### TADS Meeting 17th February 2010: 'The story of Fleet Street'

#### **Annual General Meeting (16/12/10)**

About 30 members attended the AGM

Chairman Bob Brown reviewed the past year and thanked everybody for their work and help which had made it a success with a very good programme of talks and a visit to the Museum of English Rural life at Reading University. The membership number has held up, with most talks very well attended and there had been a very good number of visitors at several of them.

Richard Brown reported on the finances, having taken over from Jim Coles in emergency when Jim had to stand down for medical reasons. The Society's financial position is sound and the membership subscription of £10 remains unchanged for the coming year.

Carol Stevens reported on the work of the Project Group. They had taken a while to get back on track with the production of their excellent Project News leaflets after the work that went into the excellent reprint of Florence Davidson's 'A History of Tadley' the previous year. All the Society's publications sell steadily through a variety of outlets, but primarily Profile Print and Copy of Bishopswood Parade, Tadley. The Project Team also deal with a surprising number of enquiries from members of the public trying to find out more about the history of their families. The Project Team has a core membership, but is open to any one to join especially if you have a project which you want to investigate with their advice and get published in Project News.

The meeting voted and unanimously accepted three changes to the Society's Constitution which were publicised before the AGM..

There was a major change to the Committee as Bob Brown, Derek Ward, and Jim Coles all stood down. Derek Heath is also standing down, but will continue to administer the 2010 programme of talks. Bob has been involved with the running of TADS from its start, and has been Chairman for about the last 15 years. As he recently turned 80, I think he has earned a rest, but he will still be involved as key holder for the Hall, if nothing else. The Society owes a big vote of thanks to all of them.
