was struck off the professional register of lawyers a year ago for misconduct after taking cash from clients and putting it in his firm's account.

He was found guilty of misconduct at a disciplinary hearing in London and told he could no longer practise as a solicitor.

Now the former high-flyer's downfall is complete after Reading Crown Court last week barred him from holding directorships or running a company for six years.

It was ruled that father-of-two Doggett had signed false documents as his business crumbled, and treated creditors unfairly.

These included VAT returns and accounts, which he later filed at Companies House.

He was also found to have tried to avoid personal liability for debts to the public purse, and his conduct was judged unfit for a director.

When the firm was wound up in June 1999, no payment

was made to unsecured creditors.

Territorial Army member Doggett, who rode on horseback through London for the Parachute Regiment during last year's Lord Mayor's parade, got into hot water when his legal practice - Doggett and Co, of Freemantle Road, Basingstoke - was plunged into debt.

A Law Society investigation in September 1998 revealed a cash shortage of almost £8,000 in accounts, which Doggett admitted had been caused by him transferring money from clients to himself.

It happened after he set up a complex 'honesty account' system to help trace clients who were owed money.

Although he has since repaid the cash, the Solicitors' Disciplinary Tribunal found he had acted dishonestly, and struck him off and ordered him to pay £4,520 costs.

At the hearing, his counsel Jonathan Friend said Doggett had lost his 'last shred of honour' and was 'humiliated'. He claimed the businessman had resorted to living above his former offices.

Lt-Col Patrick Don

LT-COL Patrick A. C. Don died suddenly but peacefully at his home, Axmens Ford, Baughurst, on May 15, the day after his 51st wedding anniversary.

Born in 1913, he was Scottish by birth, but was educated at Horris Hill, Newbury, Winchester College and the RMA Woolwich.

He served in India for nine years and, during this time, went with his regiment, the 5th Field RA to Malaya, where he won the DSO for gallantry during the initial landing of the Japanese in North Malaya. He was severely wounded in both legs and one arm and was evacuated by the last boat out of Singapore back to India to join his wife. After two months, he persuaded the Medical Board to let him return to duty.

After periods at the Staff College in Quetta and the War Office in London, he went to Kiel in Germany as second-in-command of his regiment.

He then served as Company Commander at RMA Sandhurst and finally was Commander of the Federation Military College at Port Dickson, Malaya.

He was active in local life, including the British Legion, the Gunners' Association, the Village Hall, CPRE, and above all at his church, St Catherine's, Wolverton.

He is survived by his widow, three children and three grandchildren. A memorial service is to be held at 11am on Saturday July 1, at St Michael's Church, Basingstoke.

HORSE TRAILER GANG SENT TO PRISON

THREE MEMBERS of a Home Counties-based gang who set out to dispose of £80,000 worth of stolen horse trailers abroad have been jailed.

Oxford Crown Court heard that the gang, some of whom were never traced, stole the trailers late at night from remote farms in Berkshire, North Hampshire and Oxfordshire.

The three men in court, Mr Gerald Hussey, of Burlesden, Southampton, Mr Colin Doyle of The Laurels, Heath End Road, Baughurst and Mr Roy Willis were tracked down in a special operation set up by Newbury police.

Deputy Recorder Price-Lewis said Mr Doyle was the chief organiser of the farm raids with Mr Hussey acting as towman for the stolen trailers.

The court heard that the trailers went to Mr Willis who arranged, through a sophisticated plan to dispose of them via a Maltese business contact.

Both Mr Hussey and Mr Doyle were jailed for three years after they admitted conspiring with others to steal between October 1993 and September 1994.

Motor dealer Mr Roy Willis of Taplow, Buckinghamshire admitted six charges of handling stolen trailers and was sent to prison for six months.

Mr Price-Lewis expressed gratitude to the Newbury police team for their detailed investigation which led to the recovery of the stolen trailers from Malta.
