

As there was no meeting last month I was looking for something to give some solid content to the newsletter, when Peter Elliott kindly sent me the following locally focused article about a subject of which I had no knowledge.

Tadley Public Houses show (through matchbox labels) how the UK has changed. By Peter Elliott

There is history in the ephemera we throw away. Sixty-five years ago phillumenists would lovingly collect discarded matchboxes for their collections from pavements and parks then soak off the labels in hot water – just search Ebay for "matchbox labels" if you doubt my words. In the early nineteen-seventies matchboxes featuring pubs began to appear, paid for by the pubs themselves as a form of advertising and mostly printed by Bouldens Match Company of Southampton. Cheap and disposable, if you look at a pub matchbox label today you might see a snapshot of a culture that has changed in so many ways, so let's examine a few changes through the lens of matchboxes from pubs in and around Tadley.

Pubs are closing across the UK and we have lost pubs from our patch. We have also lost the decimal halfpenny which was discontinued in 1984. On the positive side, the labels show how label printing technology evolved from text only, then to line drawings, and finally to photos.



Some of these pubs remain but their names have changed; this means that we older folk must attempt to learn new names for old landmarks, a task that is frankly impossible. The Badger's Wood now hosts the Cumin Kitchen, quite a change from the days when it was called the New Inn and Vesta dehydrated curries were the height of culinary daring.




In a hidden piece of cultural history, as the UK began to lose its insularity the term "Foreign Matches" on labels was replaced by the country of origin, for instance, "Austrian Matches".

The Crown became The Calleva Arms and in recent years was subject to annual invasions by pirates (who turned out to be archaeology students from the summer dig in the Roman town). As far as I know, the Reading University Field School has moved on from Silchester, so the pirates' charge across the playing field is now a historical footnote.



Finally, The Pelican Inn is now simply "The Pelican" and exemplifies how changes to legislation and technology have affected our pubs. It was once a Courage tied pub until the "beer orders" legislation of 1989 drove a wedge between brewers and their pubs.

As for the phone number, Silchester 286 has morphed into 0118 9700286 via dialling codes 0734 and 01734. And the number no longer belongs to the pub, so don't phone it.





Of course, smoking is no longer allowed in pubs and Bouldens Match Company has been dissolved, so it seems like another chapter in UK cultural history has been closed.
