Dentaid, Dentistry is in the 3rd World

Open wide please! Pearly white pearlies (we hope; perhaps the odd filling!) OR rotten teeth, black, brown and bleeding, bad breath, gumboils, abscesses, mouth tumours, chronic toothache, streptococcal infections, septicaemia, 'unsterilised' bicycle spoke instruments or a blacksmith's pliers, the risk of hepatitis, and H.I.V., and probable death; NO trained dentist..... NB Sierra Leone has 5 dentists for 5.5 million people. What hideous choices..... When we slink off nervously to the dentist with our cavity or toothache in the UK, we tend to go to a fully-equipped dental surgery with a soft lights, paintings, maybe muted music, a be-masked and gloved dentist and dental nurse, tending our every whim and whimper as they X-ray, drill, fill, swill, extract the payment, and away we go....

<u>OR</u> a street 'dentist' in India with a do-it-yourself option! And dentures probably stolen from the local morgue! You could have false teeth made from a sheet of copper by the blacksmith and wired into your mouth with ghastly side-effects; no anaesthetic, no sterilisation, no clean water, fear, ignorance and a witch-doctor approach. Not good.....

Phil Postance's lengthy professional and social CV curls impressively from his canines down to his toenails! And he works voluntarily as a fundraiser for Dentaid to improve the world's health. Dentaid, founded in Britain, has been going since 1996.

You don't want to know what Phil would do to cola drink manufacturers because of the cavities caused! Not to mention toothache and heartache. Sugary foods come a close second, yummy though they are. We must clean our teeth 2 X daily, and floss. Alas 'we should have looked after at teeth...' (Pam Ayres, 1970s).

Phil showed us gruesome suffering in slides from deprived 3rd World countries. Imagine, 5 billion of the world's 6 billion population NEVER see a dentist. We're talking mostly of peoples in parts of Africa, Asia and South America. And it's mostly the West's fault, because of our greed and commerce focused on emergent countries where the economy is improving and they feel the need for sugary treats, whereas once their teeth were pretty perfect.

Sadly, in the UK 40% of 6 year-olds have 1.5 cavities. It should be zero, because we have education, dentists and fluoride. In Cambodia, 90 per cent

of 6 year-olds have 7.5 cavities and there are very few dentists. The Philippines main cause of the school absenteeism is poverty and toothache. Ethiopia has a 77 million population with just 93 dentists, mostly in the wealthy capital city, Addis Ababa. Nepal's dental situation is very dire. Happily all is not lost. Dentaid to the rescue: British dentists can send their no longer needed dental chairs, instruments, etc, to a holding area in Wiltshire, where they are prepared by engineers for a new life in the 3rd World. Currently, Dentaid can transport and supply a portable chair, steriliser and instrument kit to anywhere in the world for £1000.

Children and adults need to be screened and treated by indigenous workers; all children must receive oral health education from their own teachers and health workers. But the biggest single factor is supervised tooth brushing with fluoridated toothpaste and a toothbrush. We hope soon everyone will be able to afford an ordinary toothbrush.

Thanks Phil for your talk about dentistry and the lack of it in the 3rd World. It made some of us gasp with open-mouthed horror, and resolved to look after <u>OUR</u> teeth better and maybe donate to help others less privileged to do the same. Keep up the good work!
