Location: Voormezele Enclosure No. 3 is located 4 kilometres south-west of Ieper town centre on the Ruusschaartstraat, a road leading from the Kemmelseweg (Connecting Ieper to Kemmel N331). From Ieper town centre the Kemmelseweg is reached via the Rijselsestraat, through the Lille Gate (Rijselpoort) and straight on towards Armentieres (N365). 900 metres after the crossroads is the right hand turning onto the Kemmelseweg (made prominent by a railway level crossing). Turn right onto the Kemmelseweg and follow this road to the first crossroads, turn left here into Ruusschaartstraat. The Cemetery is located 1 kilometre after this junction on the left hand side of the road just before Voormezele Dorp.

Historical Information: The Voormezele Enclosures (at one time four in number, but now reduced to three) were originally regimental groups of graves, begun very early in the First World War and gradually increased until the village and the cemeteries were captured by the Germans after very heavy fighting on 29 April 1918. Voormezele Enclosure No 3, the largest of these burial grounds, was begun by the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry in February 1915. Their graves are in Plot III, the other Plots from I to IX are the work of other units, or pairs of units, and include a few graves of October 1918. Plots X and XII are of a more general character. Plots XIII to XVI were made after the Armistice when graves were brought in from isolated sites and smaller cemeteries. These concentrated graves cover the months from January 1915 to October 1918, and they include those of many men of the 15th Hampshires and other units who recaptured this ground early in September 1918. There are now 1,611 Commonwealth servicemen of the First World War buried or commemorated in Voormezele Enclosure No 3. 609 of the burials are unidentified but there are special memorials to 15 casualties known or believed to be buried among them. Other special memorials record the names of five casualties whose graves in another cemetery could not be found on concentration. The cemetery was designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens.

They were originally regimental groups of graves, begun very early in the War and gradually increased until the village and the cemeteries were captured by the enemy (after very heavy fighting) on the 29th April, 1918. Voormezele Enclosure No. 3, the largest of these burial grounds, was begun by the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry in February, 1915. Their graves are in Plot III, the other Plots from I to IX are the work of other units, or pairs of units, and include a few graves of October, 1918. Plots X and XII are of a more general character. Plots XIII to XVI, were made after the Armistice by the concentration of isolated graves and smaller cemeteries, and at the same time the French graves (of April and September, 1918) were removed to a French cemetery. The concentrated graves cover the months from January, 1915 to October, 1918, and they include those of many men of the 15th Hants and other units who recaptured this ground early in September, 1918. There are now over 1,500, 1914-18 war casualties commemorated in this site. Of these, over 600 are unidentified and special memorials are erected to twelve soldiers from the United Kingdom and three from Australia, known or believed to be buried among them. Five other special memorials record the names of soldiers from the United Kingdom, buried in Pheasant Wood Cemetery, whose graves could not be found on concentration. The Enclosure covers an area of 5,745 square metres and is enclosed by a brick wall.

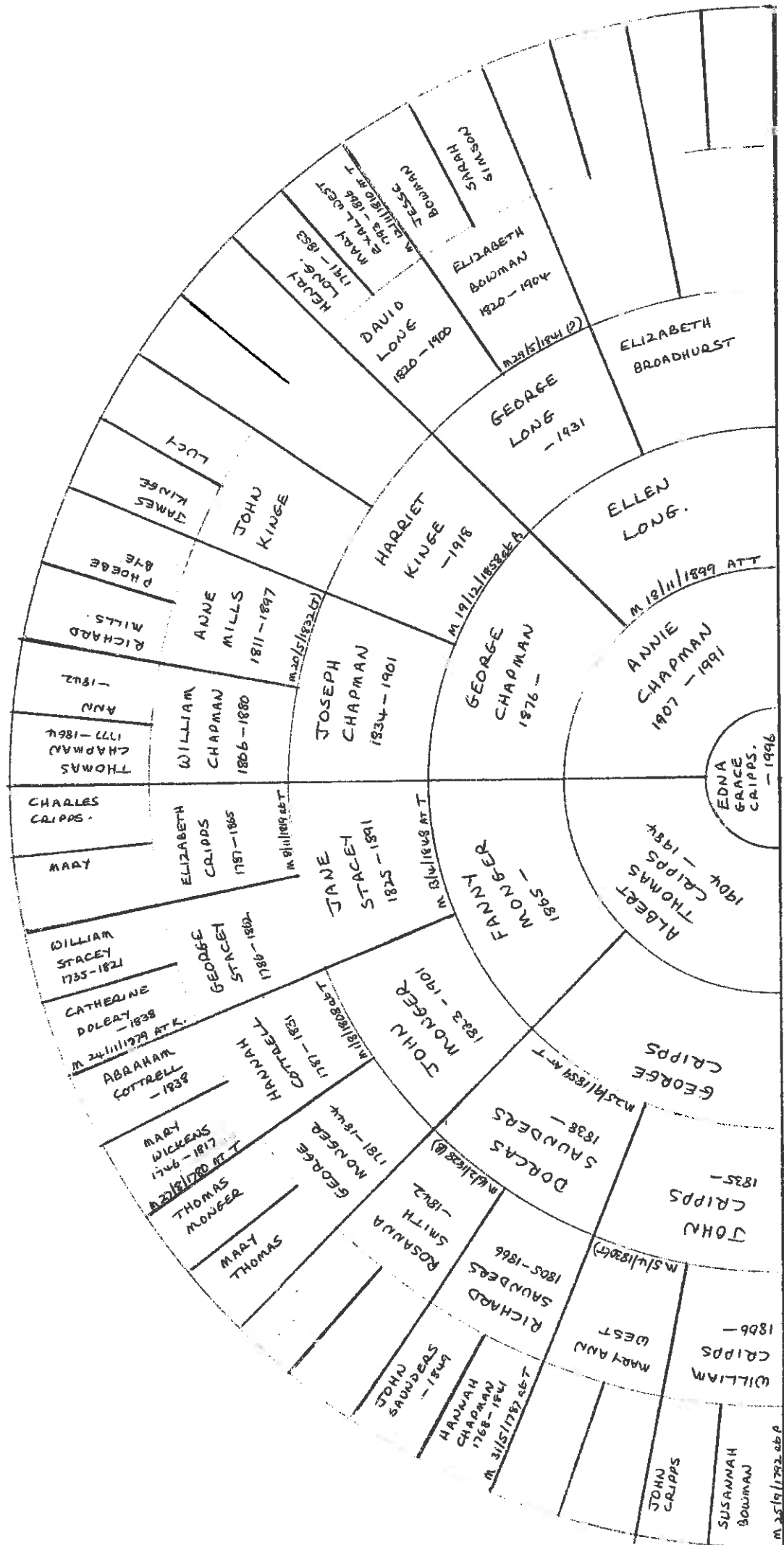

Following a Dream

Despite attempts to move to France or Somerset, my husband, Doug, and I have bought a house in Tadley and come back to our roots. Perhaps it was meant to be. So many doors were closed to us during the last year, but then, when the final door opened, it was a better opportunity than we had ever imagined it would be. So I believe that God led us to this house.

Our house is the oldest house in Tadley – it must be – everyone keeps telling us that it is! I do not yet know exactly how old it is, but it is older than 400 years and could be as old as 600 years, as one of the beams in the bedroom was dated as 600 years old. The house is well-known among many local people as 'Nellie Grant's old cottage', rather than as 'Burrells Farm', its formal name, because Miss Grant lived here from 1927 until 2001, and had many friends locally.

It is a pretty timber-framed thatched cottage, set in about 8 acres of garden and pastureland on the edge of Tadley. It has several quaint old outbuildings, dilapidated, but utterly charming. Many of them are Grade II listed, as is the house, and many listing, some to the point of collapse. We have 2 fields, south-facing, gently sloping down to a little stream, lined with trees and full of wild flowers. The garden, too, is charming – a romantic jungle of flowering shrubs, brambles and songbirds. We have lots of wildlife (some of it in the bathroom on occasions) due to nature being left pretty much to its own devices here for some years. Shy deer sometimes come up from the fields to the garden. Bold rabbits hop about the lawns munching grass. I noticed that some of them had grey faces and wondered if we had a sub-species living here – until I realised there is an extensive warren in the soot heap at the bottom of the garden! This huge mound must date back hundreds of years and contains not only the ashes of thousands of fires, but also intriguing old rubbish – ancient bottles, rusty farm implements, leaded light windows, milk churns.....

So why did we buy this particular house? Well, I have always wanted a smallholding – somewhere in the countryside where I can grow my own food and appreciate the amazing natural world around me. We grew fruit, vegetables and herbs at our house in Bracknell, and kept a few chickens there, too, but I did not have enough space in the garden to keep some other animals so we felt the time had come to move. Doug's transfers to the Somerset or French branch of his company fell through after months of negotiation so we decided to look in the Reading area, although we didn't hold much hope of finding a house with several acres in our price range here. I remember describing our requirements to a Tadley estate agent and being told that it would be way out of our price bracket. I replied that it did not matter how much work the place needed – we would consider anything rural with land. He said that a place like that would only come onto the market about once every ten years around here and that we should not wait. So we went home and tried the internet. Late one Sunday evening, having almost given up hope, we clicked on a picture of a pretty cottage in idle curiosity and were absolutely amazed when, tacked on the end of the particulars, almost as an afterthought, we read the words "Paddock extending to approximately 7.25 acres". We had found our new home.

I grew up in Pamber Heath surrounded by Pamber Forest and two commons and have always loved the English countryside and its plants and wildlife. The intricacies of God's creation never fail to fascinate. I also enjoy producing food; there is something very special about eating something you have grown yourself. Harvest is one of my favourite times of the year. This year it was very special for me as I took some apples from one of the Burrells Farm apple trees and said thankyou to God not only for our wonderful crops of apples, blackberries and hazelnuts, but also for our long-awaited little farm.

Chicks at Burrells Farm



As I write this I am eagerly awaiting our first baby chicks of the year. Hopefully, by the time you read this, they will be growing well.

In February last year, one of our hens went broody and on 14th March, 3 chicks were born. Our first baby chicks! It was all very exciting. Since then, we have had several more broods. It takes 21 days exactly until an incubated fertile egg hatches. When a hen goes broody she just sits quietly on her nest all day, only leaving it once a day to eat and drink. Her feathers fluff up and her tail is wider during this time. A few days before the first egg is due to hatch, I put her into the broody coop with her eggs. This persuades her to stay on the nest until all the eggs are hatched. There is room in the coop for a dish of chick crumbs and a bowl of water. When a chick has hatched, it does not need food and water for the first 24 hours, but it needs to stay warm under its mother to dry its feathers. On the second day of its life the mother teaches it to eat by picking up a small morsel of food and dropping it next to the chick, pecking next to it and chirping. The chicks learn very quickly. They soon learn how to drink water. They sway unsteadily on their legs, following their mother and watching her. Later they learn how to scratch for food and dust-bathe. It is fascinating to watch them grow. When they are big enough, they are allowed to free-range with the other hens.

In church recently we had a reading from Luke 13 v. 34, which mentioned a mother hen gathering her chicks under her wings. It is a lovely analogy for the caring love of Jesus, which we can choose to accept or to ignore. The mother hen really does care for her chicks very well indeed.

Half the chicks born are cockerels. It is not a good idea to keep a lot of cockerels, as they will fight. Indeed, the young ones did have some impressive sparring matches at times, their heads drawn up high, trying to look as tall as possible, and their neck feathers all sticking out like a big ruff. They are not good pets – they make an incredible amount of noise for such a small animal! As they grew big enough, they were each eaten for supper and very nice they were too. Although it is never pleasant to have to kill an animal for food, if they have had an enjoyable life and are killed quickly without distress, then my conscience is clear. Farm animals were bred to produce food and without this use they would disappear from our countryside and that would be a great loss.

I persuaded my husband that we should keep one cockerel and we have chosen the quietest. I like the sound of the crowing, but I am a heavy sleeper, not easily woken at dawn. Doug, on the other hand, is a light sleeper and does not like the noise. The cockerel we are keeping is a handsome fellow with a big golden ruff, lovely long sickle tail feathers and a mild temperament, who looks after his 'girls'.

Bantams at Burrells Farm



We have a flock of bantams at Burrells Farm - our first proper farm animals. We brought one elderly bantam hen with us when we moved in - the last remaining survivor of our previous flock. She seemed lonely, so I decided to get some more bantams to keep her company. My father and I made one of our outbuildings fox-proof and built a fox-proof run in front of it. The nest boxes for the chickens to lay in are converted from old orange boxes found in our barns. Chickens like to lay in dark secretive places, so the nest boxes are in a dark corner of the hen house with some screening over the front.

When everything was ready, a friend gave us some of his spare bantams, including some young cockerels. As they were nearly all young birds, we thought they would not alienate our old bantam who was not from their flock. However, she decided that she did not like this young rabble who made such a noise, and looked down her beak at them. After a week I decided to build her a special perch so she could roost in peace, and let her out into the garden by herself during the day so she could sunbathe quietly by the shrubbery. She was very old and had a lovely retirement. We were given 13 bantams - a mother hen with 5 half-grown chicks (3 of which would grow into cockerels), 3 pullets (young hens not laying yet) and 4 young cockerels.

The pullets did not take long to come into lay and a few weeks after we obtained them, they started producing eggs. One was a bit confused to start with and laid an egg while on the perch, not in the nest box! Another managed to lay one without a shell, just a membrane, which gave me a surprise when I came to pick it up! They soon settled down however and are good little layers. They each lay an egg nearly every day in summer, and about half as many in winter. Their eggs are delicious with big golden yolks. We have more eggs than we can use ourselves, so I take the rest to the WI Market on Wednesday mornings or sell them to friends.

Our bantams are let out of their enclosure during the day, and have a great time scratching for interesting things to eat in the garden and the fields. They come back to the hen house to roost as it gets dark, and I shut them up safely for the night. They mostly lay their eggs in the nest boxes, but have a few other favourite places, too. I feed them poultry corn and make sure they always have fresh drinking water. I clip their wing feathers on one side so that they cannot fly well enough to get over the fence into my neighbours' gardens. Although there are foxes locally, we have never lost any birds to one. It is a risk, but the birds so love to have their freedom, I cannot keep them shut up all the time. I pray that they will be safe and leave it in God's hands to protect them from foxes. They have a wonderful life and are very happy.

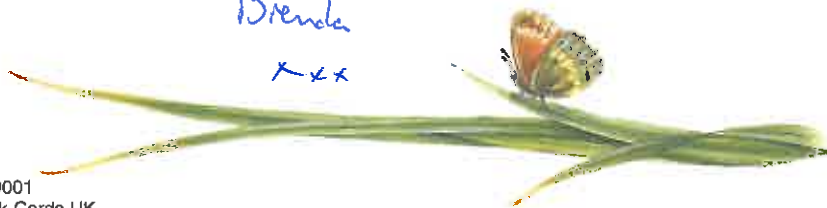

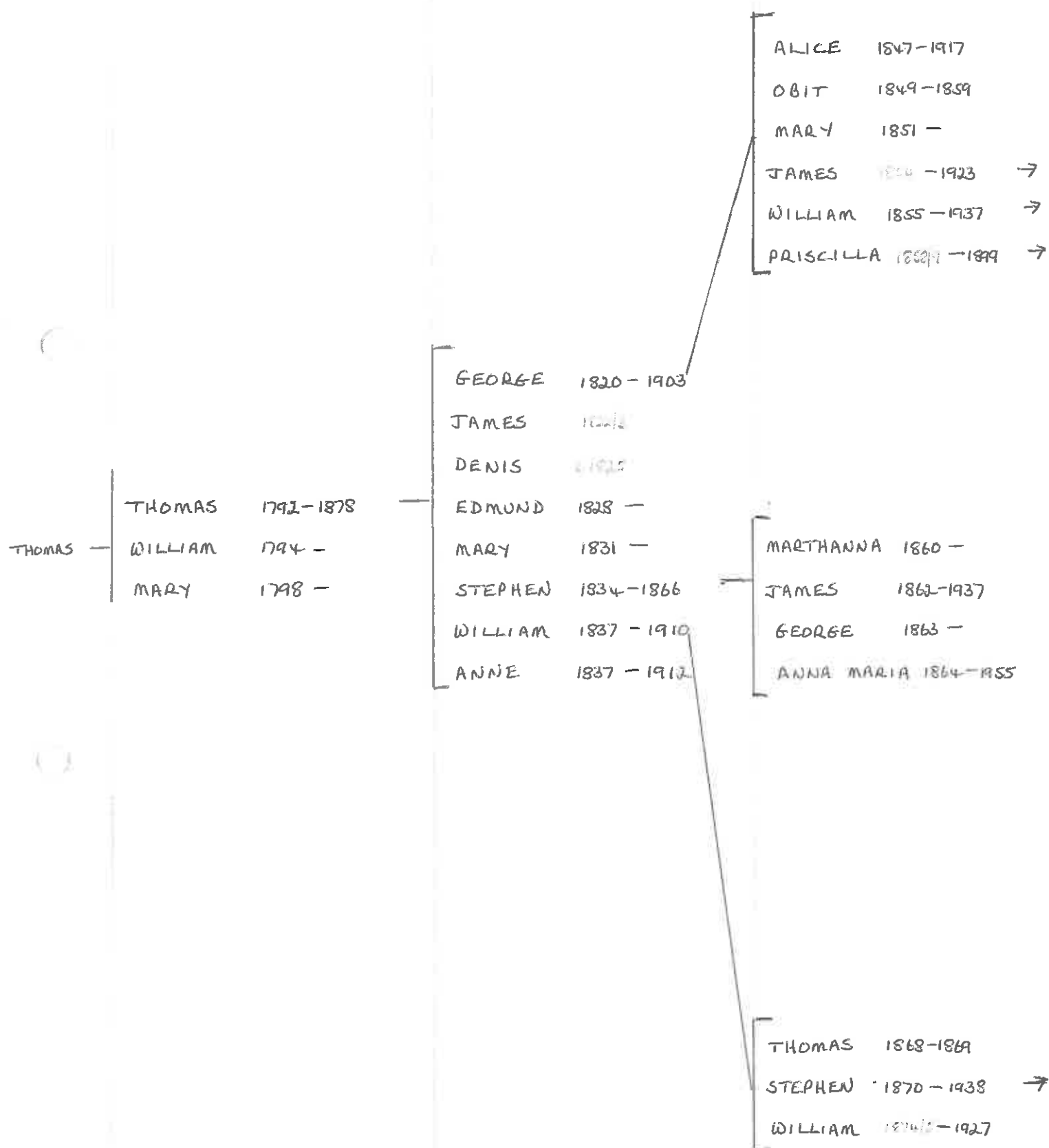

The memorial encloses POZIERES BRITISH CEMETERY, Plot II of which contains original burials of 1916, 1917 and 1918, carried out by fighting units and field ambulances. The remaining plots were made after the Armistice

when graves were brought in from the battlefields immediately surrounding the cemetery, the majority of them of soldiers who died in the Autumn of 1916 during the latter stages of the Battle of the Somme, but a few represent the fighting in August 1918. There are now 2,755 Commonwealth servicemen of the First World War buried or commemorated in this cemetery. 1,375 of the burials are unidentified but there are special memorials to 23 casualties known or believed to be buried among them. The cemetery and memorial were designed by W H Cowlshaw.

Have also copied details of a family of Webb's who worshipped at Tadley Old Meeting, which was an Independent Chapel and now U.R.C.,also another who attended a similar Chapel at Mortimer West End,but as they were both from Beenham, Berkshire, doubt if they are related to you.

Have the monumental inscriptions for Hannington and have copied the Webb's, there are 24,some with several name on, but again we dont know if they are your's.It would be best to check the parish registers for Hannington for baptisms if you have time.Basingstoke Library have them on fiche, but their readers are not very good,or the Hampshire Record Office.

I am planning to visit Tadley next Friday as I am going to stay with an old schoolfriend who lives within reach (I live in Yorkshire). I was going to look for a churchyard and walk around trying to find Webbs ! I had become stuck and didn't know where to go next.

The children I have of George and Patience are:

Alice 1848

Obed 1849

Mary 1851 (my g grandmother)

James 1854

William 1856

Priscilla 1859

I have some history of Alice, Mary, James and William but nothing on Obed or Priscilla.

The witnesses at Mary Webb's wedding to Edward Allnatt in Baughurst in 1871 had the following Webb witnesses: George, Hannah, Alice, James and William !! I have not been able to find a Hannah Webb so I don't know who she was but it's nice that all the family went!

I was hoping that there might be some record of a wheelwrights business as so many of them seem to have been involved. I spoke to a Mr Bob Brown (I think) last week and he advised me to contact Carol Stevens who I have so far not been able to speak to. Do you think she would be able to help? Would the published book/s about the history of Tadley have any mention of Wheelwrights/Carpenters?

Your e-mail re the Webb family has been forwarded to me by Derek Ward as i am a member of the TADS and have copies of Tadley Parish Registers, also have been researching my own Tadley families for years, also enjoy trying to help others with their families.

George Webb was not baptised at Tadley but was probably the son of Thomas Webb and Mary Garrett who were married at Hannington 13/5/1818. I don't have Parish Registers for Hannington so not able to look this up, but found the marriage of Thomas and Mary in Phillimore's Hampshire Marriages, which I have on fiche. Mostly Phillimores are to 1812, but for Hannington are to 1837.

Thomas Webb was baptised at Tadley 25/3/1792 son of Thomas and Jane who also had two more children baptised at Tadley— William 19/1/1794 and Mary 27/4/1798.

Also have the marriage at Baughurst (have all the Baughurst registers) of Thomas Webb and Sarah West on 19/5/1785. They had two children baptised at Baughurst— Jane Elizabeth 2/4/1786 and Mary 11/3/1787.

Thomas Webb died 27/3/1878 aged 86 and buried at Baughurst 3/4/1878
Mary Webb died 14/4/1880 aged 83 and buried at Baughurst 19/4/1880

George Webb was buried at Tadley 14/4/1903 aged 82 and was of Church Lane.
Patience was buried at Tadley 27/3/1899 aged 74 and was of Tadley
Have details of the children of George and Patience if you don't already have them.
George and Patience Parsons were married Jan-March 1846 Reading reg. area.
Found this in the BMD index

Police worker dies at desk

POLICE have been shocked by the death of their long-serving lost property officer.

Morten Wells, 53, collapsed and died at his desk in Basingstoke police station on Thursday morning.

Cause of death is not known and the coroner has been informed.

Mr Wells, a member of Overton Harriers Athletics Club since 1980, was believed to have been extremely fit.

He had completed the Solent half-marathon in Fawley last Sunday and a day later had been for a training run around Overton.

Colleagues say he appeared healthy when he arrived for work on Thursday.

He was last seen talking in the building at 11am but was found slumped at his desk 15 minutes later.

An ambulance was called but he was dead by the time it arrived.

Mr Wells, who was single and lived in Whitechurch, had worked as a civilian in the lost property office since 1970.

Insp Jill Clough said he was a keen worker who often stayed behind in his own time.

She added that police and civilian employees at

the station were very shocked.

Supt Tim Brain said: "Mr Wells was a friendly, cheerful person who will be sadly missed."

Mr Wells' friends at Overton Harriers were said to be very upset.

Richard Mason, who ran the Solent race with Mr Wells, said: "It was a hell of a shock."

"I knew him all my life and it was through him I joined the club."

"He was so kind and would do anything for you."

"He wasn't ill as far as I knew and was looking forward to doing the Salisbury Plains 15-mile race next weekend."

Club captain Paul Wheeler added: "He was everyone's friend who never pretended to be anything other than an out-and-out jogger."

"If you wanted some-

thing done for the club, he would always turn up to help. He will be really missed."
