# What the maid saw

**IMAGINE being asked to leave home and work for a strange family as a 12-year-old.**

Of course, that wouldn't be allowed to happen now, but back in 1894, that was not at all unusual, especially when many people worked in domestic service.

That was the case for Louisa Paice, who came from a large Basingstoke family.

Her family home was at 34 Chapel Street. Now long since demolished, it was roughly in front of the Winterthur Life headquarters, near the railway station.

Little did Louisa know that she would eventually travel the world working in such far-flung places as Switzerland, Japan and Bolivia.

Her memories of life in domestic service can be read in a fascinating pamphlet called *Louisa Paice of Basingstoke: 'My early life in service'*, published by her niece Diana Mackarill, who lives in Reading.

Describing her Auntie Lou as "a lovely lady - sweet and charming, sensible and intelligent", Mrs Mackarill said: "I've published the pamphlet because I thought the material was interesting."

"It was the incidental detail that I thought was something I haven't read in other accounts from people in service, and was therefore worth giving to a wider public."

Louisa's first job was working for the Roper family, who lived at Brewery House, on the corner of Brook Street and Chapel Street.

In the pamphlet, she describes the house as "standing off the main road, rather attractive with bay windows and walls covered in ivy kept neatly trimmed".

Today it is the site of The Anvil, on Churchill Way, opposite Chute House.

Louisa also tells of how her duties at her new home were explained.

She said: "I was told I should be required to

do light work, such as laying up the table for meals, keeping things tidy, helping to look after the children in the afternoon and, after tea, conducting them to the meadow, keeping an eye on them until bedtime, which in those days meant six o'clock."

Later she moved to work for the Jacksons, who lived at West Ham House, now West Ham Industrial Estate.

On being interviewed for the job as between maid, her employer, Mrs Hardie Jackson, told Louisa that she would have to wait on nursery meals twice a day, carrying trays upstairs with breakfast and lunch for the children and two nurses.

She had to clean the nurseries immediately after breakfast and continue with light housework until midday.

Her condition of employment also meant that she was required to go to nearby St Michael's Church on alternate Sundays, where she would often be required to blow the church organ for an hour-and-a-half.

The position at West Ham House met with approval from her great aunt, who remarked "that to have one's feet under a good table was something to be considered".

It appears that Louisa (pictured above left, aged 25) had a happy time working for the Jacksons, who took her to their new home in London and then on to Oldbury Hall, near Atherstone, in Warwickshire.

In briefly mentioning some details about her aunt's later life, Mrs Mackarill said that her aunt next moved to London to work for the Mills family until 1925, and then took up a post as lady's maid to an ambassadorial family.

It was because of this that she was able to work, at various times, in Switzerland, Tokyo and, later, in Bolivia and Peru.

Mrs Mackarill said: "During these travels, she kept a diary and filled scrapbooks with cards, photographs and press cuttings, includ-

ing those relating to the social events of the family.

"Among these souvenirs are menus and passenger lists from the Japanese ship that took them from Tokyo to Honolulu, then to America in 1940, just before the outbreak of war in that region."

When Louisa retired in the 1950s she returned to Basingstoke and lived with her sister Amy, before passing away in 1974.

# Family had a hand in shaping the town

**LAST week, Memories on Monday focused on the pamphlet *Louisa Paice of Basingstoke, "My early life in service"*.**

It contains the recollection of a young woman who, back in 1894, worked for the Roper family at Brewery House, at May's Brewery, Basingstoke, where The Anvil now stands.

Miss Paice, who passed away in 1974, could never have imagined how the small quiet market town would transform into the busy commercial hub it is today. Nor could she have imagined that her brother Charles would have played a part in that change.

He was the father of Diana Mackarill, who compiled the fascinating pamphlet.

Mrs Mackarill said: "My father was on the county and town council at the time of the redevelopment of Basingstoke.

"He also served as mayor, so I think he was very much involved in the changes.

"I don't think the older people liked the disappearance of old Basingstoke, but on the other hand, I know my father was keen to provide better housing for all the people in crowded London.

"That's why he was very much in favour of it, though he was quite interested in preserving a bit more of the old town."

Mrs Mackarill's grandfather, Henry Goodall, also had a hand in how the town developed, but that was back in Victorian times.

He set up a building firm in 1875, which is still going strong as Goodall Barnard

nearly came to an abrupt end, as Mrs Mackarill, who lives in Reading, explained.

She said: "My grandfather was involved in a shipwreck in 1873, just off Halifax Harbour, in Nova Scotia, Canada.

"He was among many Basingstoke people on the RMS Atlantic, which belonged to the White Star Line. He had gone with other craftsmen to help rebuild Chicago after the great fire there in 1871."

Mrs Mackarill said her grandfather fortunately survived the ordeal, but many others weren't so lucky.

She added: "He was rescued by a line from a rock to an island and then by local fishermen's boats after many hours."

Mrs Mackarill said that generous local people had clubbed together to provide clothing and buy tools for the craftsmen.

Sadly, it is believed that about 750 people out of 959 on board when the ship left Liverpool perished.

Although reports of the disaster vary, the ship's manifest showed there were 156 women and 189 children on board. All of them drowned except one lucky boy, John Hindley.

Owned by the White Star Line, RMS Atlantic shares the distinction of being the first of its ocean liners to sink, followed 89 years later by the ill-fated Titanic.

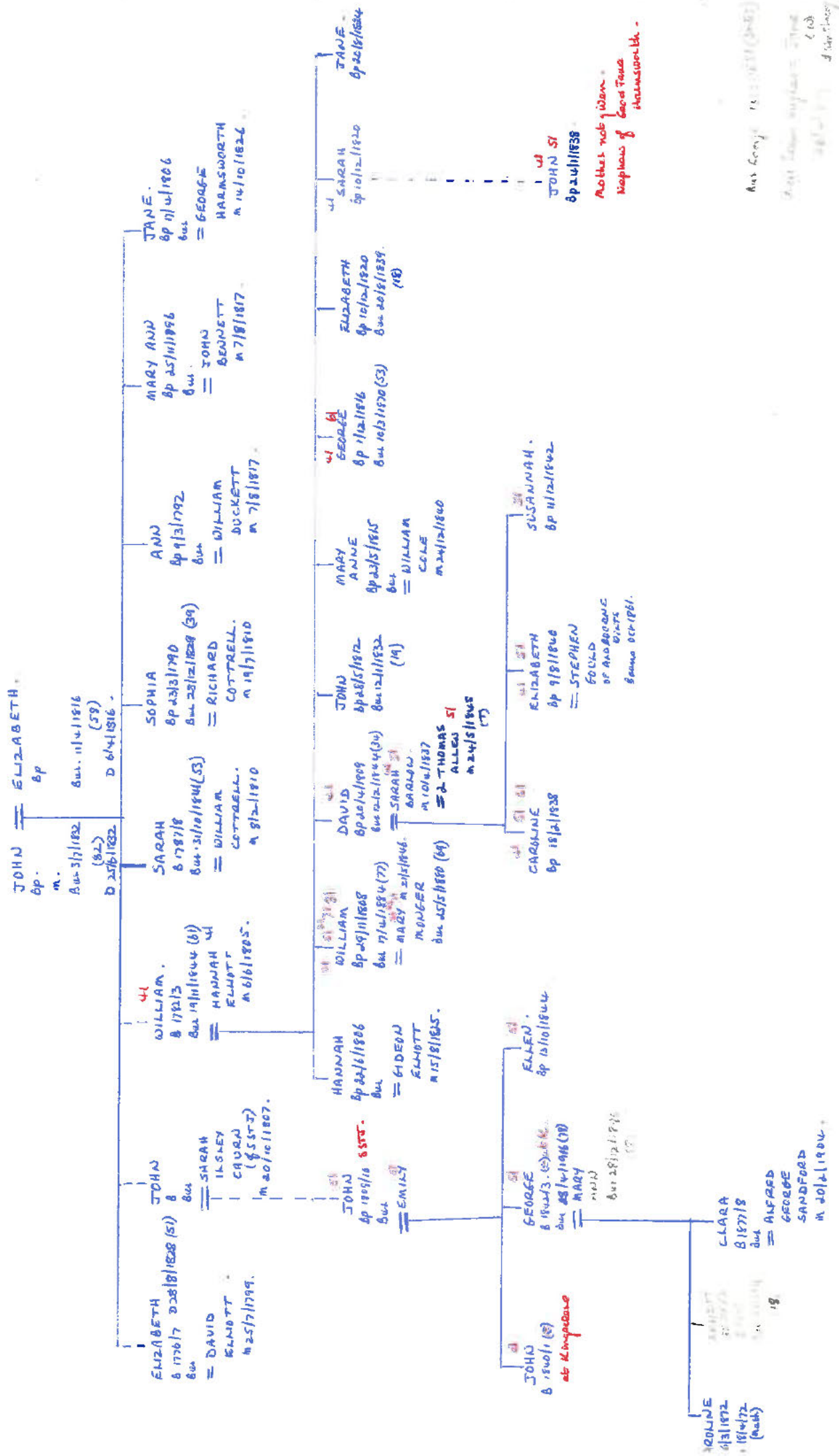

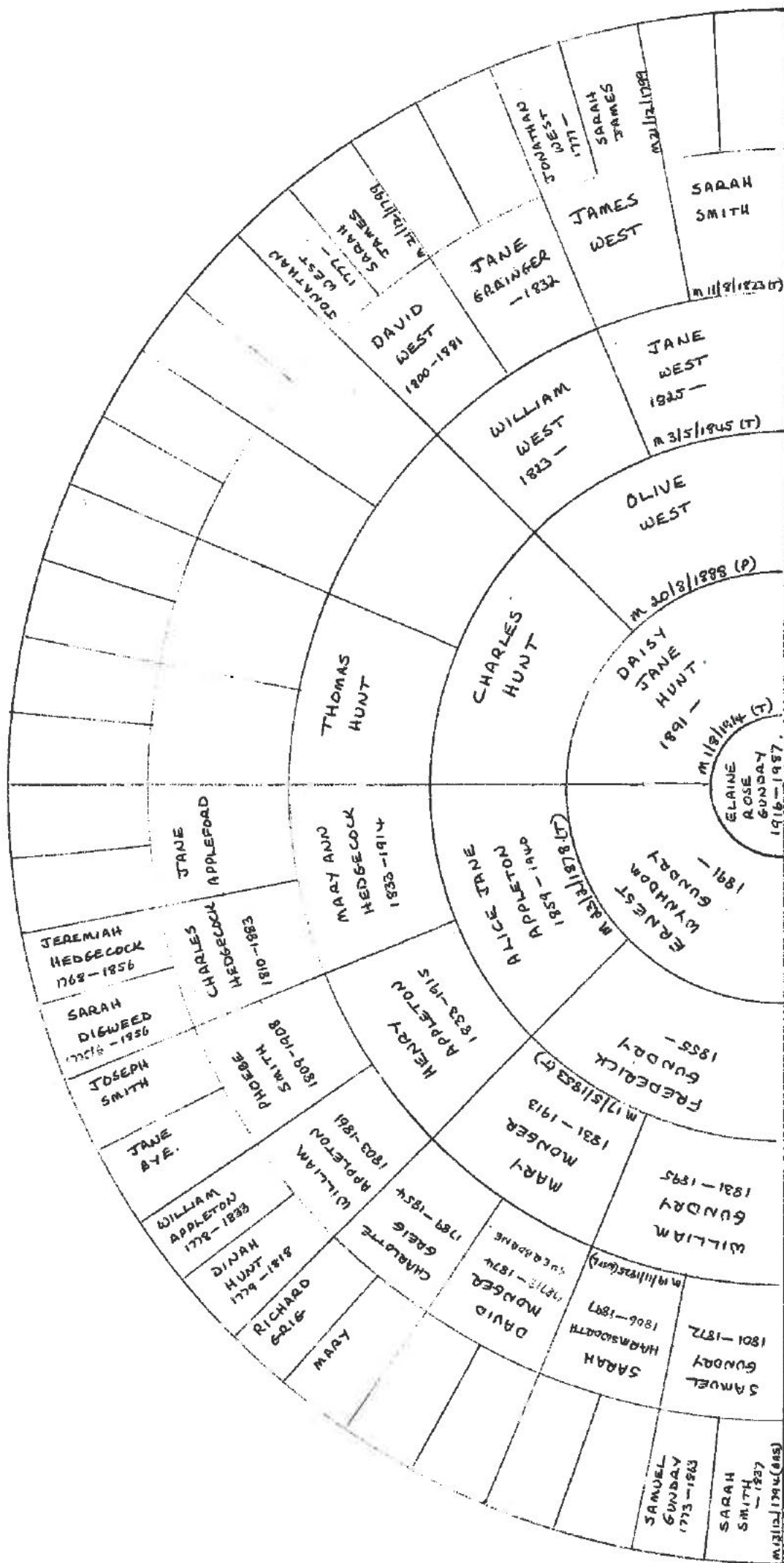

## Mother courage and her quads are a picture of joy

IF Sue Poole had heeded medical opinion, this picture of happiness would never have been taken.

She and husband Perry had been told that terminating two of the quads in the womb would give the other two a better chance of life.

But after five years of trying to start a family they refused to make the heartbreaking decision. And their courage paid off with the healthy arrival of two boys and two girls.

The babies — each weighing in at between three and four pounds — arrived seven weeks early and have now gone home in time for Christmas.

"Someone said that one day this will mean four weddings," Perry joked last night.

"The way we're going I think it will be four weddings and our two funerals."

### Scare

After years of failure, legal executive Sue, 33, decided on a one-off attempt at fertility treatment. Against all the odds she soon fell pregnant, and during a scare about an ovarian cyst doctors discovered four heartbeats.

But joy was tempered as doctors strongly advised that two babies would have the best chance.

"We considered it but there was no way we could do it," said Perry, 36. "The doctors stood by our decision and luckily it has paid off."

The couple, from Baughurst, Hampshire, who have been married for 12 years, have named the babies Kieran, Charlotte, Deanna and Gregory.

Perry, a civilian worker for Thames Valley police, said: "We know four little ones are going to be expensive but they are worth their weight in gold."

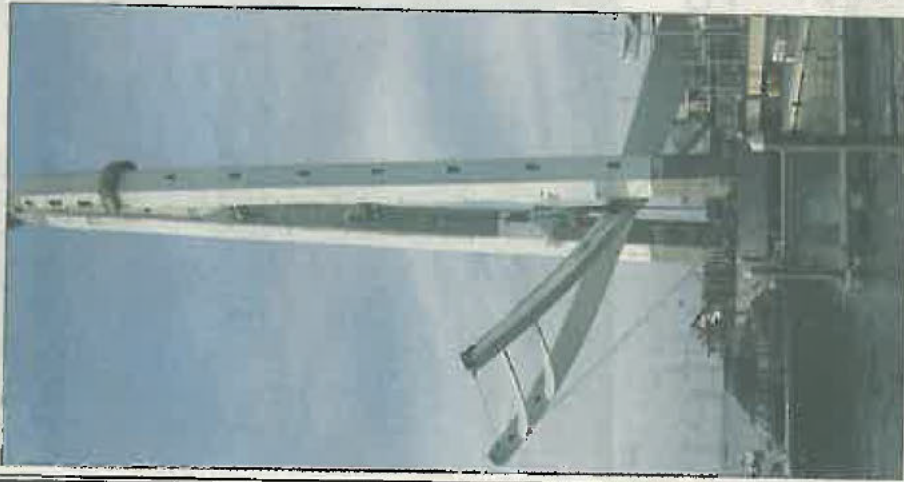

# Designers reach new heights



ONE of the most adventurous buildings ever to be designed marks another success story for Scott Wilson, the Basingstoke-based Hampshire Company of the Year.

Scott Wilson, the international consultancy firm based in Basing View, is the lead designer for the Spinnaker Tower in Portsmouth, which rises 170 metres above sea level and will be the tallest publicly-accessible building in the UK outside London.

As John Tubman, Scott Wilson's project director, watched the Spinnaker slowly being lifted into place, he said: "This is a significant moment in the life of the tower.

"The project is unique and has required innovative design solutions and enormous dedication from our design team.

"It will be one of the most exciting structures in the UK and will undoubtedly become one of the icons for structural engineering - not only in the UK but world-wide."

The tower stands on a postage stamp site beside Portsmouth's Gunwharf Quays development and will be a shining white beacon for ferries arriving from the Continent and a welcome home to naval vessels as they enter the historic harbour.

As well as a spectacular waterfront sculpture, the tower (left) will be an observation platform for the public when it is due to open in the late summer.

Mr Tubman said: "We had to ensure, by careful calculation and investigation, that visitors to the three observation decks at about 110 metres above sea level would not feel queasy in response to the inevitable motion of the structure in the wind."

Visitors will reach the observation decks



by an external panorama lift, allowing them to experience 23-mile views over the city, the South Coast and the Isle of Wight.

Mr Tubman (above) added: "We are naturally delighted to have played a pivotal role as structural designer and lead consultant."

The majority of the funding for the tower came from the Millennium Commission and Portsmouth City Council.

As well as being Hampshire Company of the Year, Scott Wilson was a finalist for the Environmental Award category in the 2003 Basingstoke Business Awards.

## Two die in plane crash

A TADLEY man and his girlfriend were killed on Sunday when their light aircraft plummeted 200 feet into a cornfield.

It happened just after they had taken off from an airstrip near Weldon, Northants.

Stephen Prictoe, 31, who lived in Main Road, had flown to a meeting of Pulsar aircraft enthusiasts in Northamptonshire with his girlfriend 30-year-old Kim Stonehouse from Swindon.

The couple set off to fly home shortly after 4pm, but moments after take-off the two-seater plane turned to the right and dropped out of the sky.

Shocked onlookers rushed to the plane, but the couple had been killed on impact.

Eyewitness Alan Gill, a fellow Pulsar enthusiast, said: "The time came for people to go and everyone was watching the take-offs.

"Stephen's plane took off okay. After a few seconds, the plane started to turn. I don't know why, but it just dropped out of the sky and hit the ground," he added.

Air accident investigators have begun their inquiry.

□ Pulsars are single-engined kit-built planes. The wings fold away to allow the aircraft to be towed behind a car.
