## **Herbert Harlakenden Gilchrist, Artist and Author, 1857 – 1914**

*During the AGM the above gentleman was mentioned. This is how he came to our attention:*

Carol, Ian and Richard were clearing part of St Peter's graveyard looking for a WWI soldier's grave. They were surprised to find what had been an imposing grave, now broken, in a very remote area of the churchyard. The inscription on it was: 'Herbert Harlakenden Gilchrist, Artist and Author, Born 1857, Died 1914 Aged 57'. Nobody had ever heard of him. What was his connection to Tadley?

He was a known artist who came from a Victorian literary family. He had spent some years in the USA as a devotee of the poet Walt Whitman. In July 1914 he was found in the bath in his lodgings in Franklin Avenue, with his throat badly gashed and dying from his injuries. The inquest was held in the Fox and Hounds Public House.
