September meeting report (16/9/09)

The Life of an MP by Sir George Young MP, North West Hampshire, Shadow Leader of the House of Commons

Decent, hardworking, over 35 years experience at the job, not an aggressive "attack dog" MP, goes softly softly, lives locally, affable, family man, finger-on-the-pulse, SEEN and HEARD in the area, calm, approachable, interested, interesting, very knowledgeable, unflappable, two-weeks-holiday not-thirteen weeks, full-time MP with no extra job, steady as a rock, Tory and was nearly the 2009 Speaker.

A few of Sir George's pearls of wisdom on House life in general: in Opposition no-one listens to you! The Shadow Cabinet members are not paid for that post. They are men (or ladies)-in-waiting. There is NO such thing as a safe seat. The House used to be nice and relaxed, with cooking smells and the odd scuttling cockroach! Now in Portcullis House MPs have hygienic, isolated "cells" where one just gets on with one's job dealing with x emails, and letters with minimum social distraction.

The Leader of the House (currently) Harriet Harman sets the agendas and deals with debates, bills etc.

During his years as MP Sir George has seen many Prime Ministers in action and therefore many styles: some talented; very talented; flamboyant; diffident; "tribal"; broody; abrasive; out of touch; in touch; unable to relax; good communicators; good orators; a man or woman "of the people" and able to diversify and make the job look easy....... What of the future, 21st century House of Commons? More women MPs, maybe less political advisors and "spin doctors", maybe more case workers.....who knows???

Remember Sir George WILL answer your query and if you demand it ASAP, maybe a 5am phone call to you!

Extra busy though he now is, Sir George kept his promise to visit us and we did not ask any embarrassing questions.
