Fears for dad, 39, still missing after a week

CONCERN is growing for the safety of a Tadley dad who has been missing for almost a week.

David Lowe (*right*), 39, of Bracknwood Drive, was known to be upset about what the police describe as "family issues".

A Hampshire Police spokeswoman said Mr Lowe, who is married with two daughters, was sent home from his job at a Reading car dealership last Thursday due

to his emotional state.

He was last seen in the car park of a B&Q store in Reading at around 8.40am, having made a purchase in the store.

He is known to have later returned to his home in Tadley to change his clothes. He is believed to be wearing blue jeans, a green jumper, a grey zip jacket and grey trainers.

Mr Lowe - who is described as white, 5ft 7ins tall, with short, straight, brown hair - has a small mole on his face

and wears contact lenses. He was driving a blue Citroen C5, registration RY51 OOC.

The police spokeswoman said: "There have been no sightings of Mr Lowe since last Thursday morning and he has not contacted family or friends."

The police and Mr Lowe's family are concerned for his welfare. Any sightings of Mr Lowe or his car should be reported to Tadley police on 0845 045 45 45.

Frederick Lucas

THE funeral of Mr Frederick James Lucas, of Norn Hill, Basingstoke, has taken place at St Michael's Church, Basingstoke, and was followed by burial at Worting Road cemetery.

Mr Lucas, who spent most of his working life in Basingstoke, was 75. He died suddenly at home.

Born at Froyle, near Alton, he moved to Basingstoke after working on a farm and continued in agriculture with his

father at Buckskin Farm.

He left Buckskin to become a carter at the Sewerage Farm, Swing Swan Lane, Basingstoke, where he eventually became a tractor driver.

Before retirement, he worked at the sewerage disposal plant at Wildmoor.

His great interest in life was cage birds, especially canaries. He had 40 in his aviary at the time of his death.

He was a member of

the Basingstoke Caged Birds Society for over 30 years and many canaries he bred took prizes at shows over a wide area.

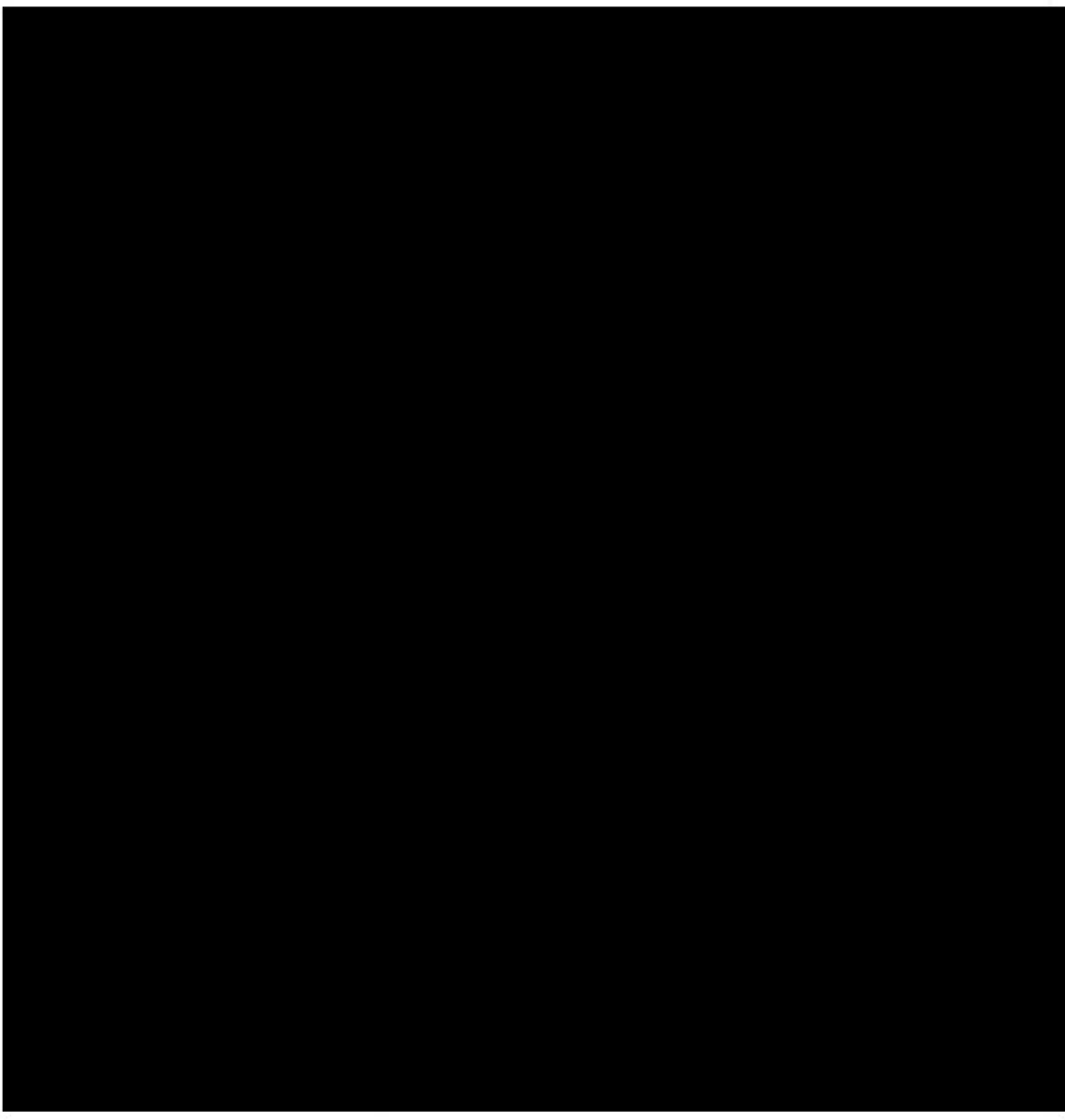
As an agricultural worker he was not allowed to join the forces during the Second World War. He was, however, in Civil Defence as a member of the decontamination squad.

He leaves a widow, Reata, son Stanley, and daughter Marion.

The village store was Annie's life

ACCOMPANIED by the warden, I called at the bungalow of Miss Annie Lunn, who remains mobile in the house with the help of a walking frame. She is one of the newcomers, having moved in last June after spending the whole of her life in the Heath End and Baughurst area.

Annie spent 70 years at Heath End, where she was adopted by the Hawkin's family when only 11-months-old. They kept the village store and this is where Annie spent most of her life. After the old folk died, Annie went into partnership to run the shop for about six years, this was after the new Baughurst estate was built. "The shop was so close to the estate that the new development helped trade," said Annie.

When the shop finally closed, Annie made her home at an old cottage in the Baughurst Road.

"Heath End in my younger days was very quiet," said Annie, "with only a few houses and The Cricketer's public house." As a child, I had to walk the two-and-a-half miles to Tadley Village School, near The Green.

"I am now getting used to living in Silchester. I

moved to my bungalow from the Basingstoke District Hospital where I was a patient for six months. I was rushed to hospital suffering from an ulcer. I use a walking frame because I suffer from arthritis.

"I have had one hip repaired in hospital and am now waiting to have the other one done. I do all my own cooking, with the milkman bringing most of my shopping.

"I was a member of the

Methodist Chapel in Baughurst but, being involved in the shop, had very little time to join any organisations."

Annie has very little knowledge about her family, but said her father was a Mr Walter Lunn, a Basingstoke builder. She has a brother in Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

The one hobby that Annie liked to pursue is gardening, but now in her eighties, that is a thing of the past.

The above doesn't give a true picture of Annie. She was brought up by Henry and Sarah Hawkins, who kept a small shop on the corner of Heath End Road and Shyshack Lane, but as she kept the name of Lunn, doubt if she was adopted. She was a servant, unpaid, for most of her life. She was not allowed a social life. When the National Health scheme was introduced in 1948 Annie had glasses and false teeth, never being able to afford them. The Hawkins grand-daughter always refers to her as Annie Lunn, which sums it all up. Her brother's name was Percy and sometimes visited her, with his wife.

Lijssenthoek Military Cemetery is located 11.5 kilometres west of Ieper town centre, on the Boescheepseweg, a road leading from the N308 connecting Ieper to Poperinge. From Ieper town centre the Poperingseweg (N308) is reached via Elverdingsestraat, then over two small roundabouts in the J. Capronstraat. The Poperingseweg is a continuation of the J. Capronstraat and begins after a prominent railway level crossing. On reaching Poperinge, the N308 joins the left hand turning onto the R33, Poperinge ring road. The R33 ring continues to the left hand junction with the N38 Frans-Vlaanderenweg. 800 metres along the N38 lies the left hand turning onto Lenestraat. The next immediate right hand turning leads onto Boescheepseweg. The cemetery itself is located 1.5 kilometres along Boescheepseweg on the right hand side of the road. From Calais, take the motorway A16 signposted Dunkerque/Lille. At Dunkerque take the motorway signposted Lille/Ypres, the A25. Leave the motorway at Junction 13, the village of Steenvoorde. Follow the D948/N38 signposted Ieper/Poperinge. After approximately 8-10 kilometres Lijssenthoek Military Cemetery will be signposted off to the right. Please Note: Ypres/ Ieper are the same place: Ypres (French spelling), Ieper (Flemish spelling) Commission signposts are green and white

**Historical
Information:**

The Hazebrouck-Poperinghe railway line and the Poperinghe-Ypres road formed the main communication between the bases and the Flemish battlefields, and Lijssenthoek, lying close behind the extreme range of enemy shell-fire, was a natural position for clearing hospitals. It was first used by the French 15th Hopital D'Evacuation. In June, 1915, it began to be used by British Casualty Clearing Stations; and between that month and the Armistice it became the second greatest British War Cemetery. From April to August, 1918, the Casualty Clearing Stations fell back before the German advance, and Field Ambulances (including a French Ambulance) took their places; and the French graves in Plots XXVI, XXVII, and XXXI recalled the French regiments that were sent to Flanders at that time. Twenty-four British graves in Plot XXXI were brought from isolated positions near Poperinghe after the Armistice.

There are now nearly 10,000, 1914-18 war casualties commemorated in this site.

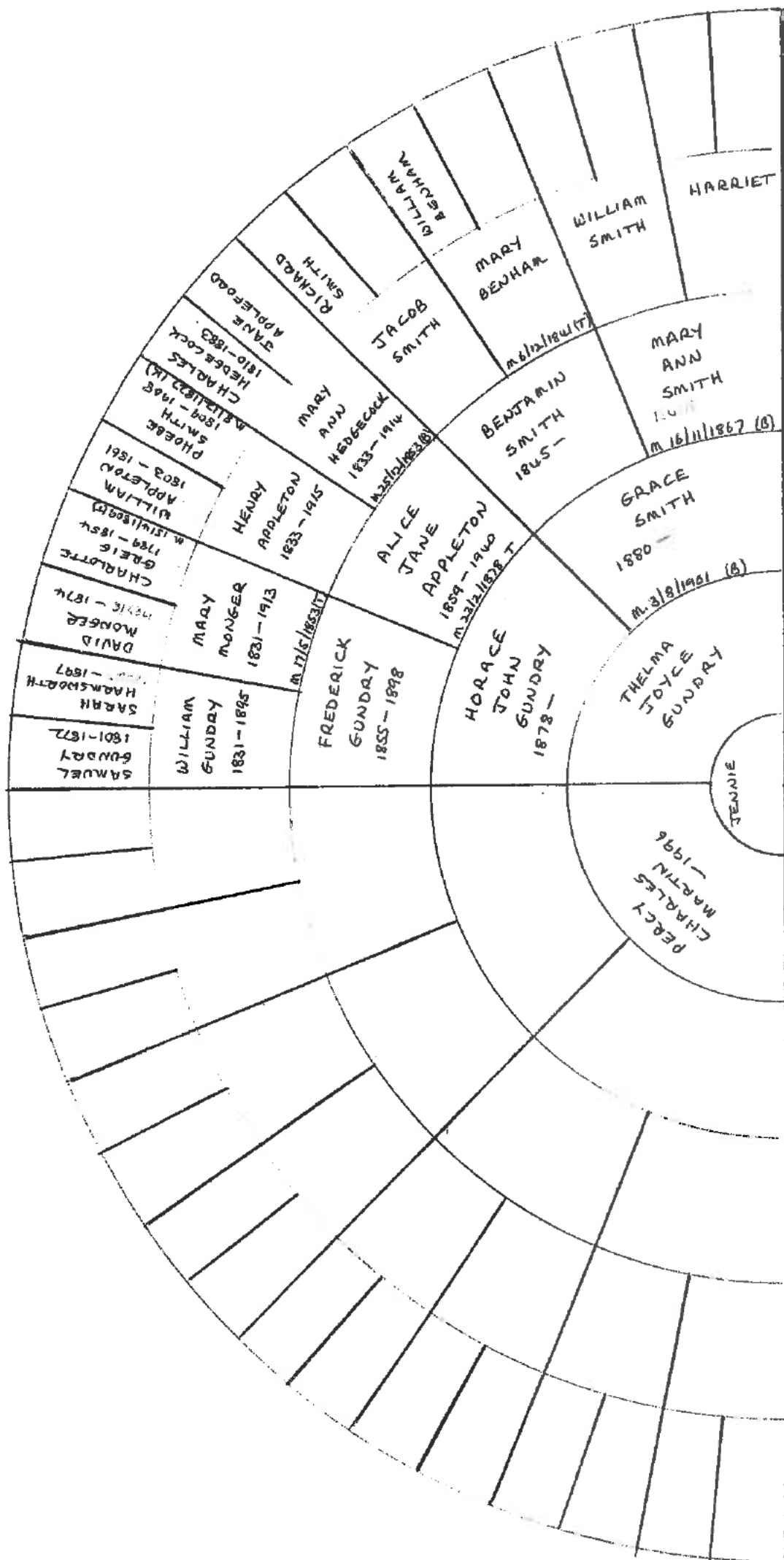

INFORMATION FROM PAULINE (WINIFRED'S DATE OF BIRTH)

The golden years

A COUPLE parted for six years during the war were drawn even closer together by the experience and eventually married.

Now they are celebrating their golden wedding anniversary.

Jim and Freda Matthews, of Kings Road, South Ham, Basingstoke, met before the Second World War on a bus taking workers to Burghfield.

Jim said: "We knew we were for each other, and we always knew we were going to get married."

Freda said: "But we decided not to get married before he went overseas in case anything happened to him."

Jim was sent abroad and did not see Freda for six years. They kept in touch with a constant exchange of letters.

Jim served with the Royal Signals, which eventually formed part of the Eighth Army in the Western Desert. In 1943 he was at the Battle of Alamein.

During his absence, Freda worked at Thornycrofts, in Basingstoke, on electrical wiring on Bren gun carriers.

Jim said: "I drove a lot of Bren gun carriers and I liked to think that perhaps Freda had made them."

After the end of the war and as soon as Jim knew he was coming home, he wrote to "Fred", as he fondly calls her, and told her to take leave and "fix the wedding".

Freda obtained a special licence from the Bishop of Winchester and the pair were married at St Michael's Church, Basingstoke, on September 15, 1945.

Shortly afterwards, Jim was posted to Austria for a year with the Royal Signals, before his final release in the rank of sergeant.

Both natives of Hampshire, Jim, now 73, was born at Lee-on-Solent and lived at Ravenscroft Farm, Pamber Green, and Freda, now 71, came from South Ham.

The pair lived in a variety of places in Hampshire before settling at Osbourne Close, Basingstoke, where they lived for 25 years before moving to their present home.

Freda worked in canteens and looked after foster children, as well as the couple's own, while Jim did various driving jobs, including chauffeuring, long-distance driving and working as a driving instructor. He worked for SSI Fix, Basingstoke, where he ran the ambulance room and first-aid post, as well as fork lift driving for eight years until he retired at 65.

He still wanted to work and found himself a job driving a printer supplies van until he gave up two years ago at the age of 71.

The couple have two children, Mark and Pam, and three grandchildren, Destiny, Lisa and Emma.

THE school bus was where Bill and Mary Mansbridge fell in love as they travelled daily on the Nancy Bus.

This led to their marriage by the Rev Wickstead on March 26, 1941, at Sherborne St John Church – the same day as Overton Paper Mills were bombed.

Despite the enemy action, they snatched a few days honeymoon at Arborfield Cross. And so began the last 60 years.

When I arrived at their Dancer's Meadow home, where the couple have lived for 32 years, I was asked which I preferred, the old Basingstoke, or the new. I guessed the answer they wanted. They have always lived away from urban surroundings, mostly at Sherborne St John where Mary has served on practically every committee.

As for Bill, when he returned from the Army he played for the local soccer team and has since held every office and is now life president.

With two friends, he left Hackwood Park to work on forestry at Meriden and this is why he joined the Royal Warwickshire Regiment.

Dear Derek, our friends Ken & Rosemary Edwards are out in New Zealand visiting their daughter and family. On Friday 31st Jan they attended a 'Festival of Lights' in New Plymouth and got talking to one of the men at the gate. His grandfather was the Tadley policeman, Rosemary quoted this part of their conversation: "My grandfather....lived in New Road and was the only cottage on the left hand side as you go to Baughurst. Quite a few cottages on the other side of the road but we were the only one on that side. My grandfather was a big man, his name was Mead. We kids spent a lot of time playing in the meadows around the cottage. We lived in Camberley but often visited our grandparents."

The man talking to Ken & Rosemary was David Mead, they thought in his late sixties and he had settled in New Zealand 30 years ago after serving in the navy.

This conflicts with the statement on page 91 under 'Policing' where Ernie Kimber's statement about Constable Mead was not accepted as the policeman living in Tadley. I had also picked up, and I think it was from Mr Lambden living on The Green, that he remembered that house as being the police house. It is of course now no longer having been knocked down and replaced by 10? houses!

I have an email address for Ken & Rosemary out in New Zealand and I have given them Tads website address. Whether it will get passed onto David Mead is not that likely so if we want to follow that up we will need to search for a David Mead living in New Plymouth NZ.

Trust you are both well. Mike. I know I have to pay my sub!!

Children of Albert Edwin & Annie Mead baptised at Baughurst 1913, 1915, 1920 and a son married at Baughurst in 1922. Mr Mead was caretaker at Tadley School for a number of years after he retired from the Police Force, when he lived at New Road, Tadley.

Ballet school dreams hang by a thread

WHEN 10-year-old Shaun Mendum found out he had been accepted into one of the country's most prestigious ballet schools, he thought his dream had come true.

But just five weeks after being told the good news, his family were informed by Elmhurst School for Dance in Birmingham that there had been a mistake in the application.

Instead, the family have been told they will have to pay thousands of pounds in unexpected tuition fees they can't afford after a mix-up on the form.

The talented youngster, who has wanted to be a professional dancer since he was six years old, is a pupil at Silchester Primary School and has regular dance les-

sons at Daphne Bennett School of Dance, in Burghfield Common.

During the last few years Shaun (*pictured*) has appeared in several shows including *The Sleeping Beauty* with the English Youth Ballet and also trains with The Royal Ballet.

Shaun's dad, David Mendum, of Hazel Green, in Baughurst, said: "When we applied for Shaun to go to Elmhurst, my wife Maryann and I thought we were applying for an aided place that would be partly-funded by the Government.

"Then we found out there'd been a mix-up and we'd accidentally ticked the box for a fee-paying place, so wouldn't be means tested."

Mr Mendum, who is a deputy facility manager at the Atomic

Weapons Establishment in Aldermaston, added: "The fees are £15,000 per year, but with travelling expenses and uniforms it'll be more like £19,000, and he would be there until he is 16 years old.

"We didn't have the heart to tell Shaun at first because he has been doing his SAT exams at school and we didn't want to upset him. Now we've explained it to him and he's devastated."

Shaun's parents, who have a combined income of £40,000, are worried that despite fundraising efforts by friends and family, they will not be able to raise enough cash and are hoping that kind-hearted donors or a sponsor may come forward.
