1. **The Falcon Inn** - We understand that the Falcon has been sold to the owners of the garage and will be converted into a restaurant.

2. **Sainsbury's** - The enlargement of the store is going ahead and work will start soon on demolishing the industrial buildings in the way of the development. It is probable that the store will have to close for up to a week some time in the summer.

3. **Boundary Hall site -** B&D Council approved plans for building 115 new dwellings on the site, but the planning permission has been blocked by the Health and Safety Executive as they consider the development is too close to AWE.
