

The village store was Annie's life

ACCOMPANIED by the warden, I called at the bungalow of Miss Annie Lunn, who remains mobile in the house with the help of a walking frame. She is one of the newcomers, having moved in last June after spending the whole of her life in the Heath End and Baughurst area.

Annie spent 70 years at Heath End, where she was adopted by the Hawkin's family when only 11-months-old. They kept the village store and this is where Annie spent most of her life. After the old folk died, Annie went into partnership to run the shop for about six years, this was after the new Baughurst estate was built, "The shop was so close to the estate that the new development helped trade," said Annie,

When the shop finally closed, Annie made her home at an old cottage in the Baughurst Road.
"Heath End in my

younger days was very quiet," said Annie, "with only a few houses and The Cricketer's public house." As a child, I had to walk the two-and-a-half miles to Tadley Village School, near The Green.

"I am now getting used to living in Silchester, I

moved to my bungalow from the Basingstoke District Hospital where I was a patient for six months. I was rushed to hospital suffering from an ulcer. I use a walking frame because I suffer from arthritis

from arthritis.

"I have had one hip repaired in hospital and am now waiting to have the other one done. I do all my own cooking, with the milkman bringing most of my shopping.

"I was a member of the

Methodist Chapel in Baughurst but, being involved in the shop, had very little time to join any organisations."

Annie has very little knowledge about her family, but said her father was a Mr Walter Lunn, a Basingstoke builder. She has a brother in Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

The one hobby that Annie liked to pursue is gardening, but now in her eighties, that is a thing of the past.

The above doesn't give a true picture of annie. She was brought up by Henry and Sarah Hawkins, who kept a small shop on the corner of Heath End Road and Shyshack Lane, but as she kept the name of Lunn, doubt if she was adopted. She was a servant, unpaid, for most of her life. She was not allowed a social life. When the National Health scheme was introduced in 1948 armie had glasses and false tooth, never being able to afford them. The Hawkins grand-daughter always refers to her as annie hunn, which sums it all up. Her brothers name was lercy and sometimes visited her, with his wife.

Lijssenthoek Military Cemetery is located 11.5 kilometres west of Ieper town centre, on the Boescheepseweg, a road leading from the N308 connecting leper to Poperinge. From leper town centre the Poperingseweg (N308) is reached via Elverdingsestraat, then over two small roundabouts in the J. Capronstraat. The Poperingseweg is a continuation of the J. Capronstraat and begins after a prominent railway level crossing. On reaching Poperinge, the N308 joins the left hand turning onto the R33, Poperinge ring road. The R33 ring continues to the left hand junction with the N38 Frans-Vlaanderenweg. 800 metres along the N38 lies the left hand turning onto Lenestraat. The next immediate right hand turning leads onto Boescheepseweg. The cemetery itself is located 1.5 kilometres along Boescheepseweg on the right hand side of the road. From Calais, take the motorway A16 signposted Dunkerque/Lille. At Dunkerque take the motorway signposted Lille/Ypres, the A25. Leave the motorway at Junction 13, the village of Steenvoorde. Follow the D948/N38 signposted Ieper/Poperinge. After approximately 8-10 kilometres Lijssenthoek Military Cemetery will be signposted off to the right. Please Note: Ypres/ Ieper are the same place: Ypres (French spelling), Ieper (Flemish spelling) Commission signposts are green and white

Historical Information:

The Hazebrouck-Poperinghe railway line and the Poperinghe-Ypres road formed the main communication between the bases and the Flemish battlefields, and Lijssenthoek, lying close behind the extreme range of enemy shell-fire, was a natural position for clearing hospitals. It was first used by the French 15th Hopital D'Evacuation. In June, 1915, it began to be used by British Casualty Clearing Stations; and between that month and the Armistice it became the second greatest British War Cemetery. From April to August, 1918, the Casualty Clearing Stations fell back before the German advance, and Field Ambulances (including a French Ambulance) took their places; and the French graves in Plots XXVI, XXVII, and XXXI recalled the French regiments that were sent to Flanders at that time. Twenty-four British graves in Plot XXXI were brought from isolated positions near Poperinghe after the Armistice.



 Jim and Freda Matthews, today celebrating 50 years of marriage, with their dog Peppi.

A COUPLE paried for six years during the war were drawn even closer together by the experience and eventually married.

Now they are celebrating their golden wedding anniversary.

Jim and Freda Matthews, of Kings Road, South Ham, Basingstoke, met before the Second World War on a bus taking workers to Burghfield.

Jim said: "We knew we were for each other, and we always knew we were going to get married."

Freda said: "But we decided not to get married before he went overseas in case anything happened to him."

Jim was sent abroad and did not see Freda for six years. They kept in touch with a constant exchange of letters.

Jim served with the Royal Signals, which eventually formed part of the Eighth Army in the Western Desert. In 1943 he was at the Battle of Alamein.

During his absence, Freda worked at Thornycofts, in Basingstoke, on electrical wiring on Bren gun carriers. Jim said: "I drove a lot of

Jim said: "I drove a lot of Bren gun carriers and I liked to think that perhaps Freda had made them."

After the end of the war and as soon as Jim knew he was coming home, he wrote to "Fred", as he fondly calls her, and told her to take leave and "fix the wedding".

Freda obtained a special licence from the Bishop of Winchester and the pair were married at St Michael's Church, Basingstoke, on September 15, 1945.

Shortly afterwards, Jim was posted to Austria for a year with the Royal Signals, before his final release in the rank of sargeant.

Both natives of Hampshire, Jim, now 73, was born at Lee-on-Solent and lived at Ravenscroft Farm, Pamber Green, and Freda, now 71, came from South Ham.

The pair lived in a variety of places in Hampshire before settling at Osbourne Close, Basingstoke, where they lived for 25 years before moving to their present home.

Freda worked in canteens and looked after foster children, as well as the couple's own, while Jim did varieus driving jobs, including chauffering, long-distance driving and working as a driving instructor. Dear Derek, our friends Ken & Rosemary Edwards are out in New Zealand visiting their daughter and family. On friday 31st Jan they attended a 'Festival of Lights' in New Plymouth and got talking to one of the men at the gate. His grandfather was the Tadley policeman, Rosemary quoted this part of their conversation: "My grandfather....lived in New Road and was the only cottage on the left hand side as you go to Baughurst. Quite a few cottages on the other side of the road but we were the only one on that side. My grandfather was a big man, his name was Mead. We kids spent a lot of time playing in the meadows around the cottage. We lived in Camberley but often visited our grandparents."

The man talking to Ken & Rosemary was David Mead, they thought in his late sixties and he had settled in

New Zealand 30 years ago after serving in the navy.

This conflicts with the statement on page 91 under 'Policing' where Emie Kimber's statement about Constable Mead was not accepted as the policeman living in Tadley. I had also picked up, and I think it was from Mr Lambden living on The Green, that he remembered that house as being the police house. It is of course now no longer having been knocked down and replaced by 10? houses!

I have an email address for Ken & Rosemary out in New Zealand and I have given them Tads website address. Whether it will get passed onto David Mead is not that likely so if we want to follow that up we will need to search for a David Mead living in New Plymouth NZ.
